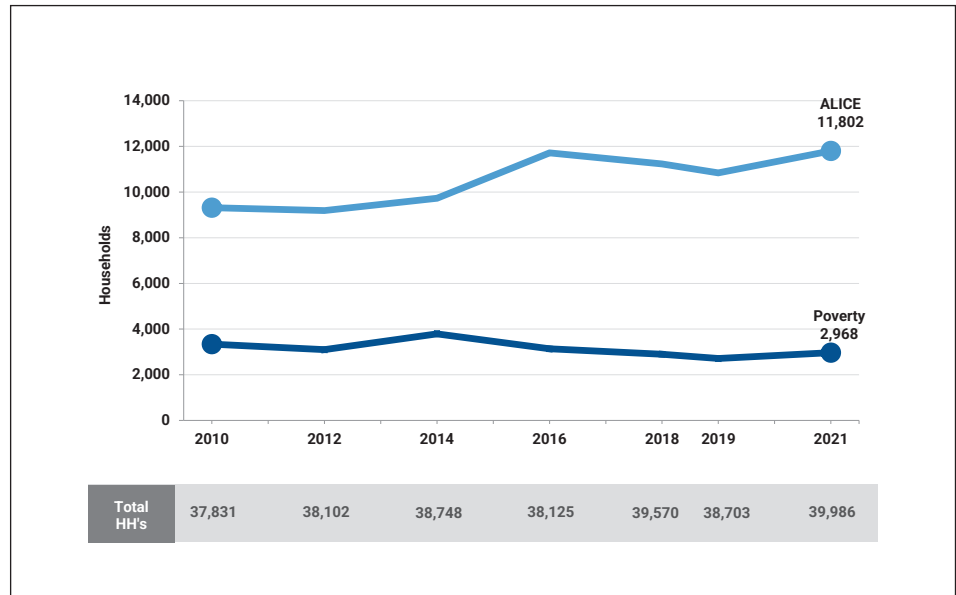

In 2019, 13,554 households in Adams County were below the ALICE Threshold; in 2021 this number changed to 14,770 (a 9% change).

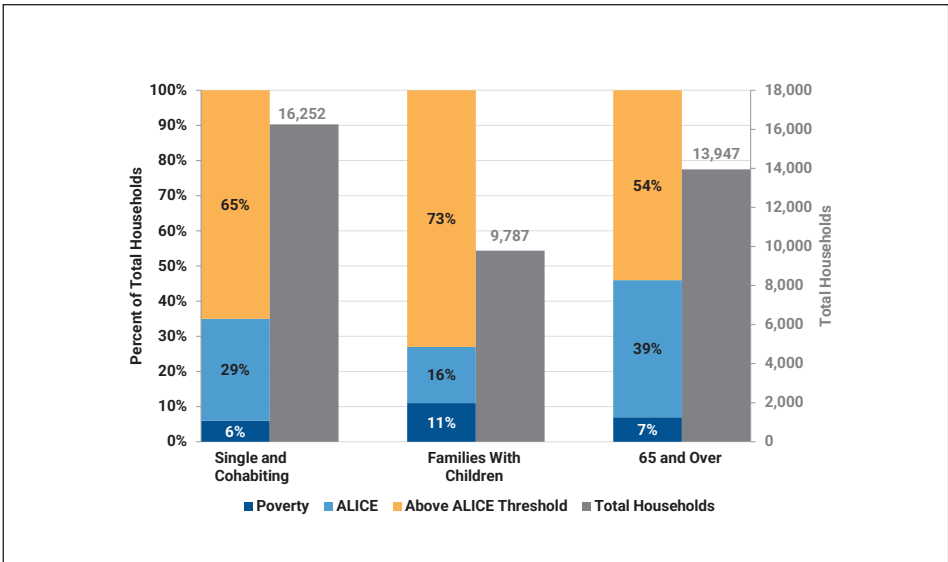

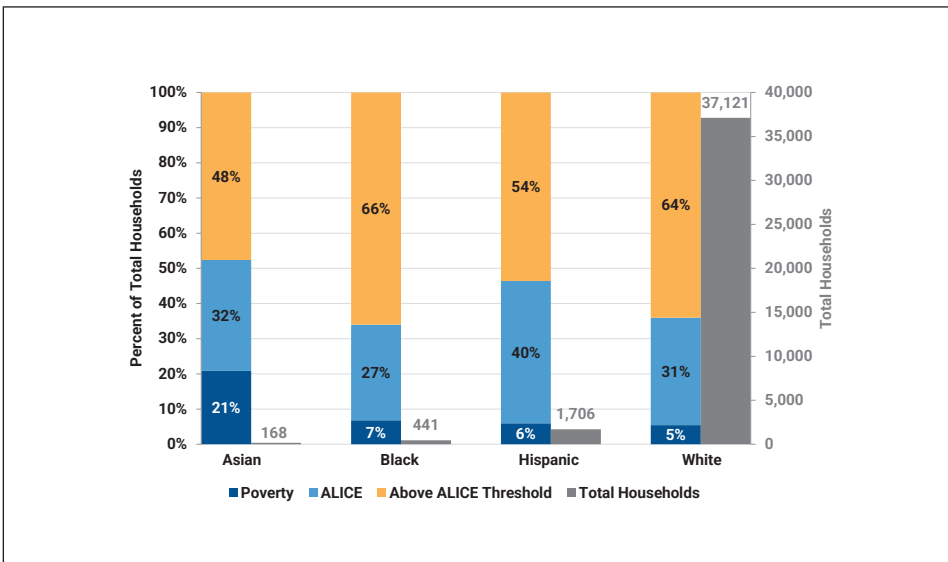

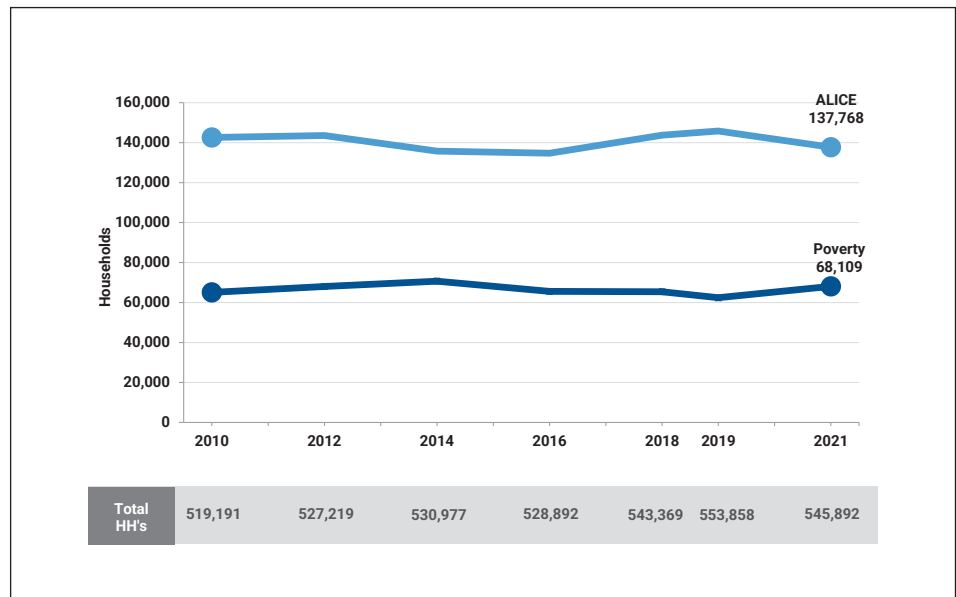

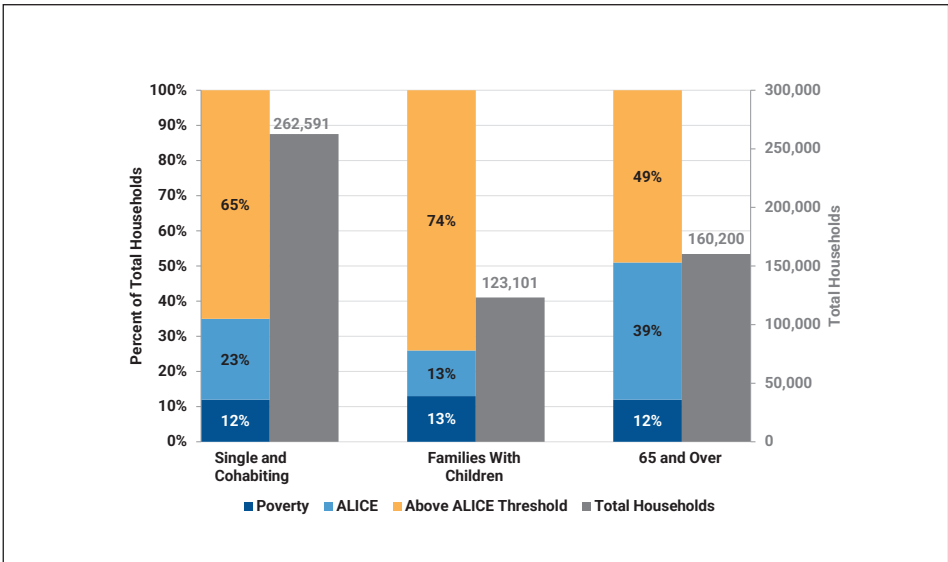

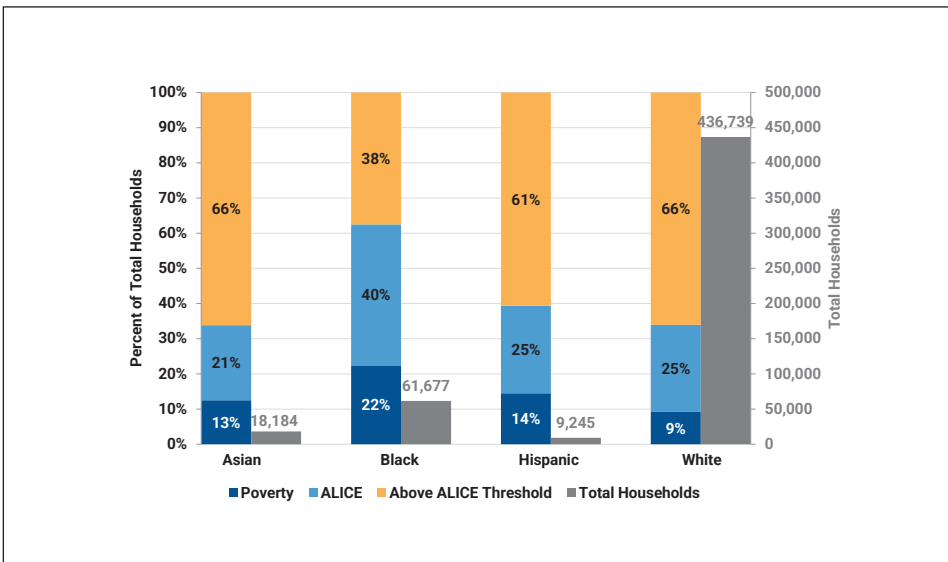
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Allegheny County, 2021

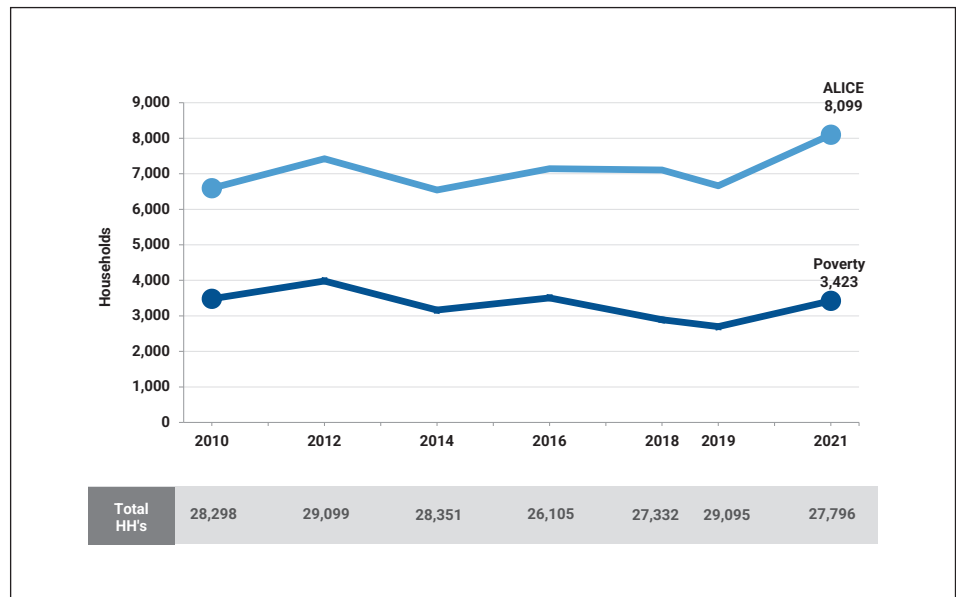

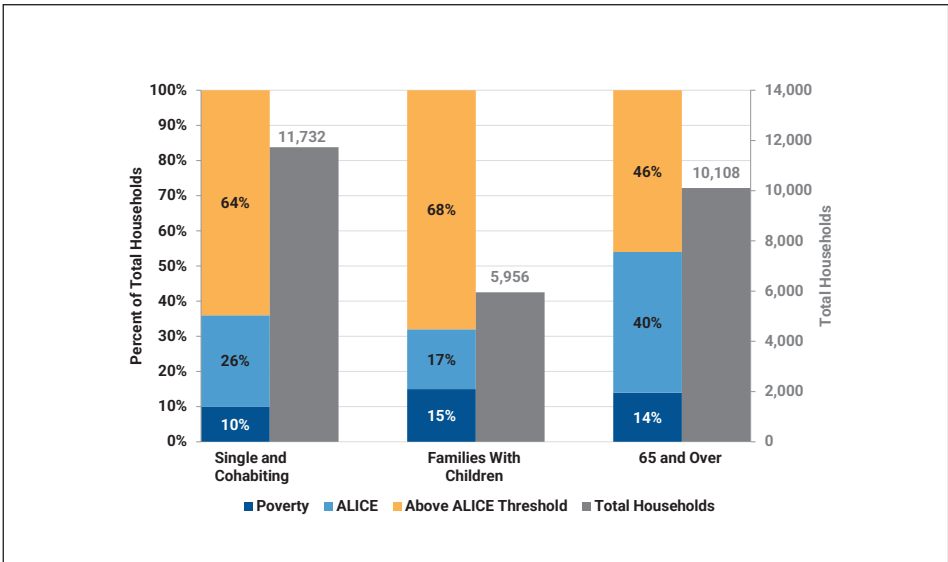

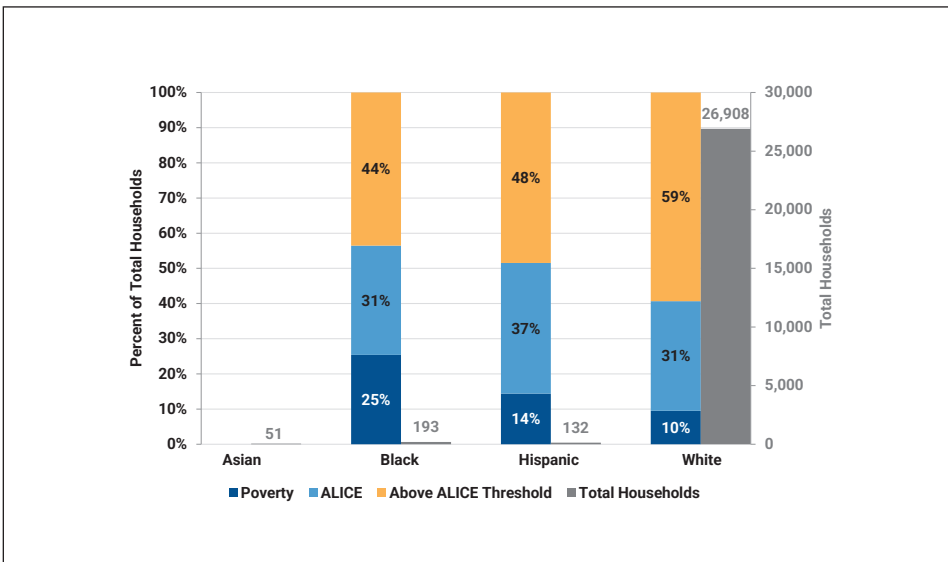
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Armstrong County, 2021

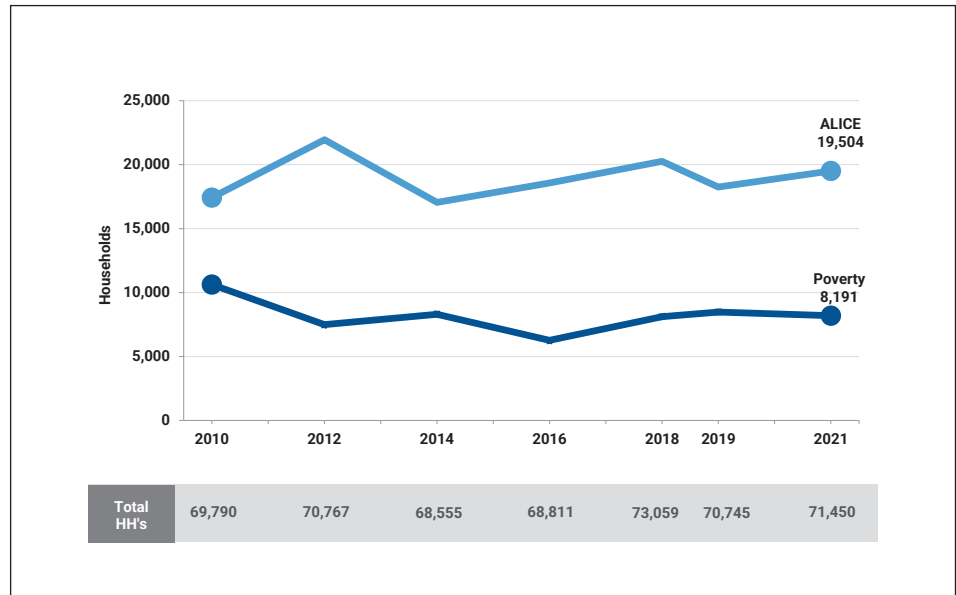

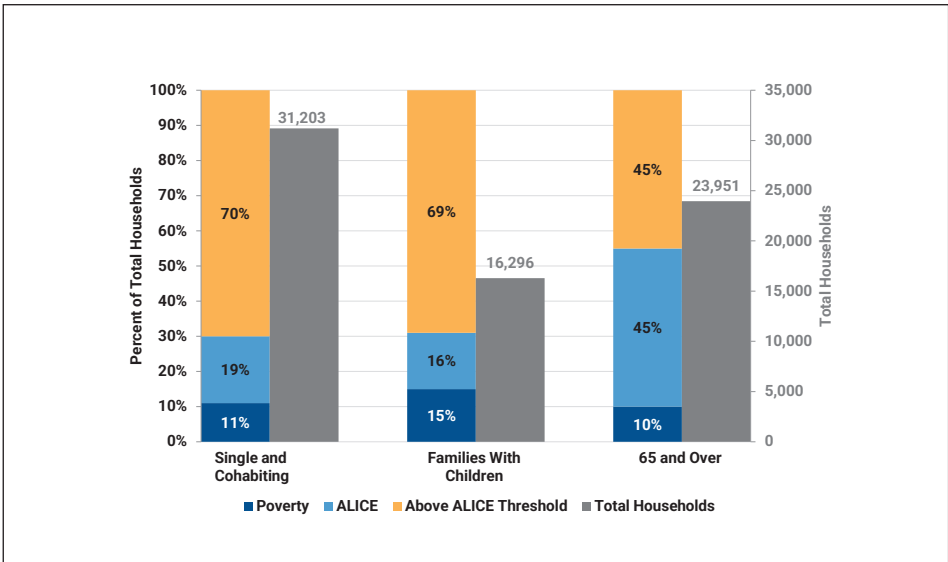

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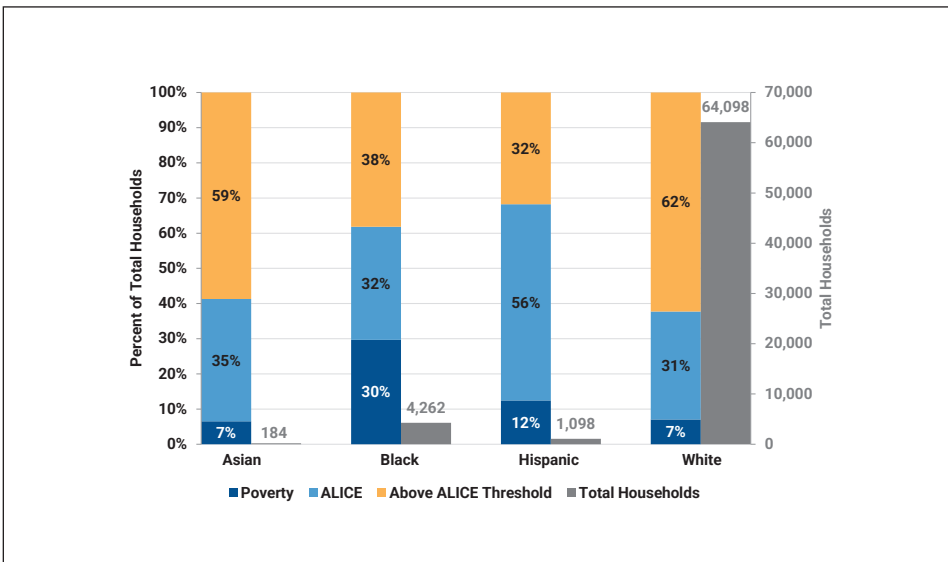
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Beaver County, 2021

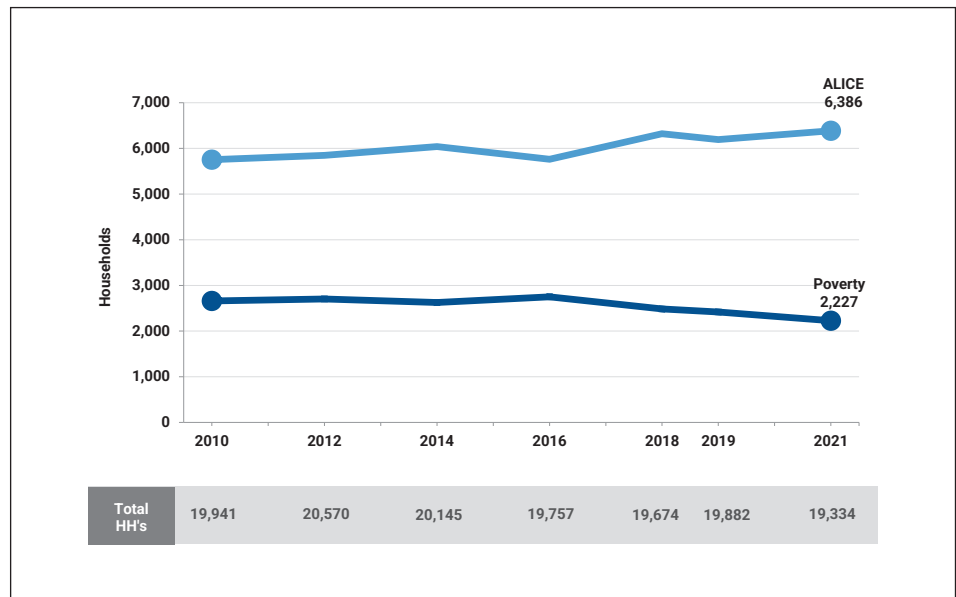

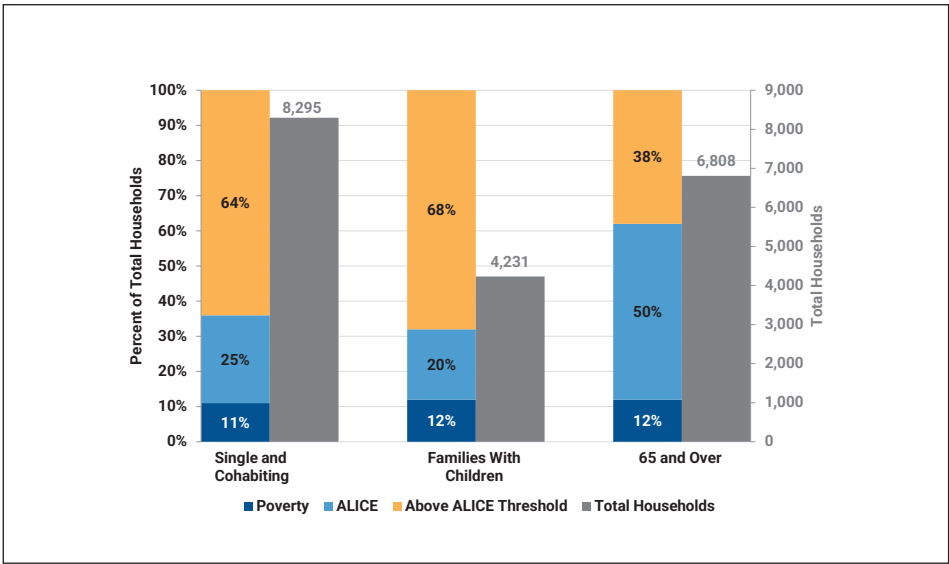

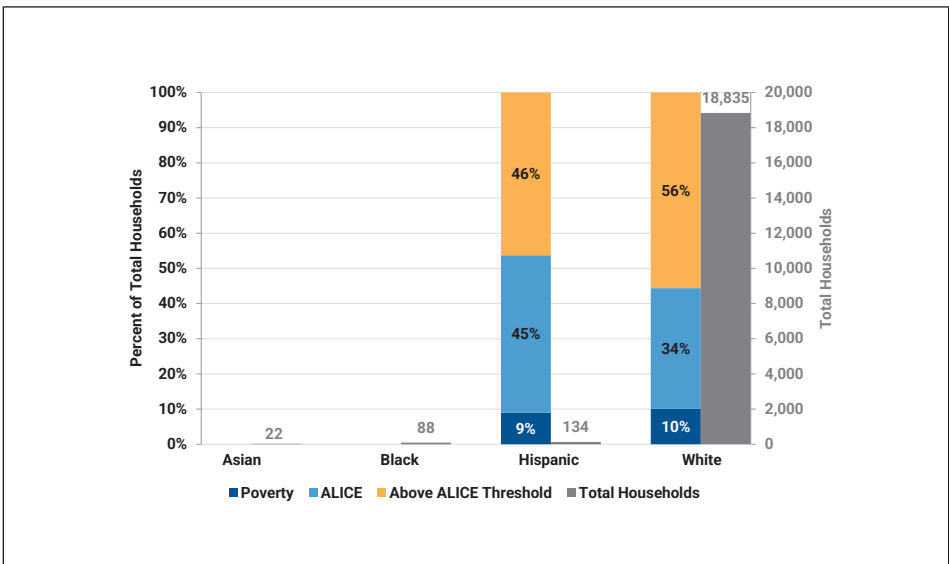

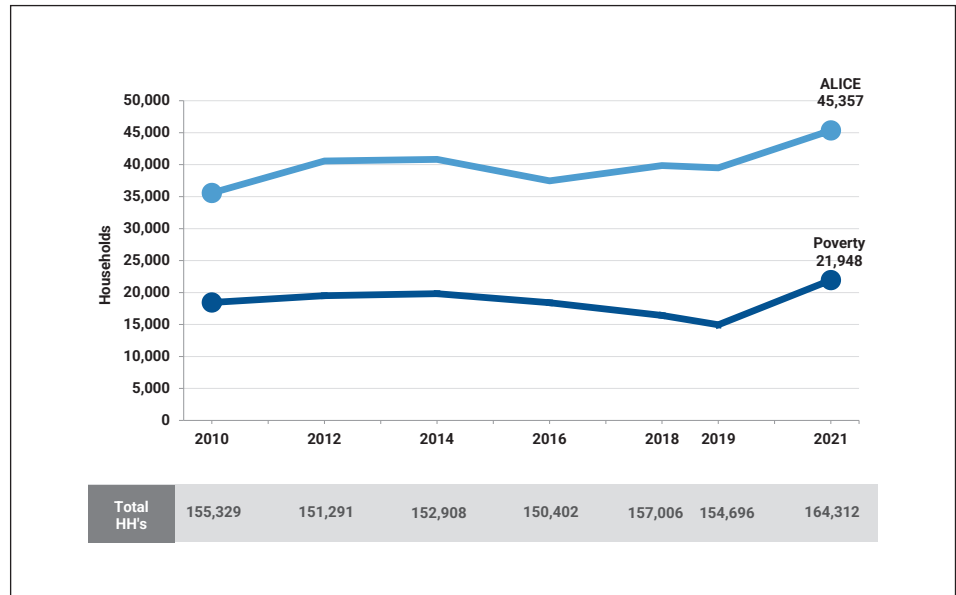

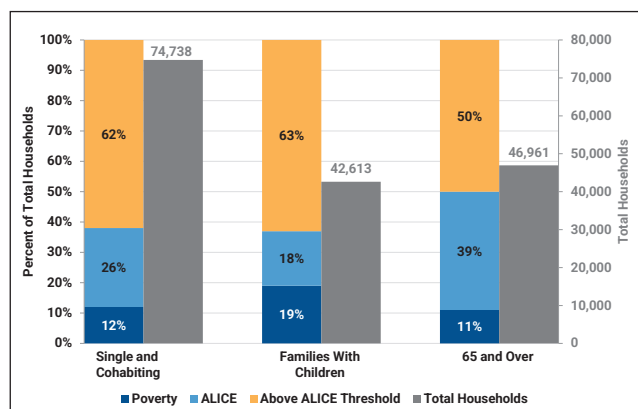

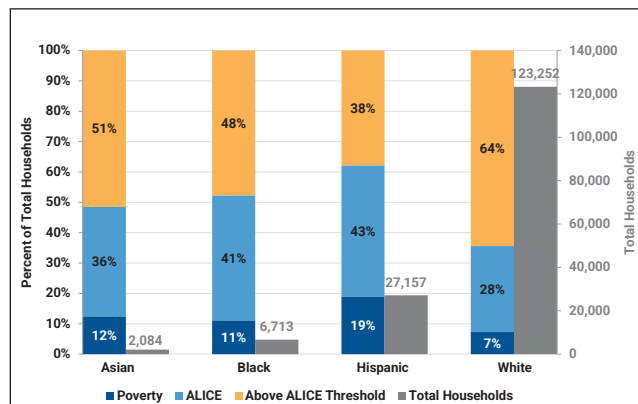

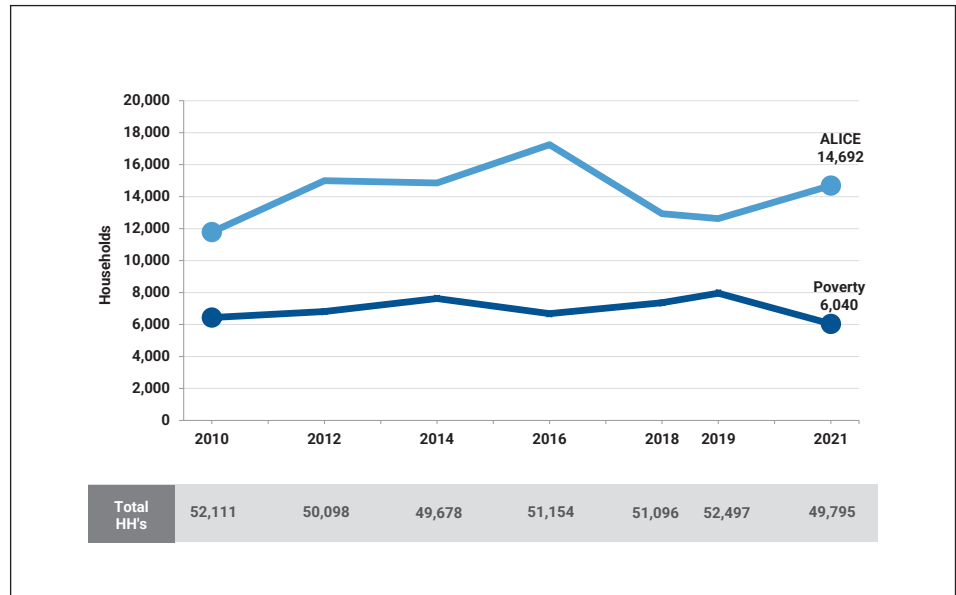

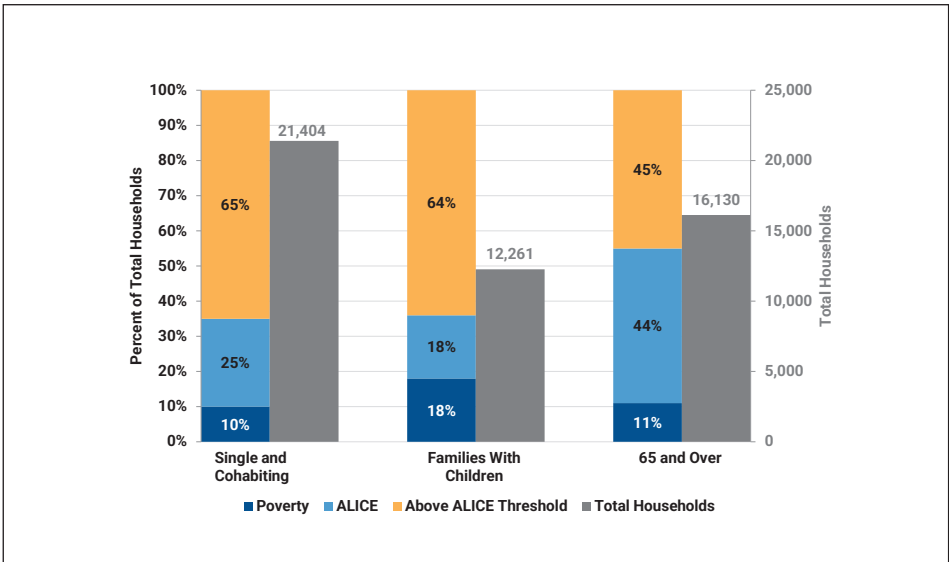

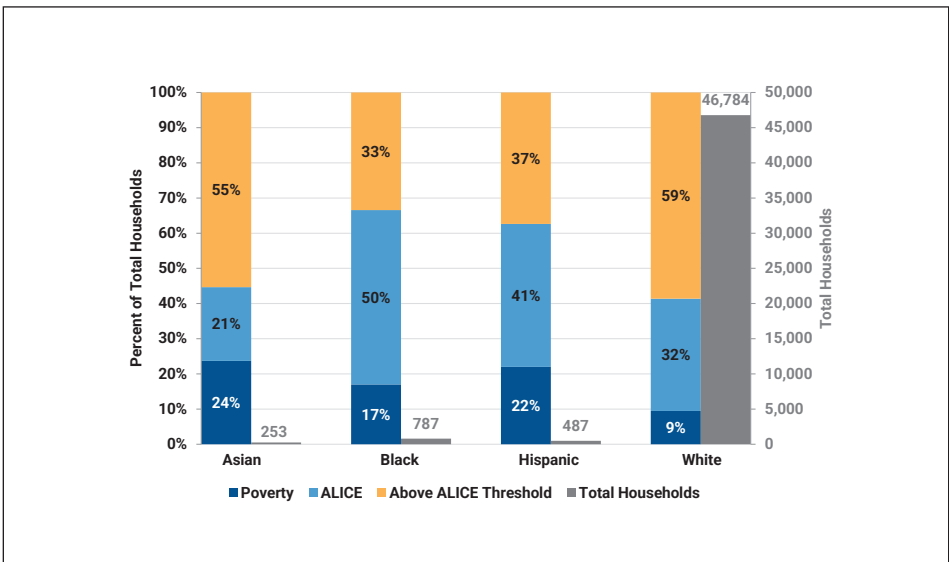
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Blair County, 2021

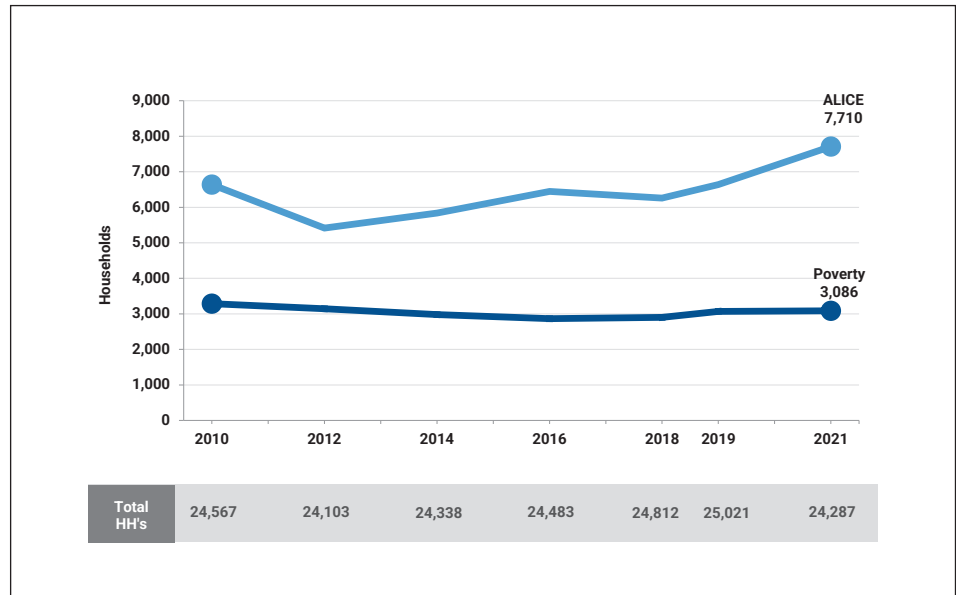

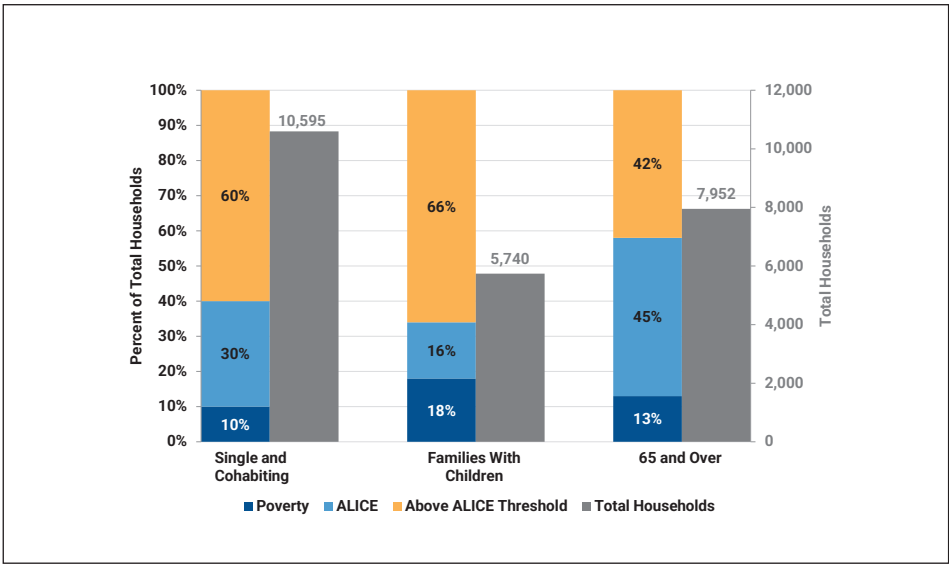

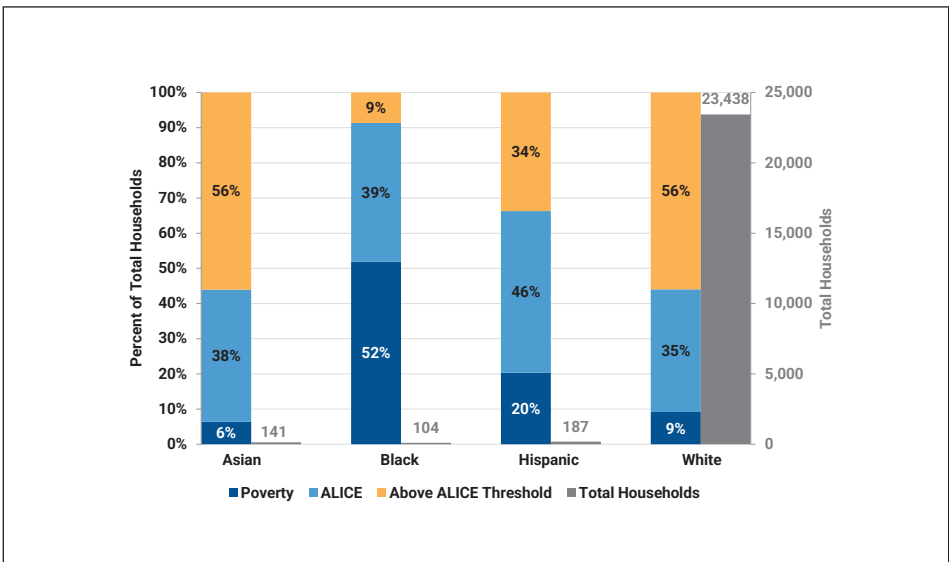

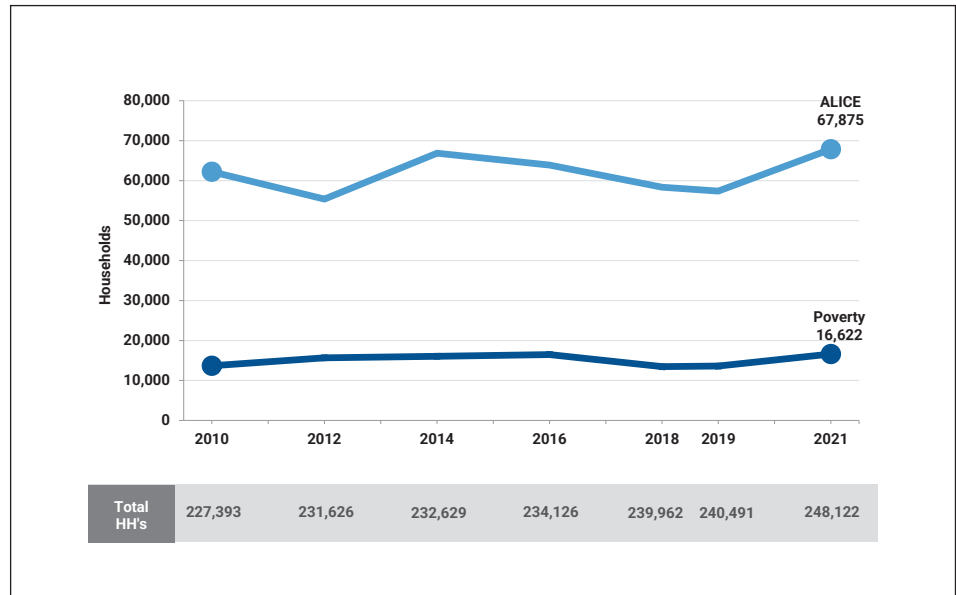

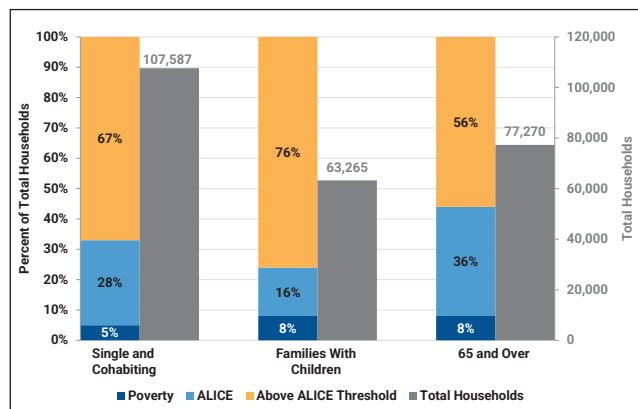

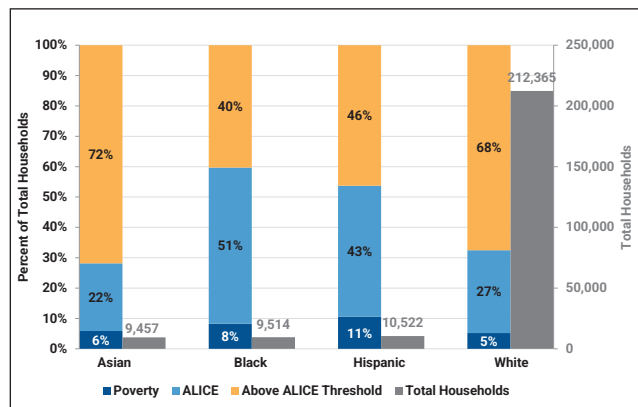

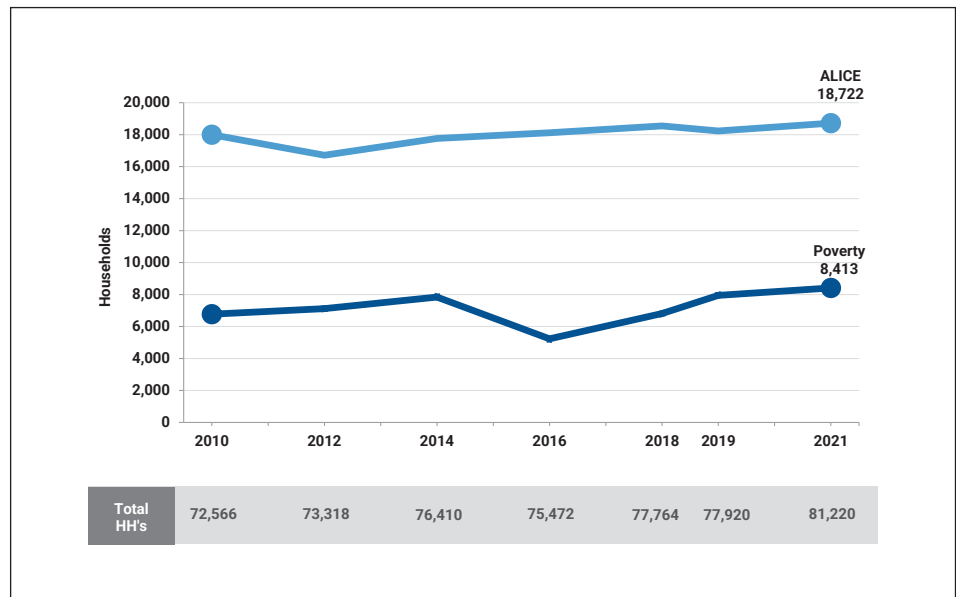

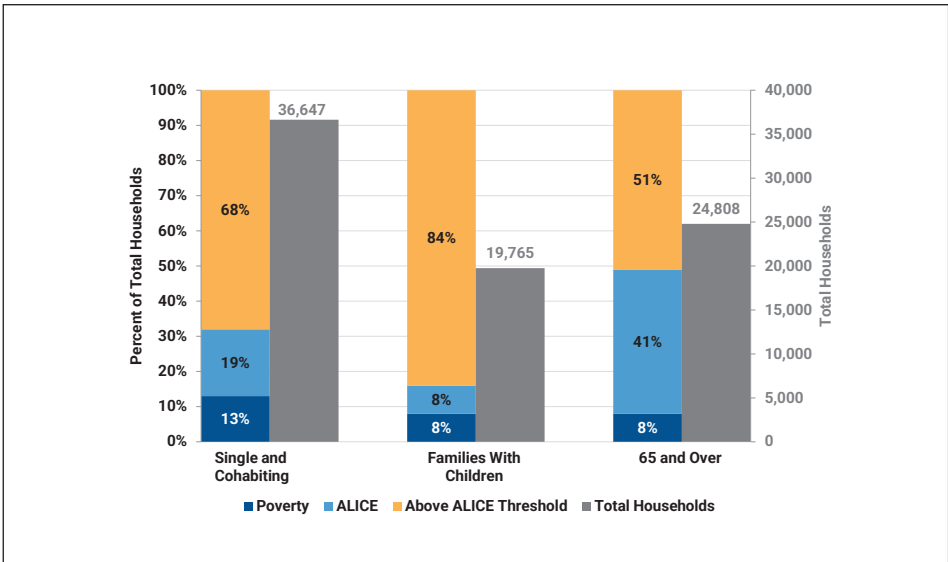

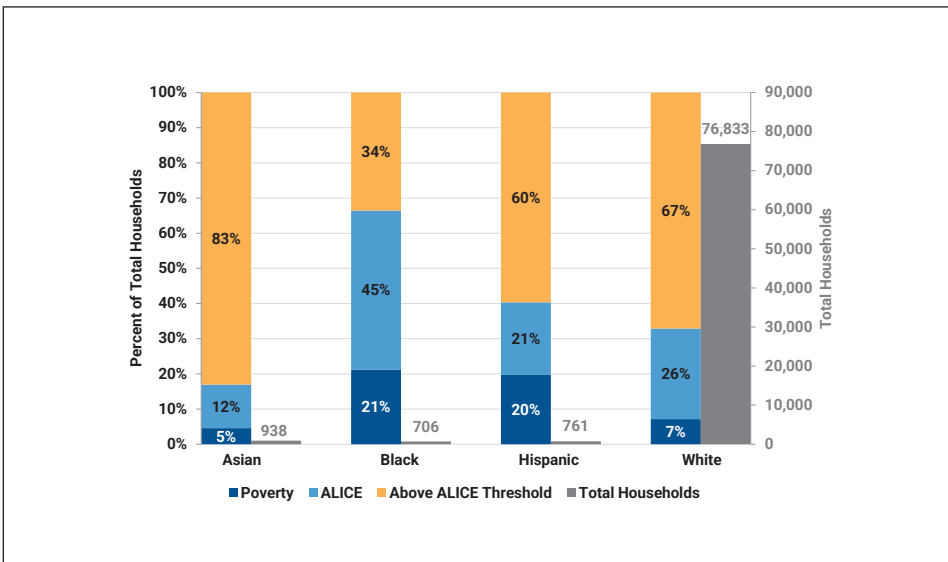

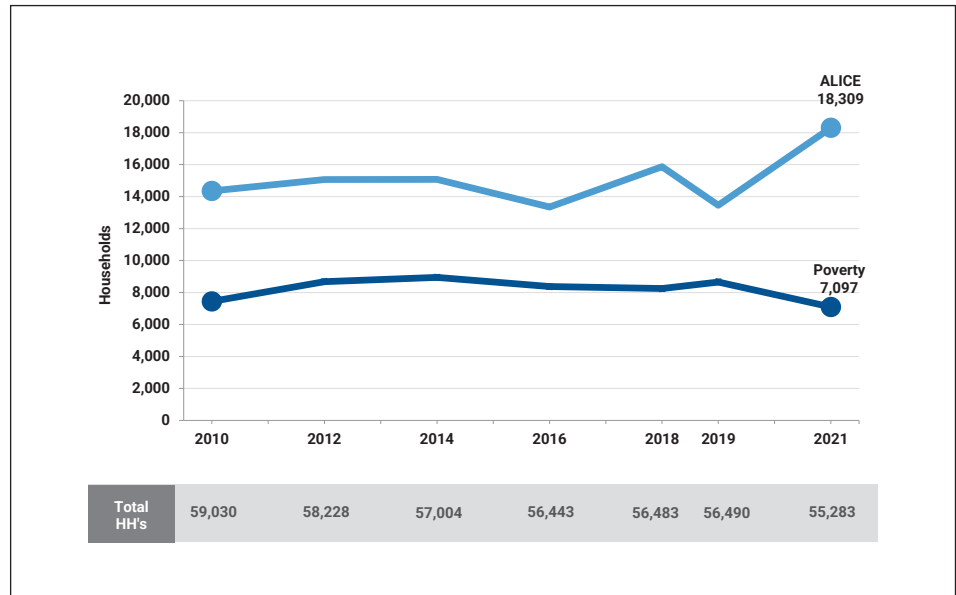

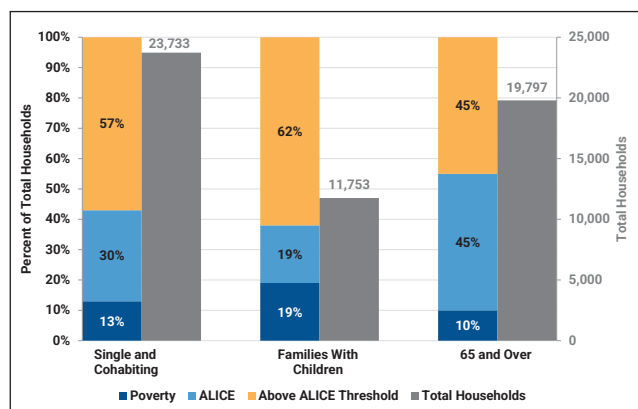

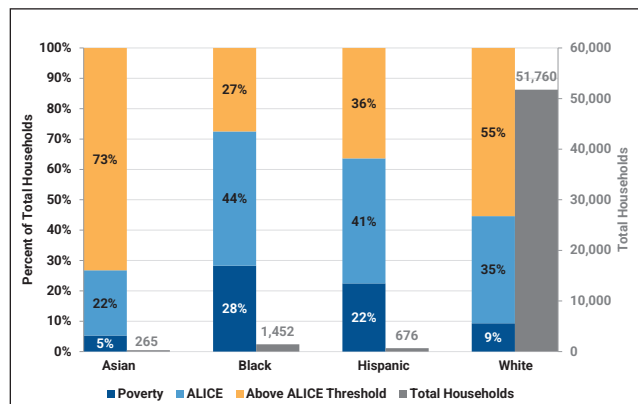

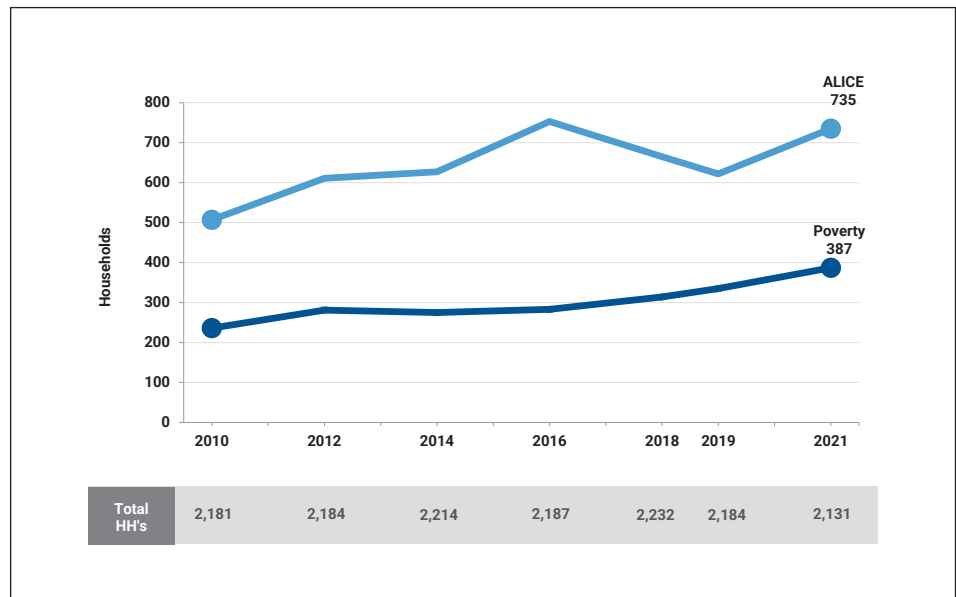

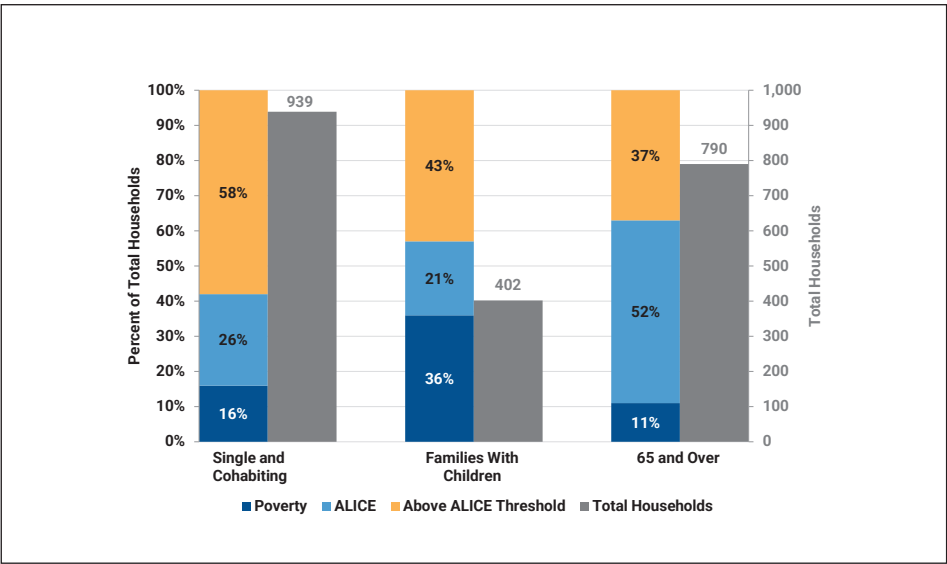

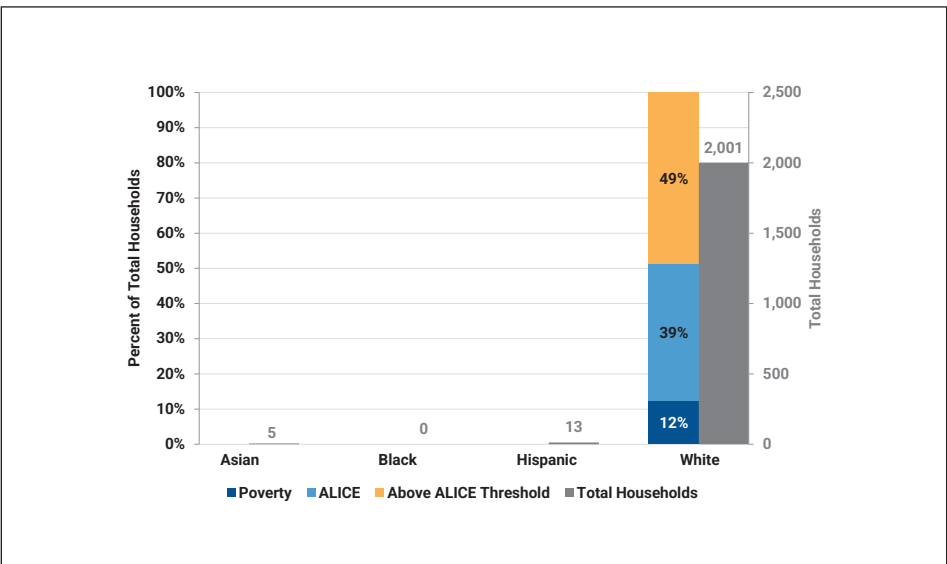

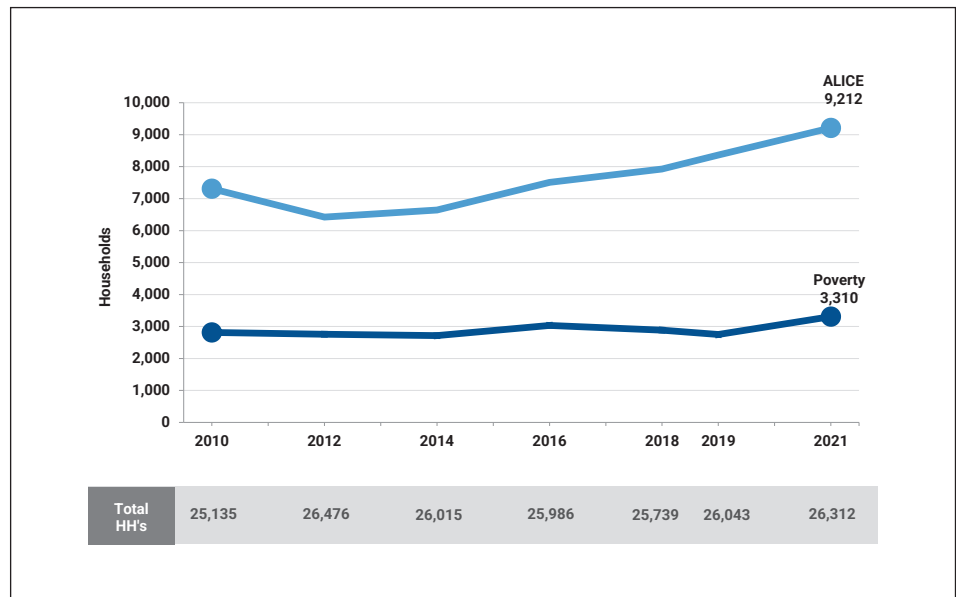

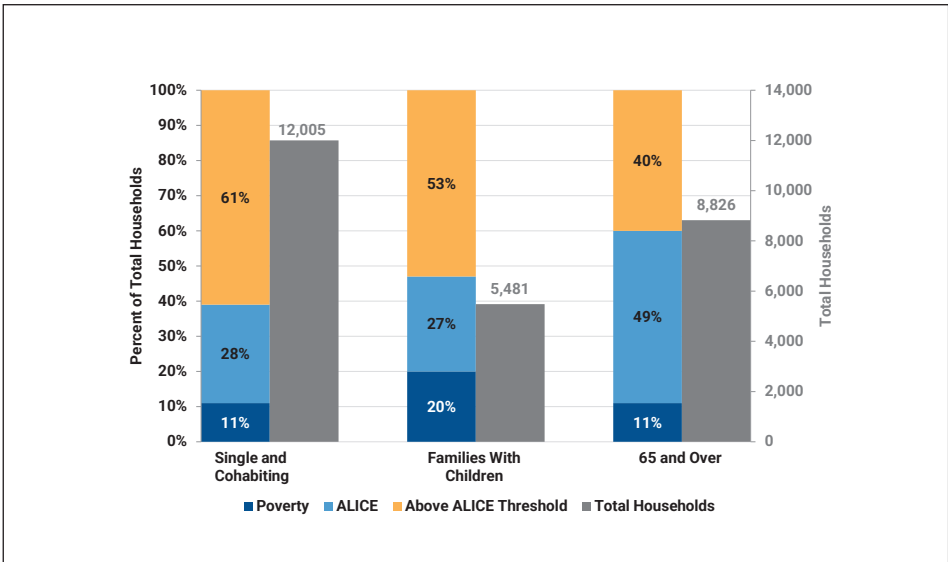

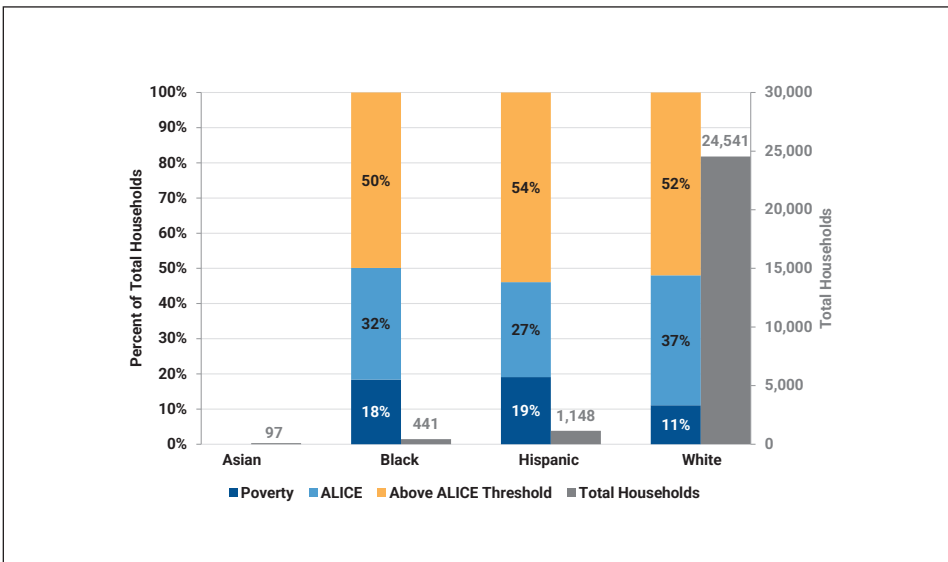

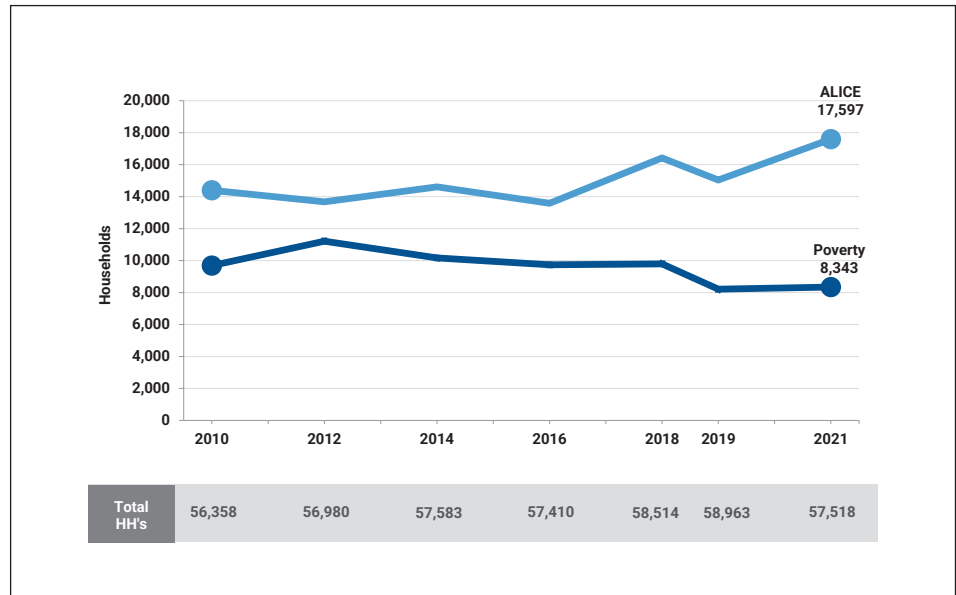

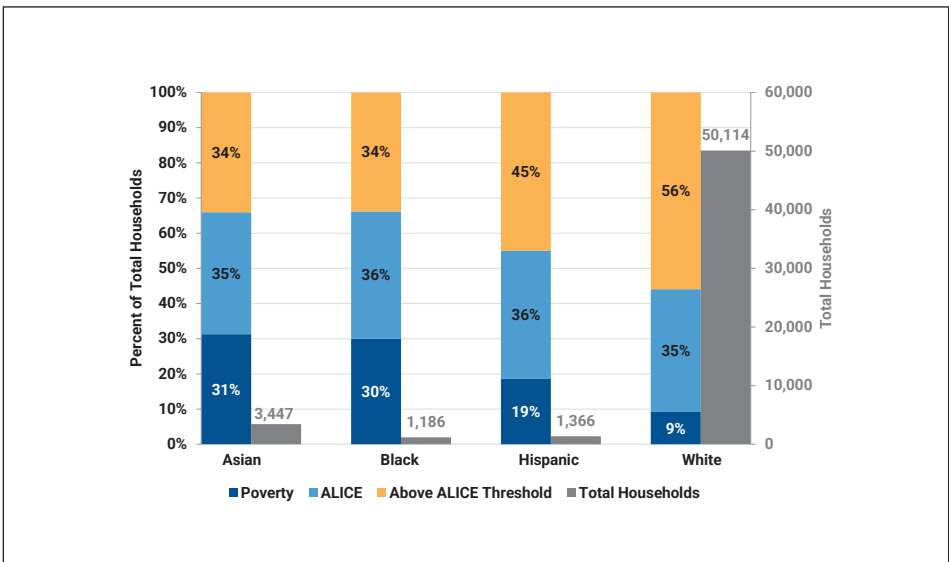

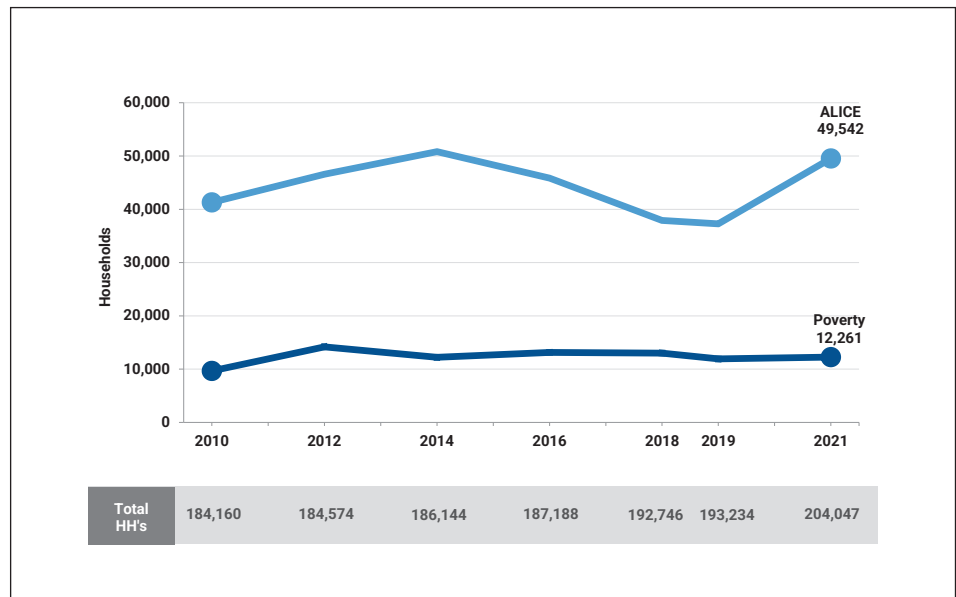

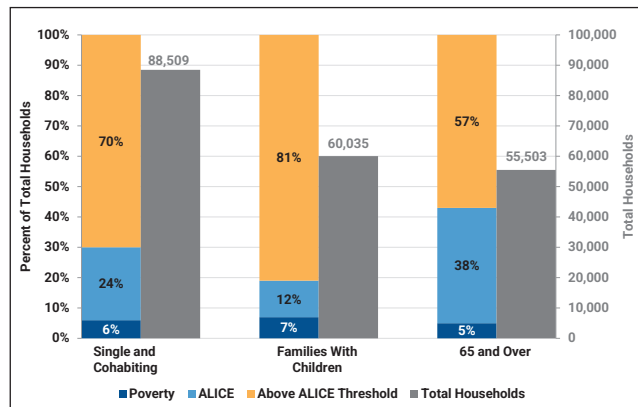

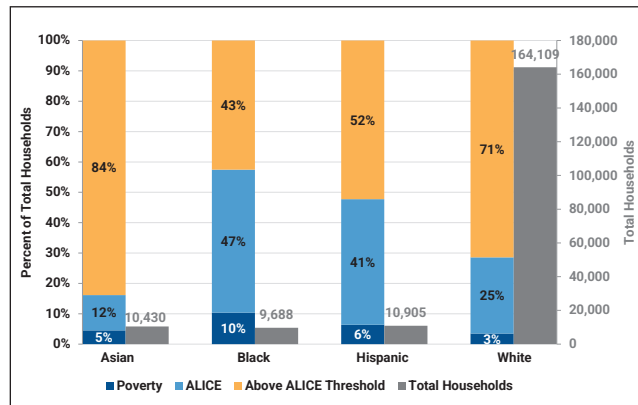

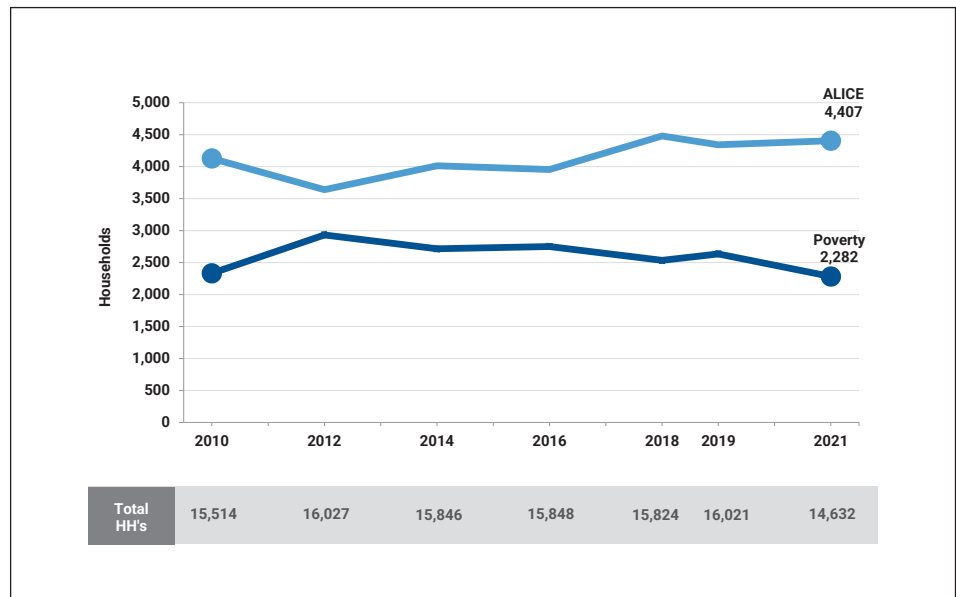

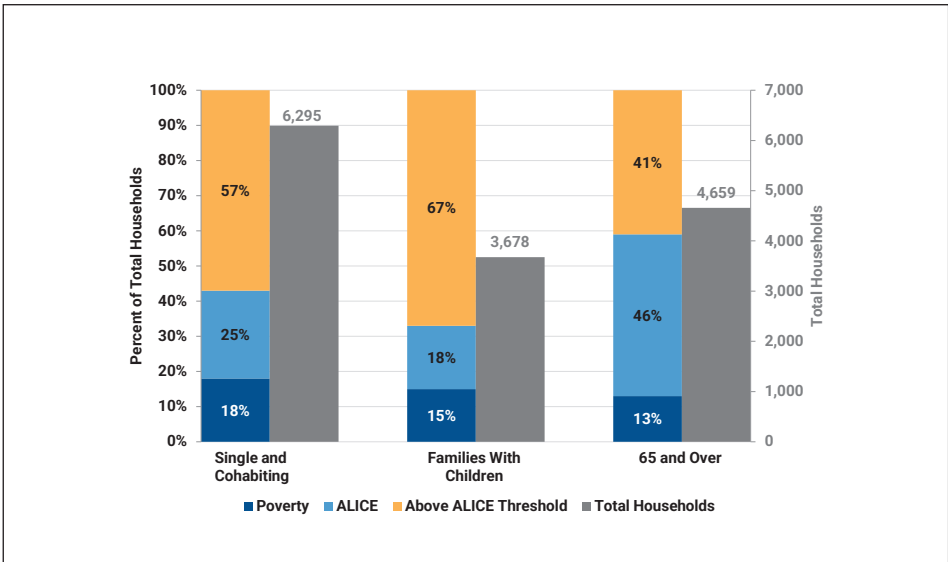

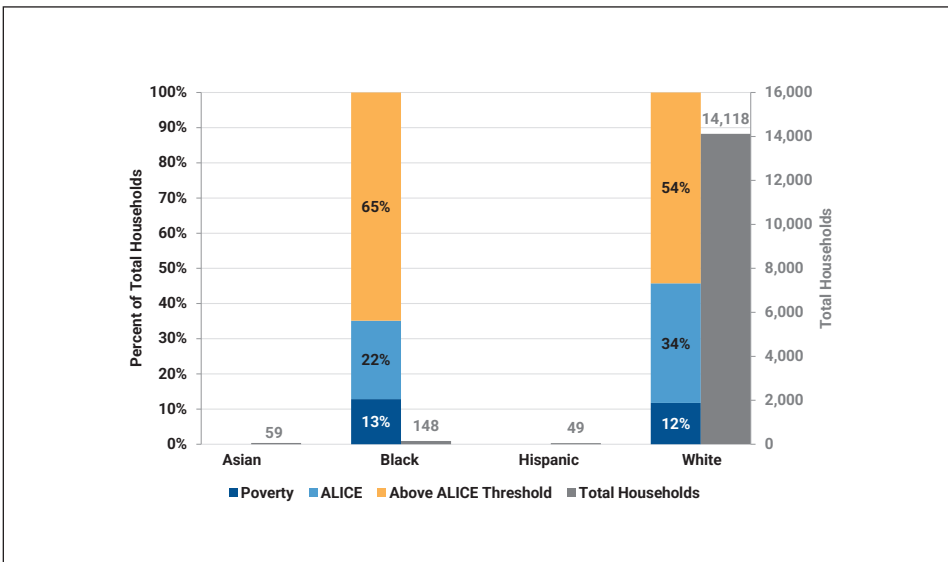
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Clarion County, 2021

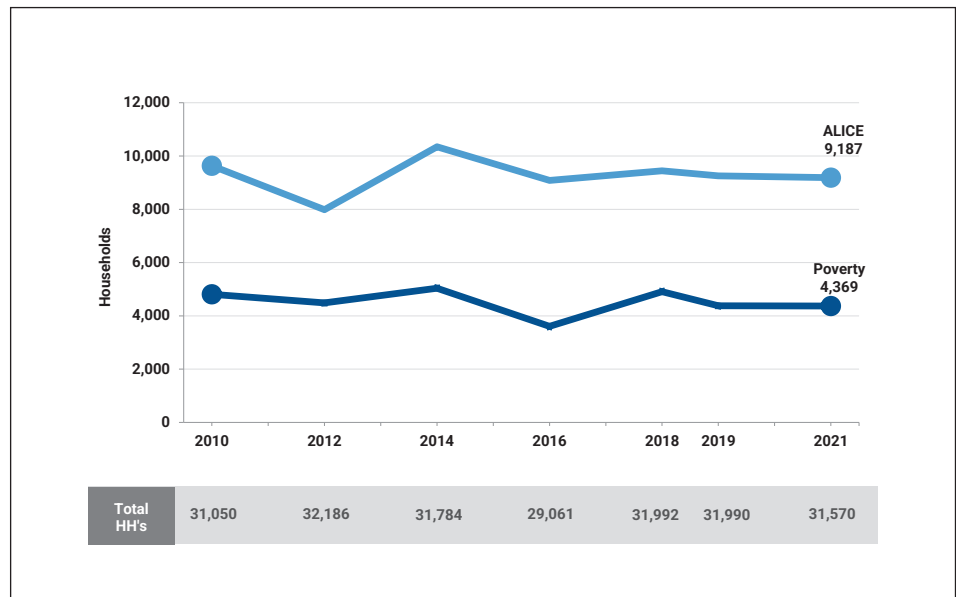

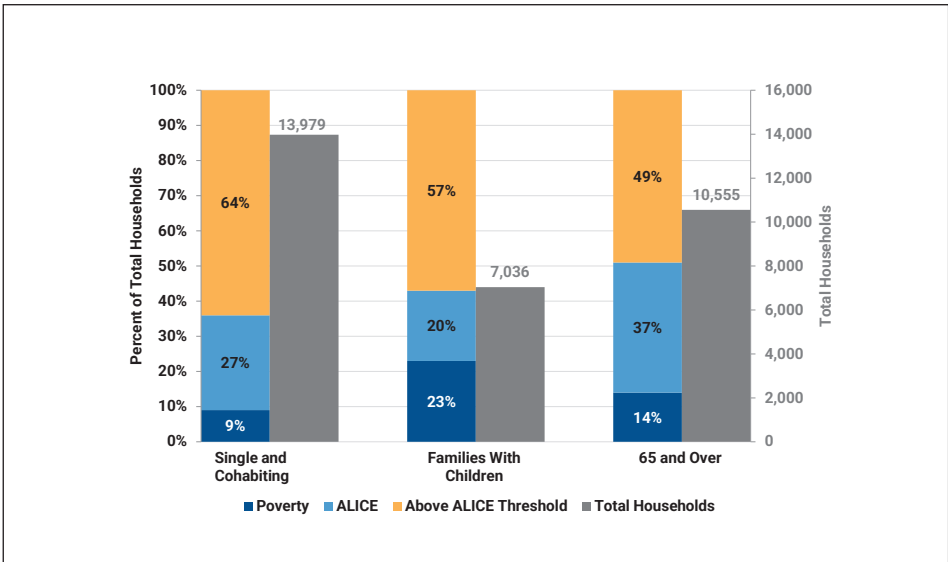

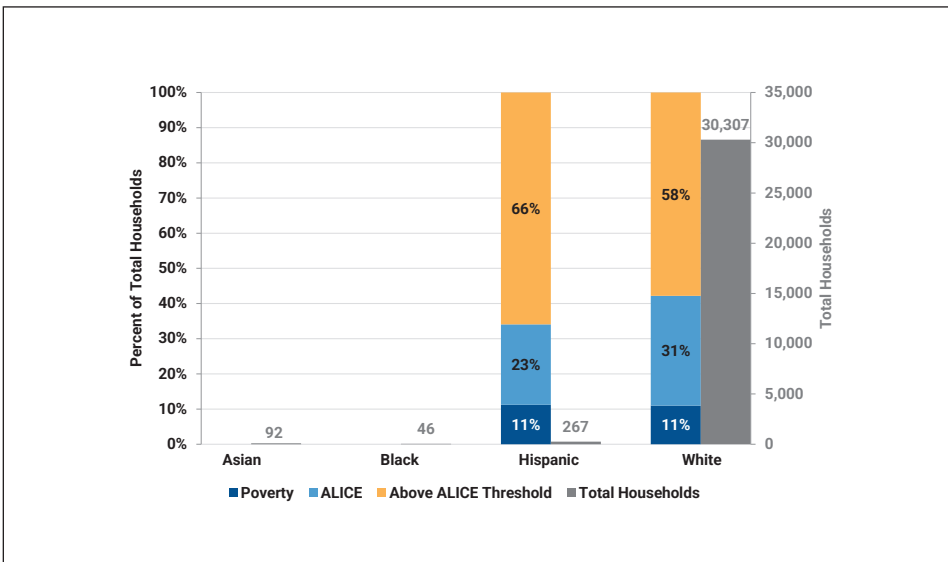

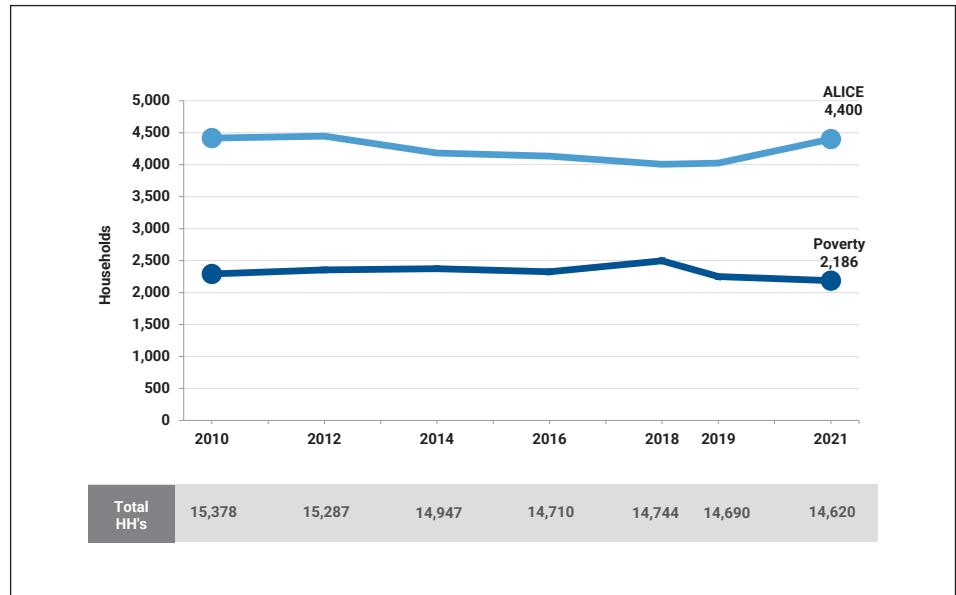

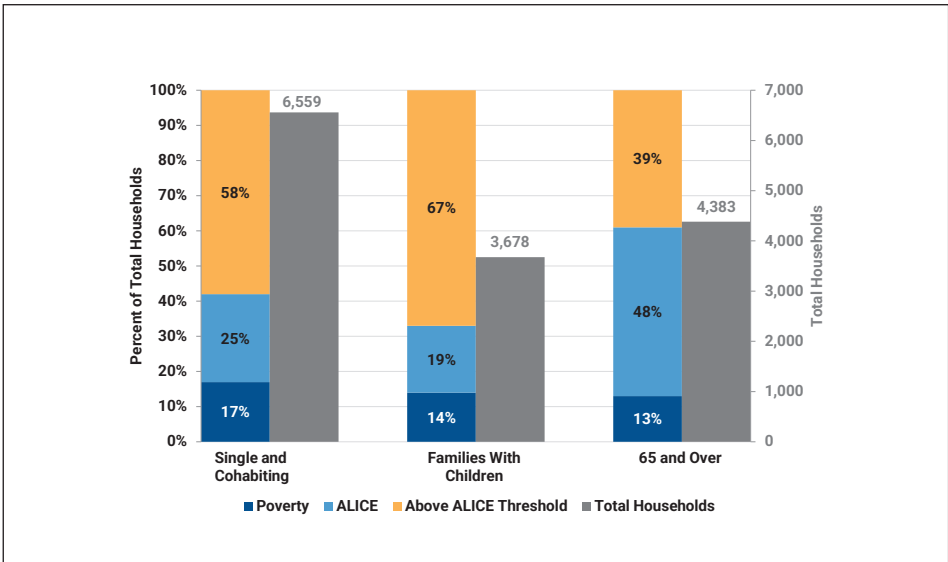

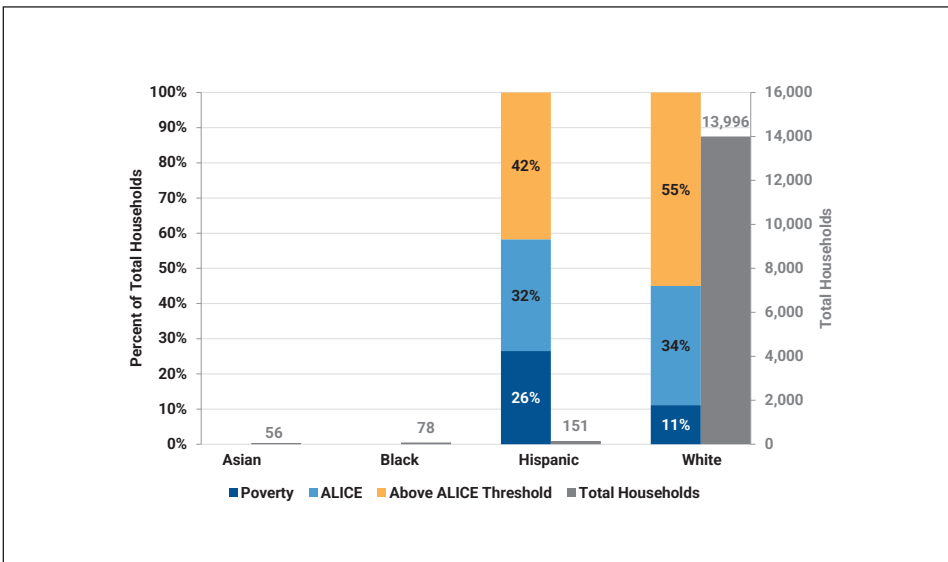

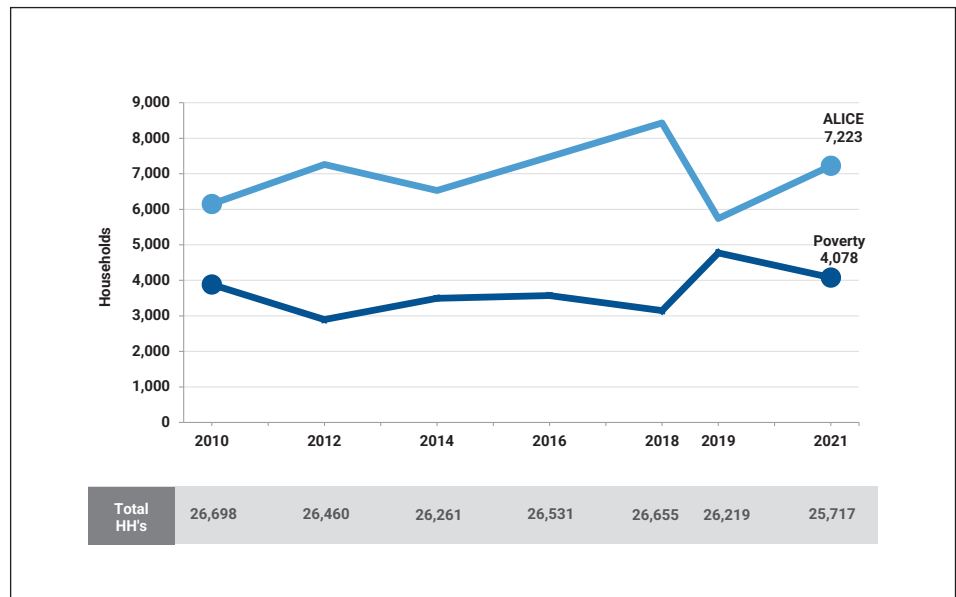

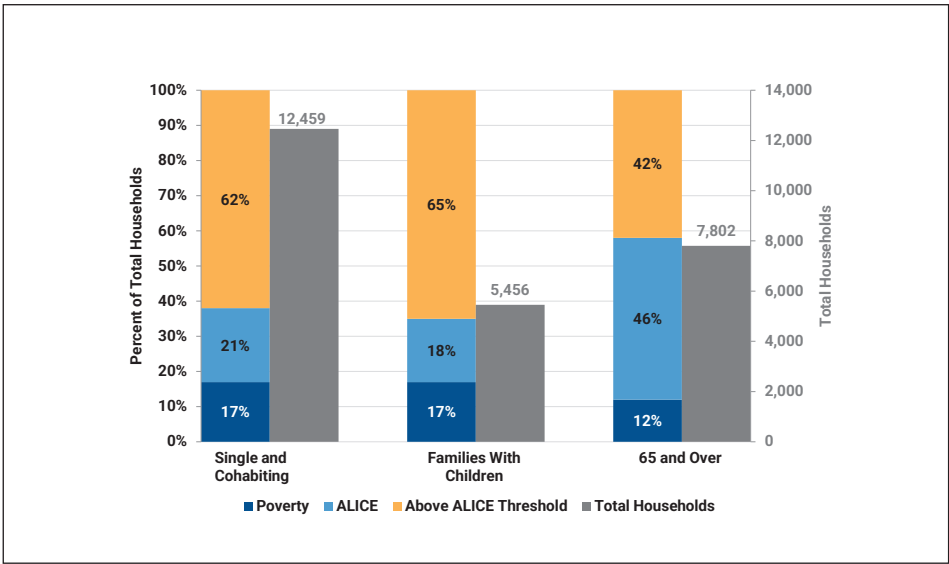

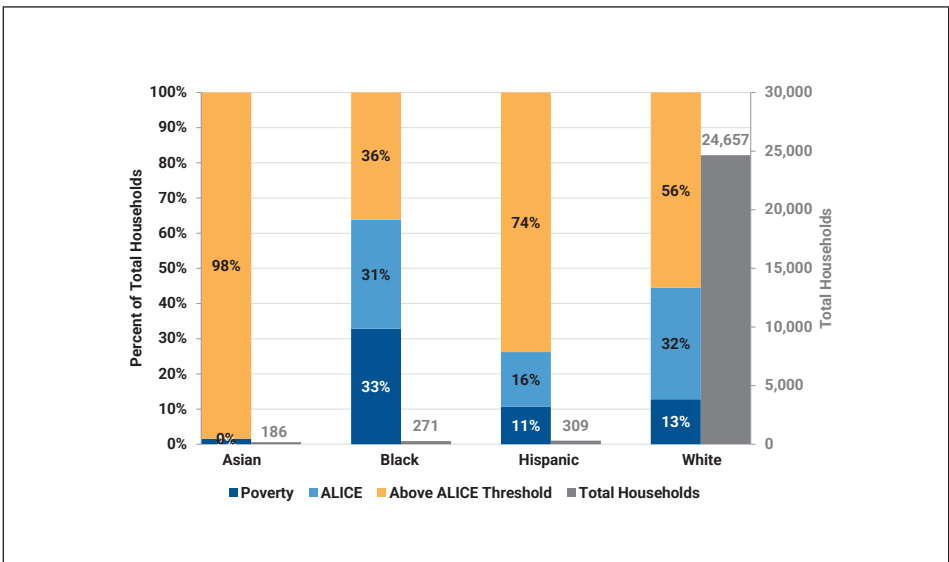

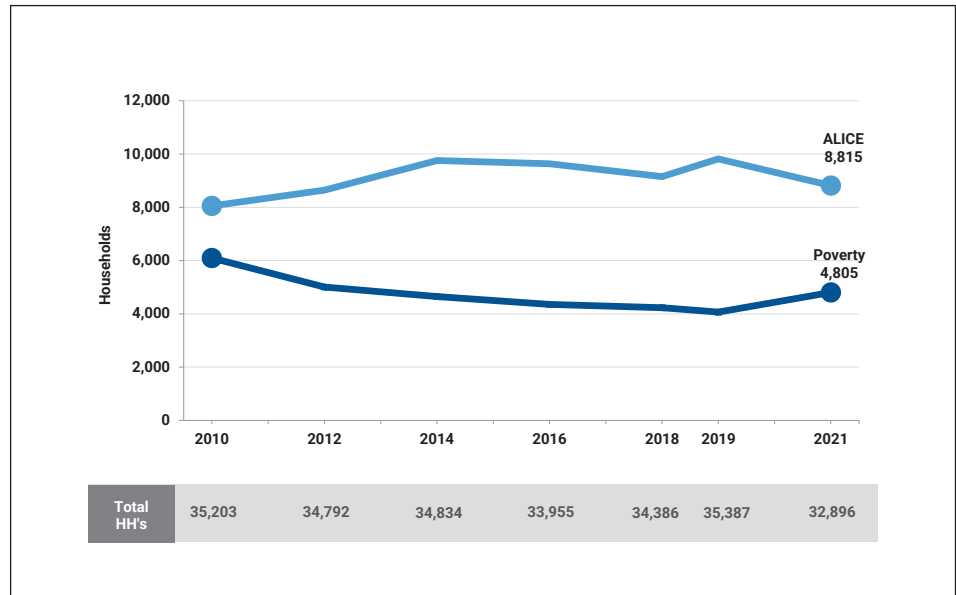

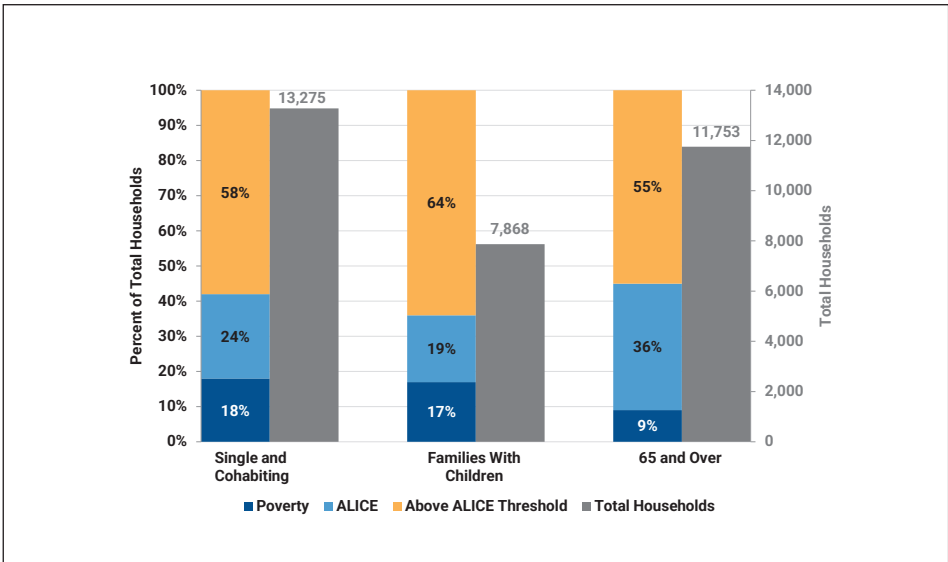

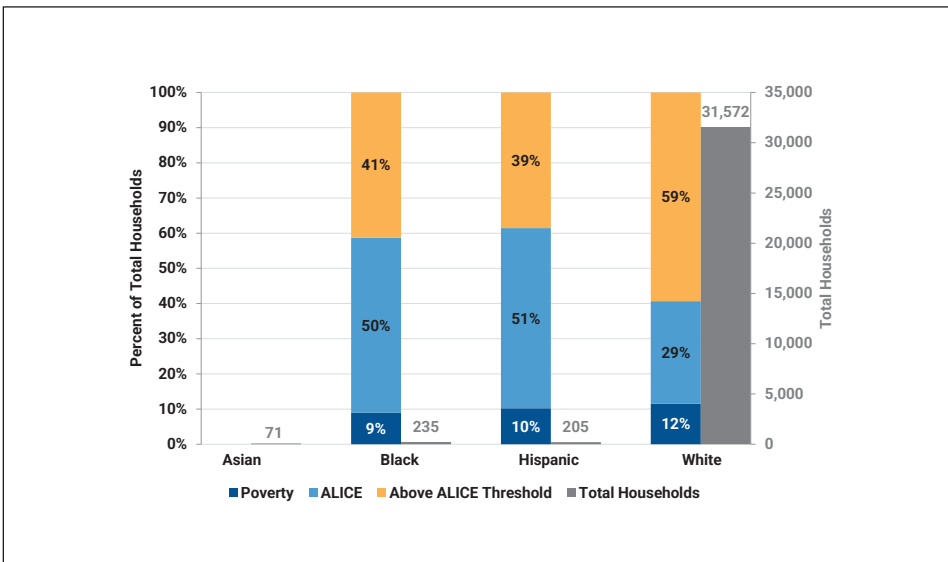

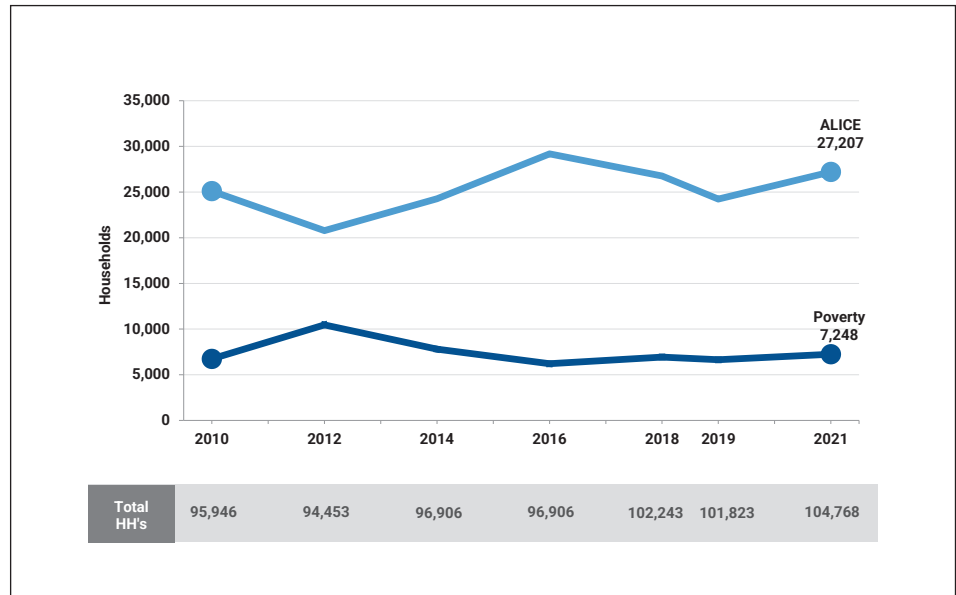

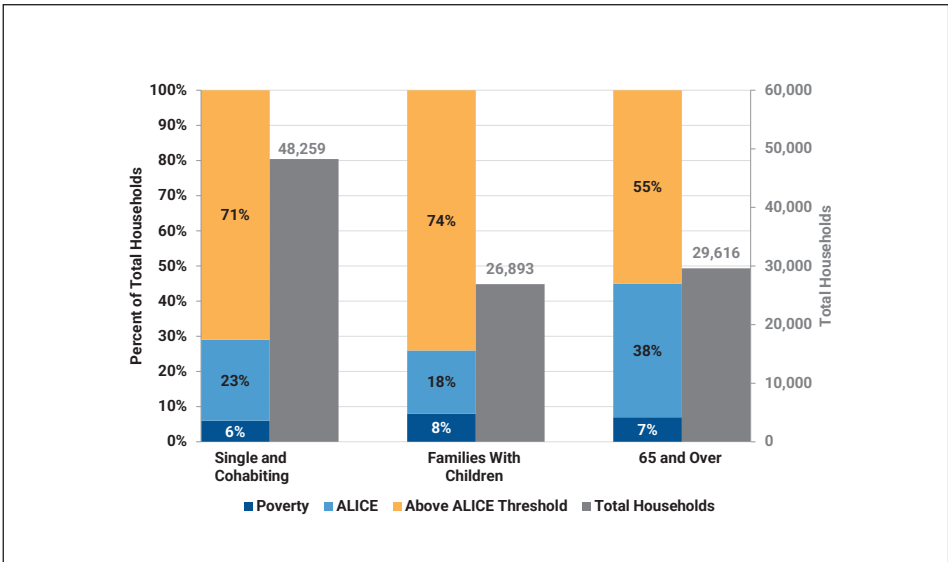

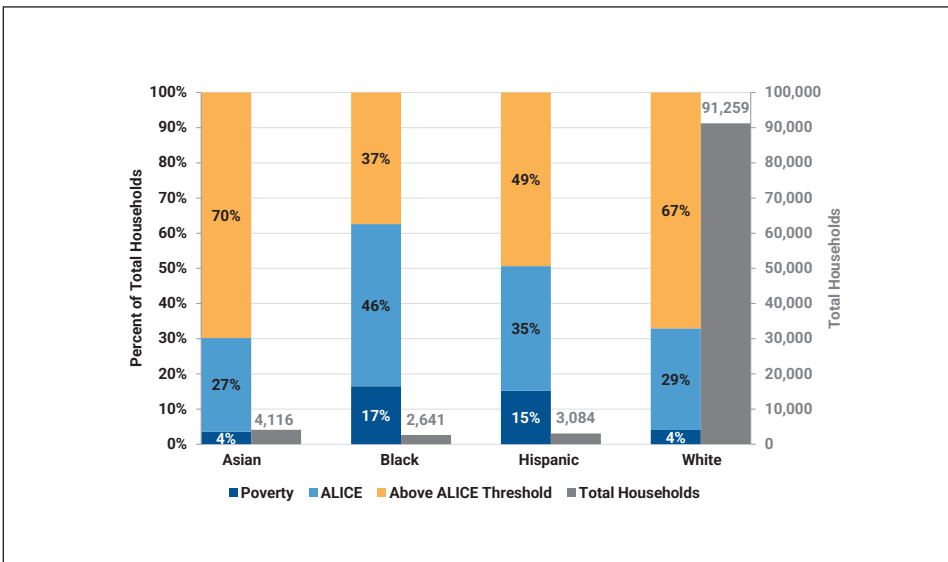

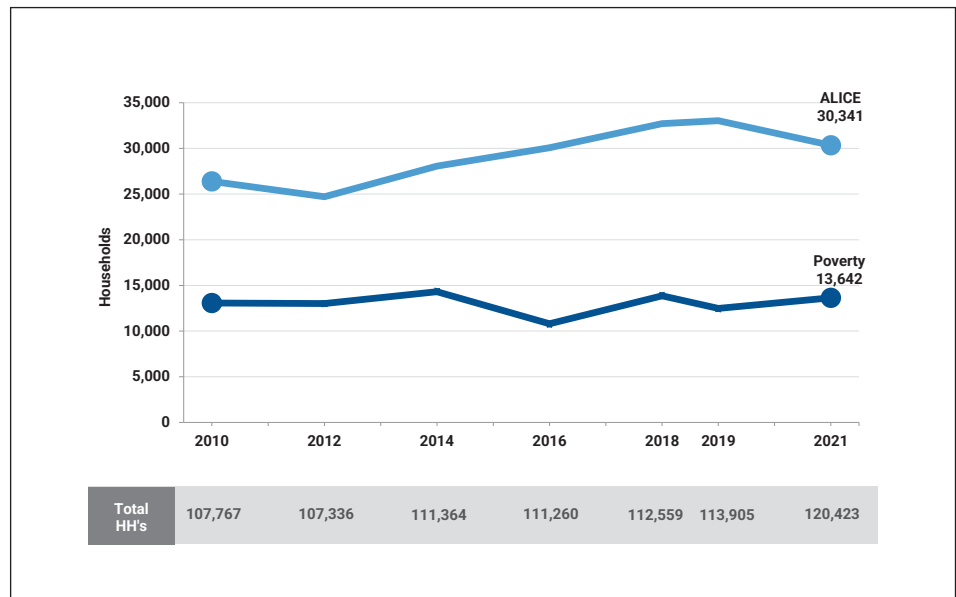

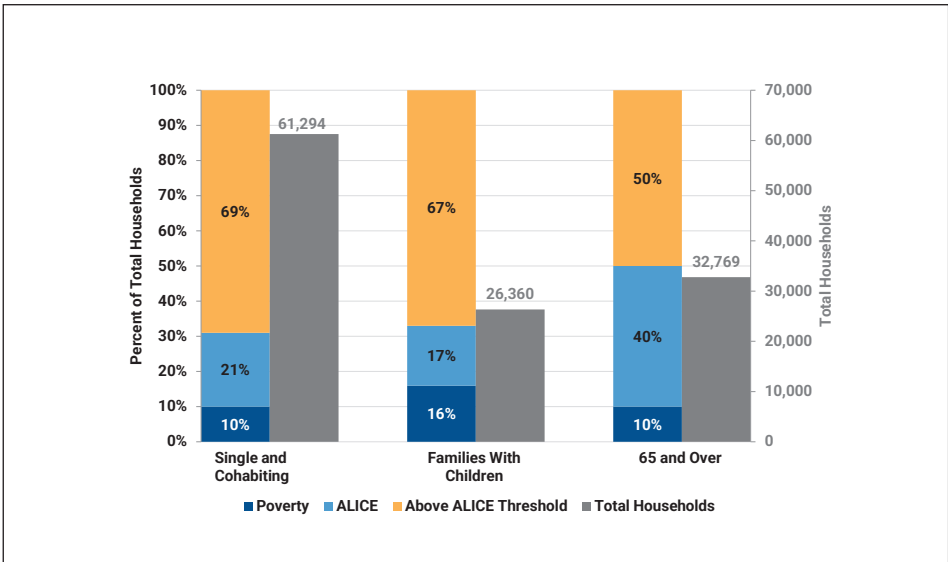

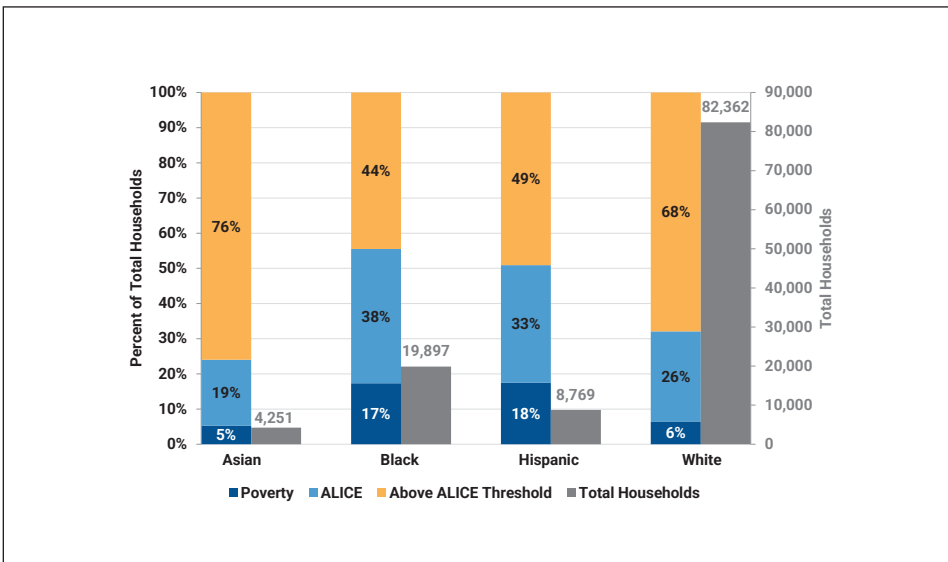

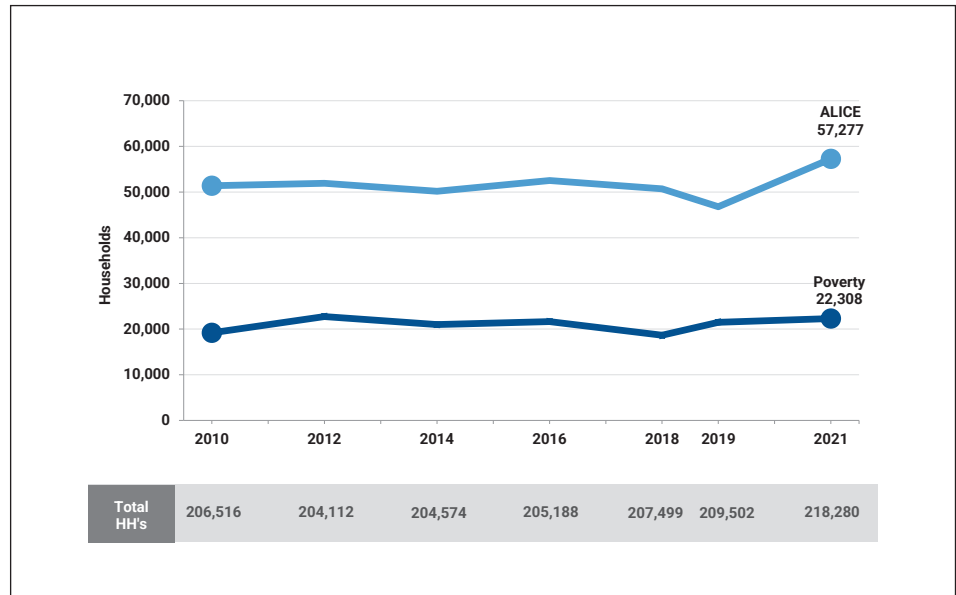

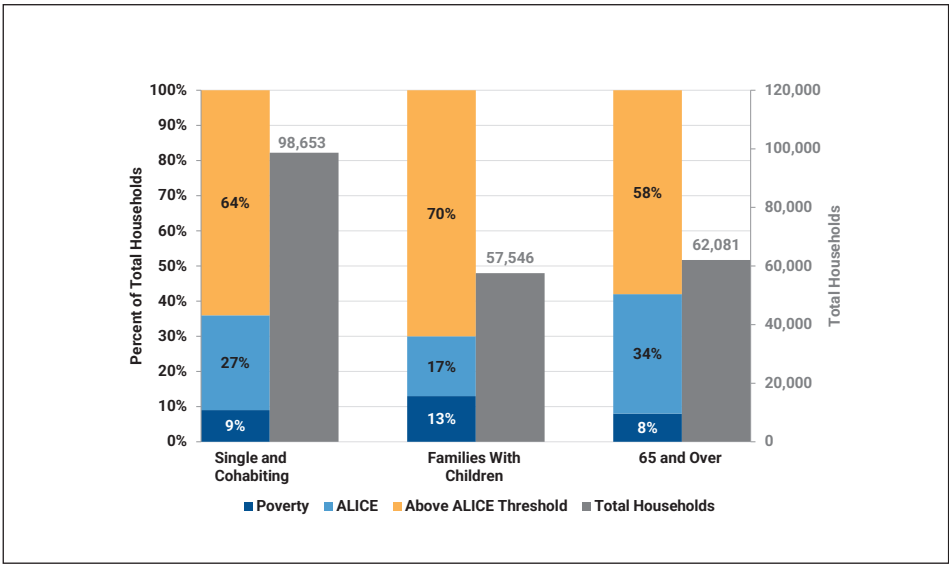

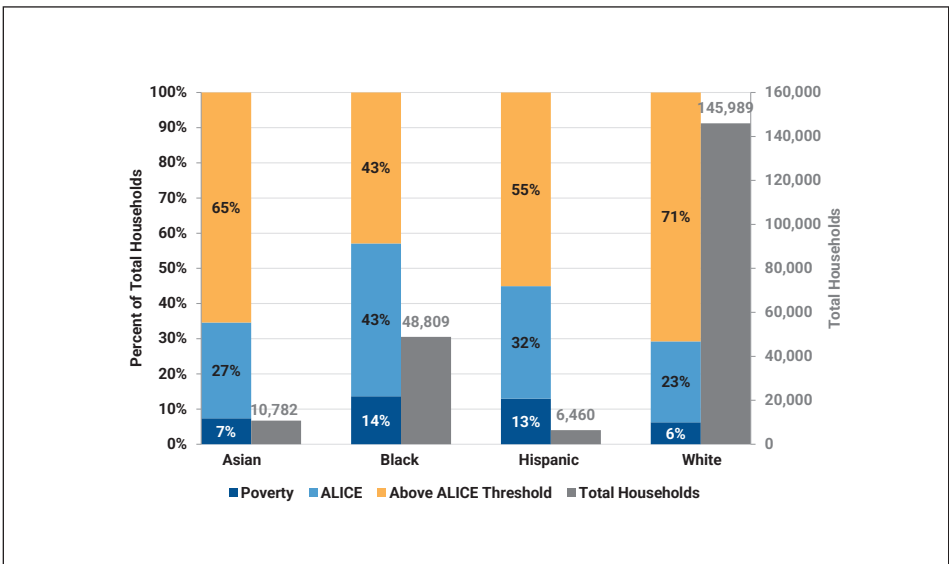

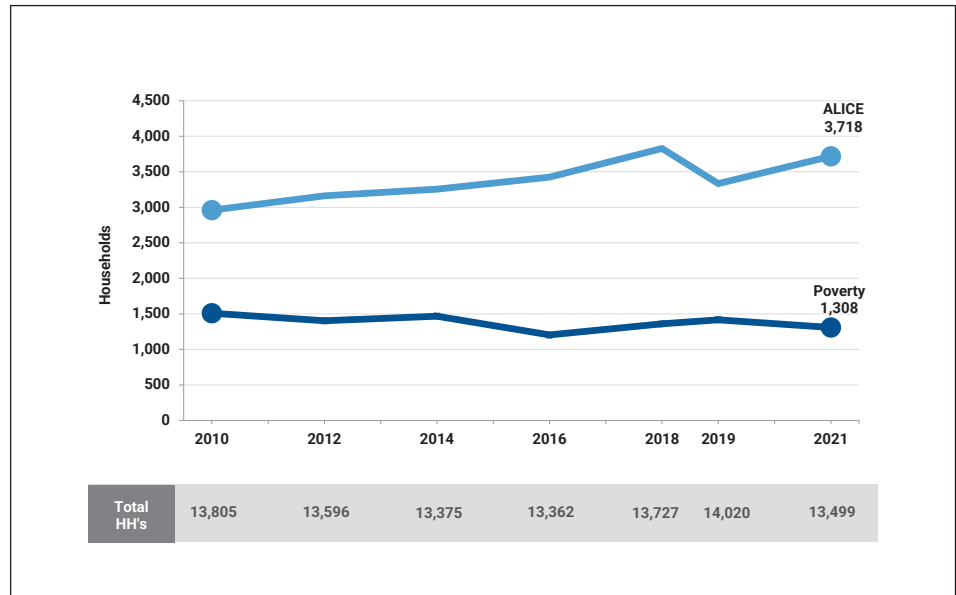

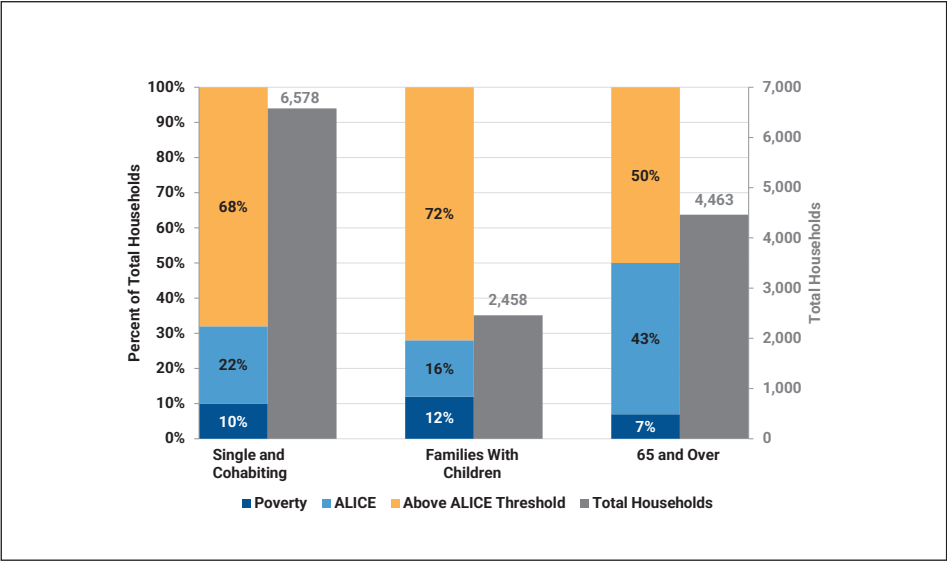

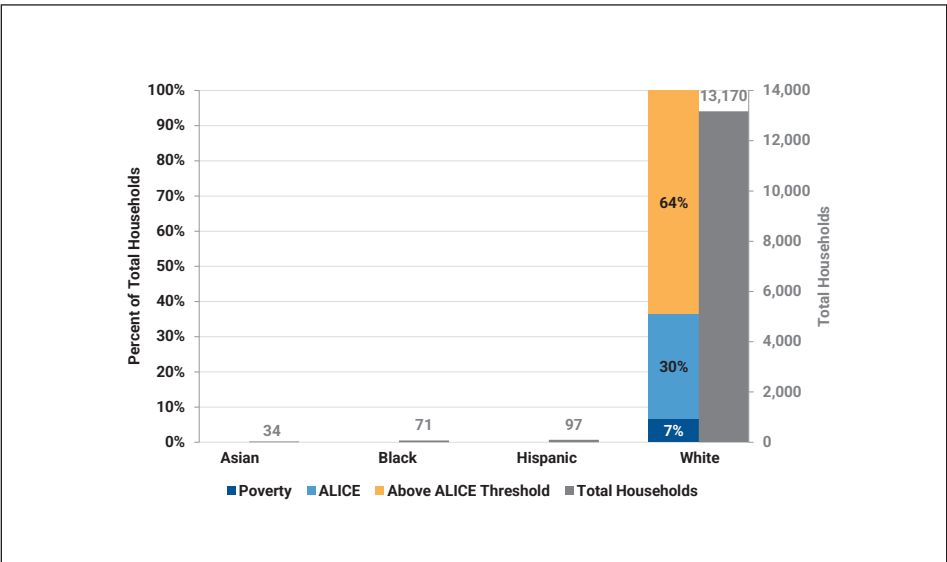

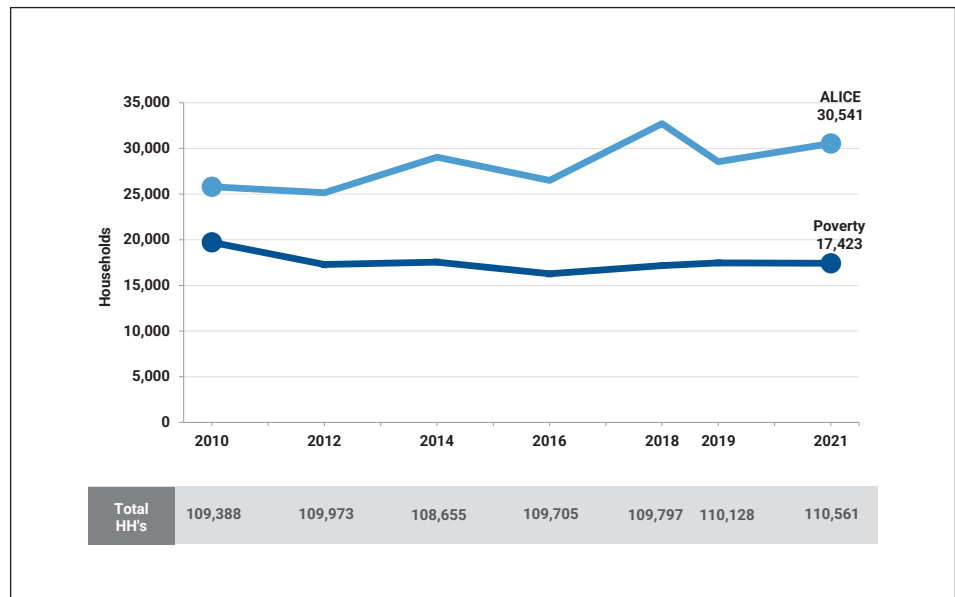

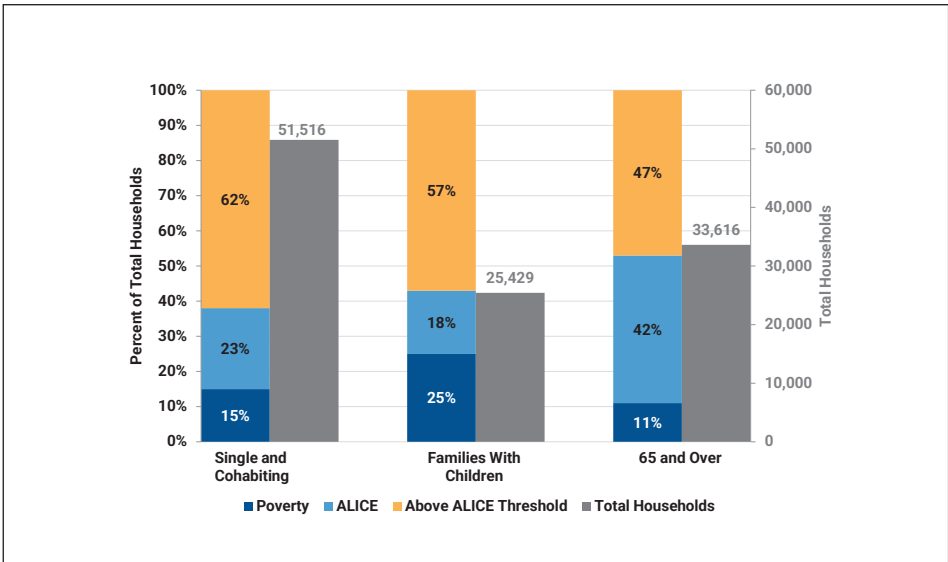

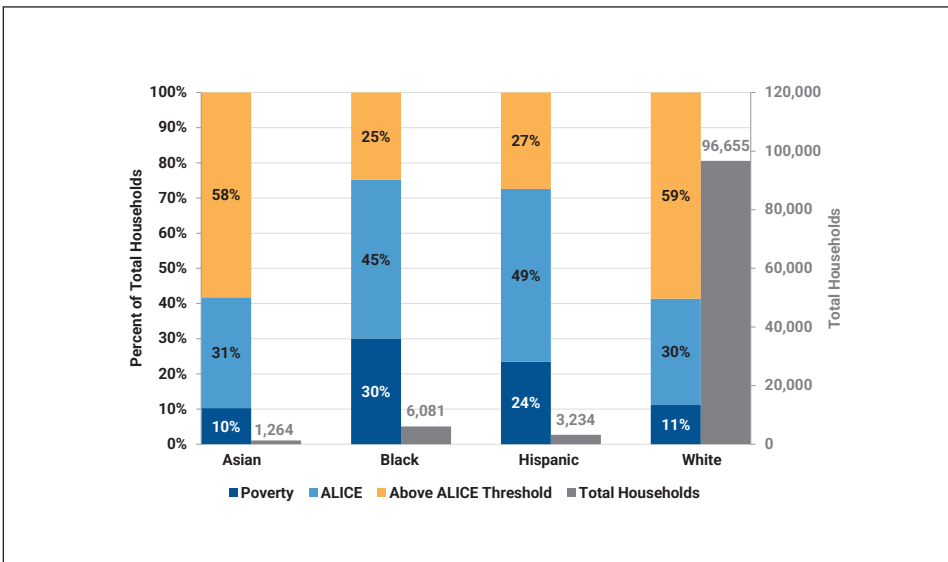

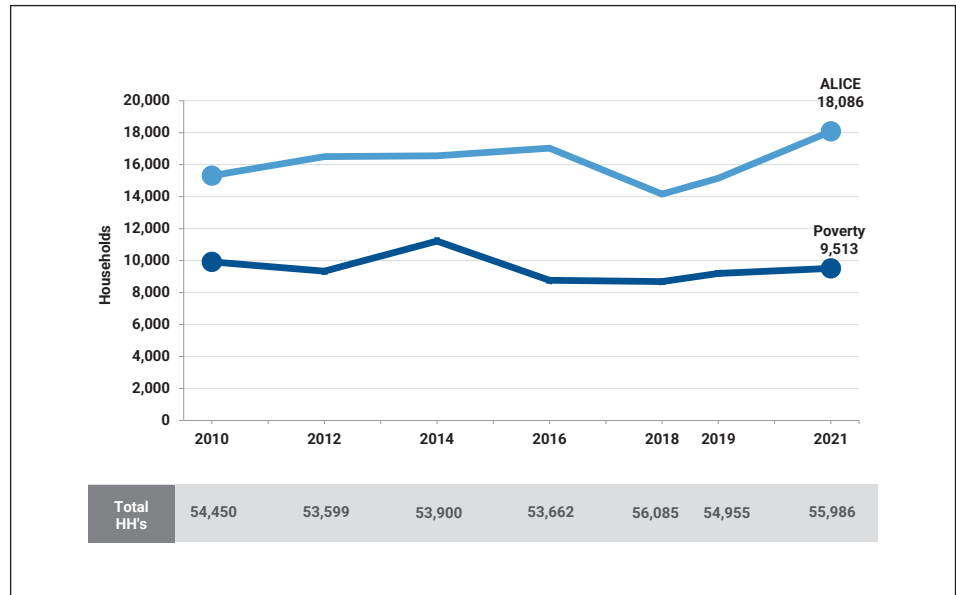

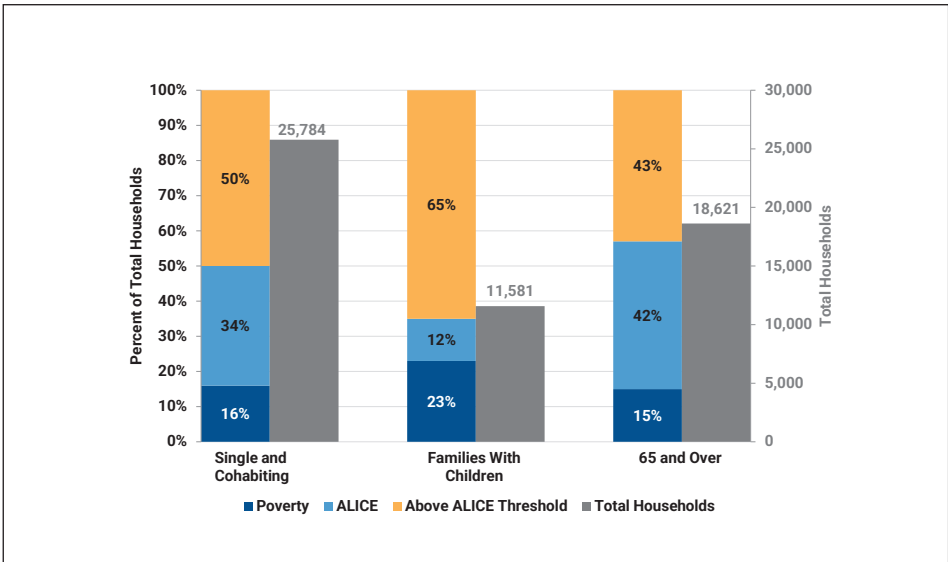

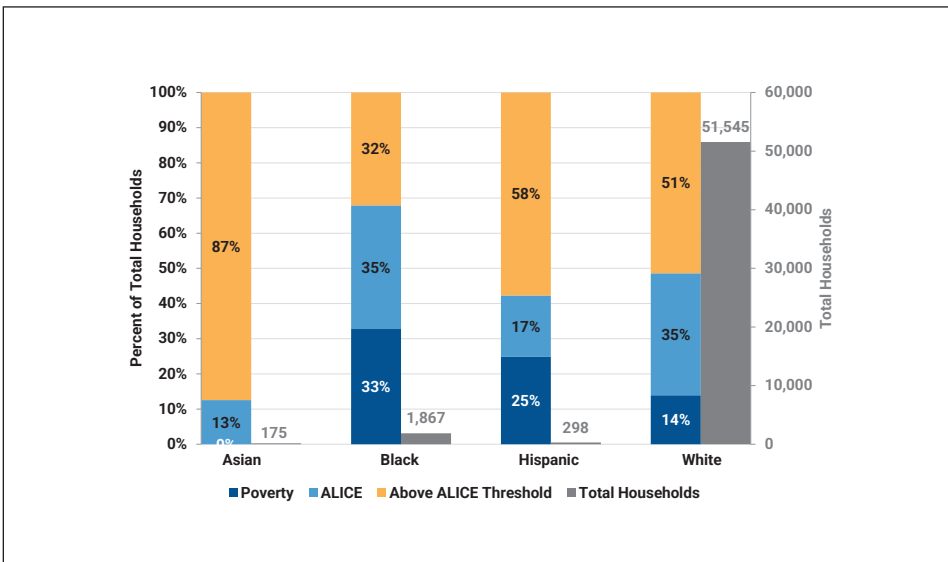

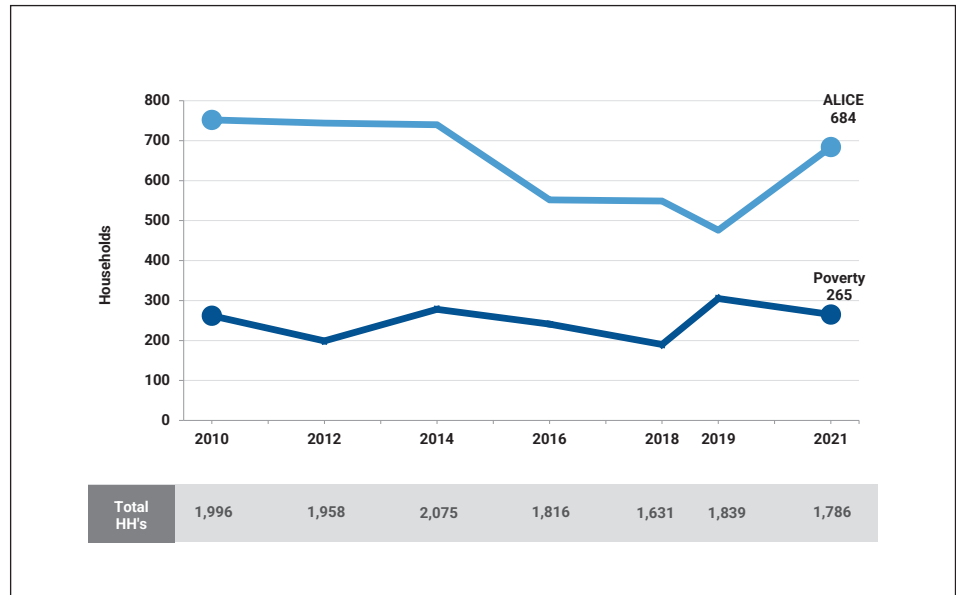

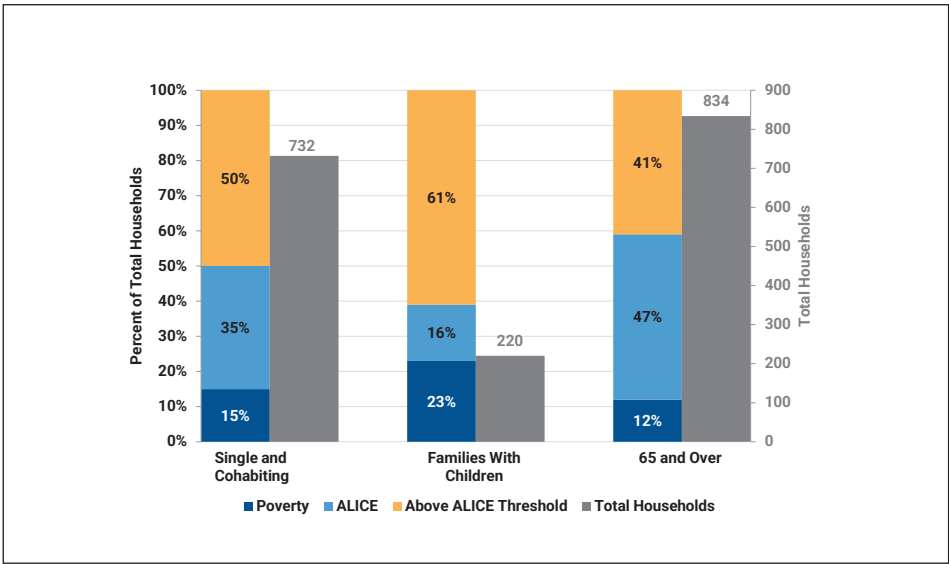

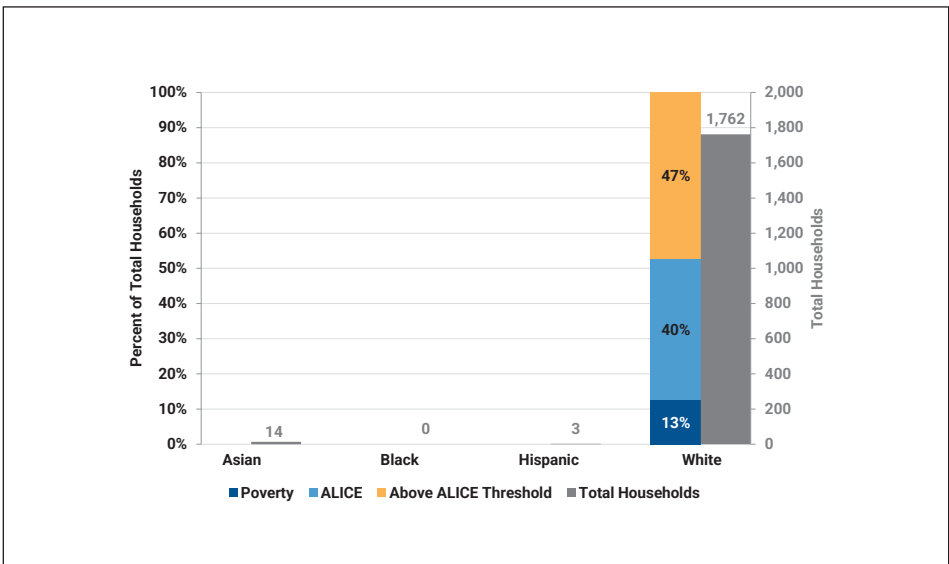

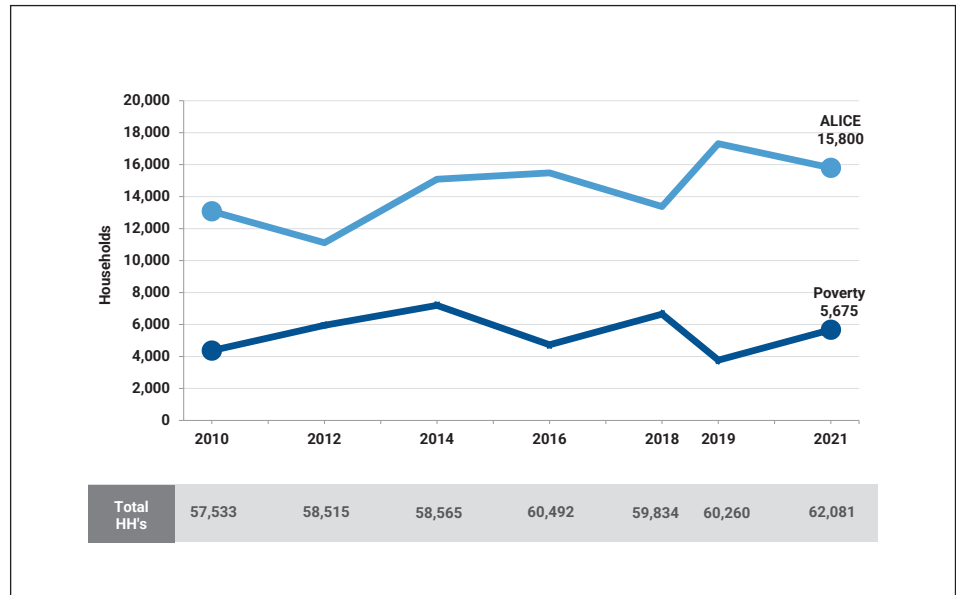

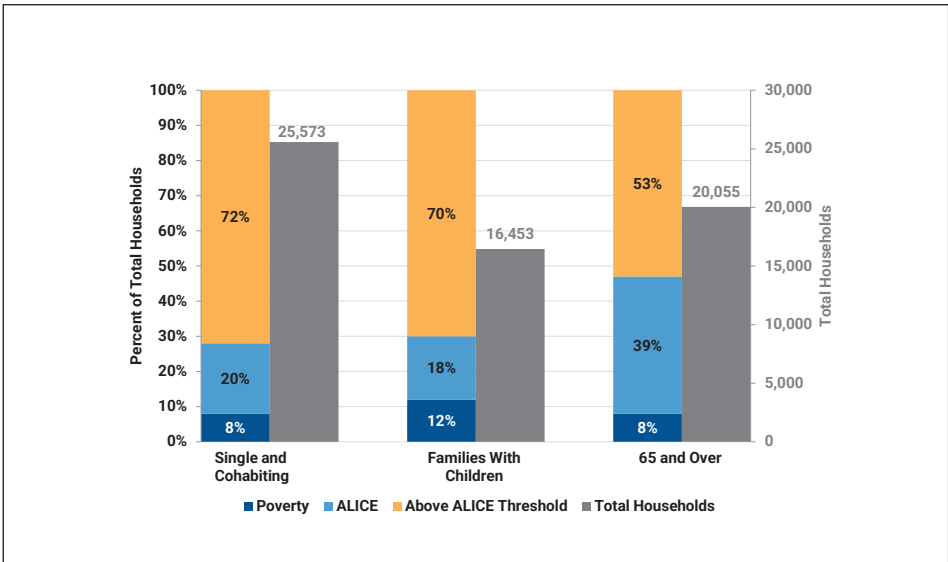

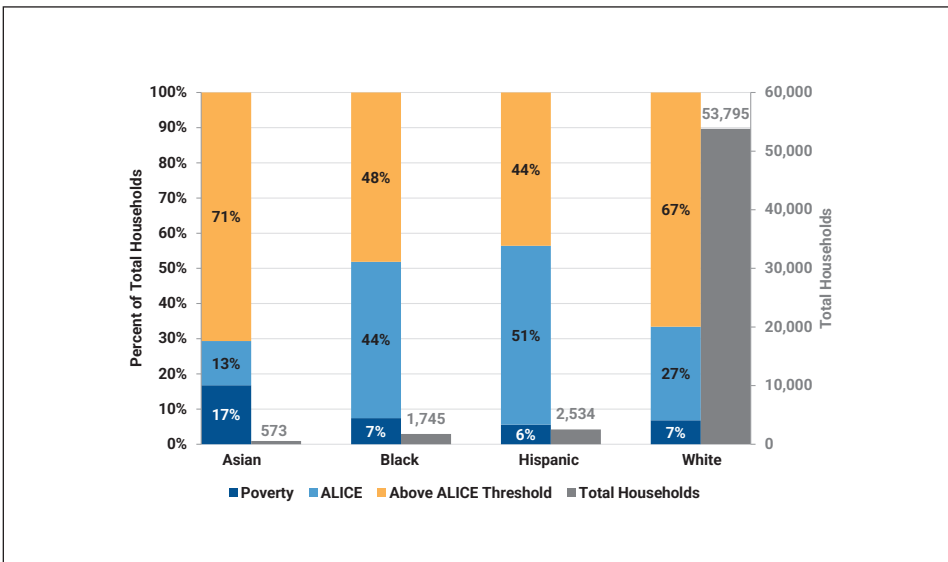

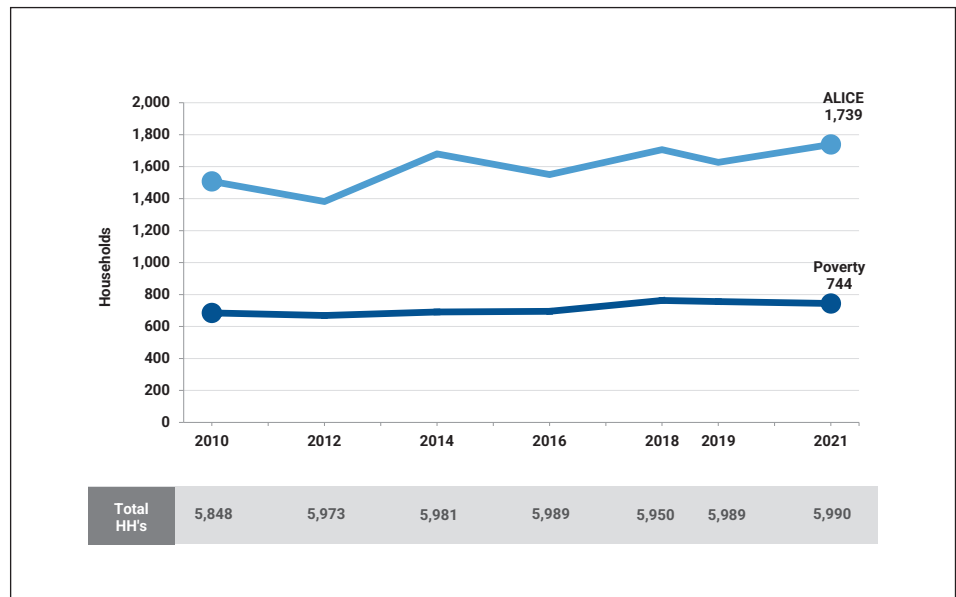

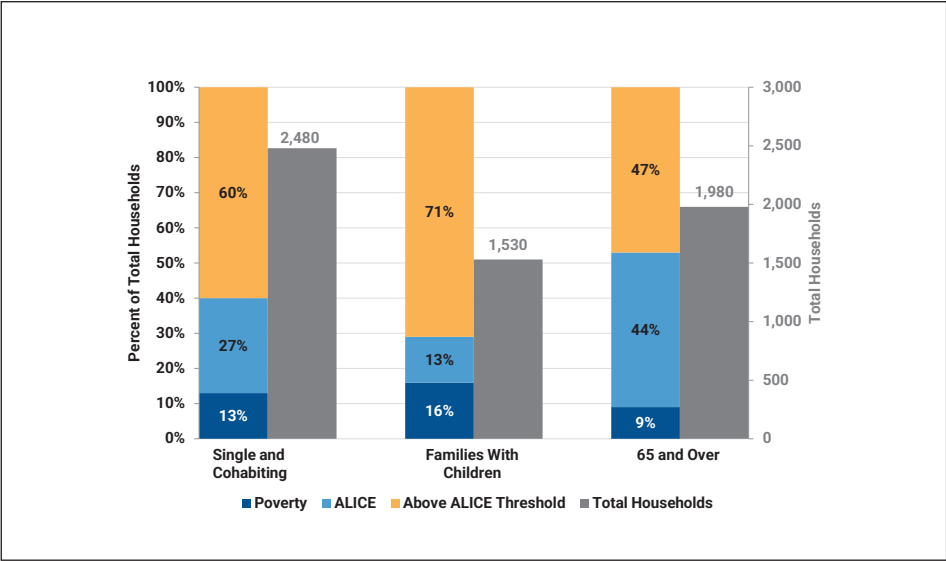

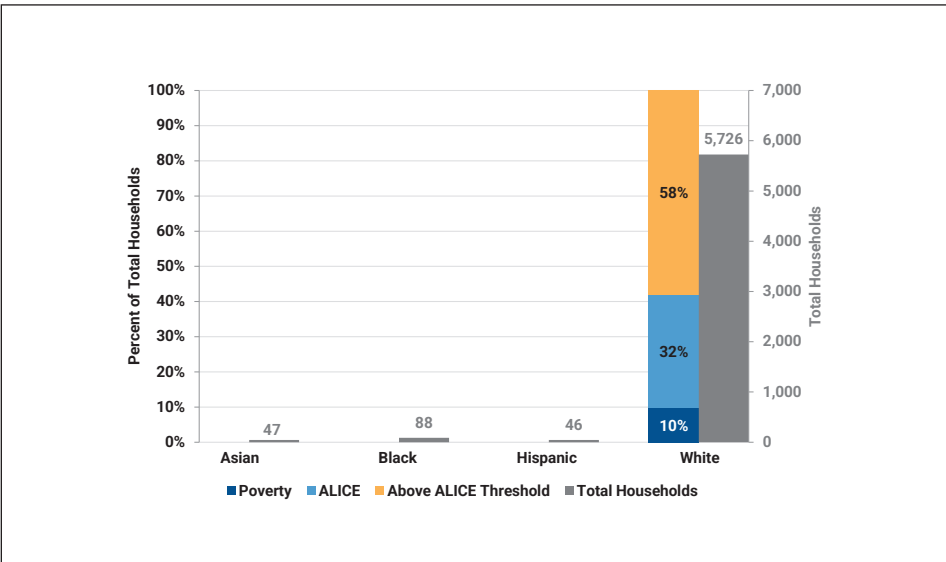

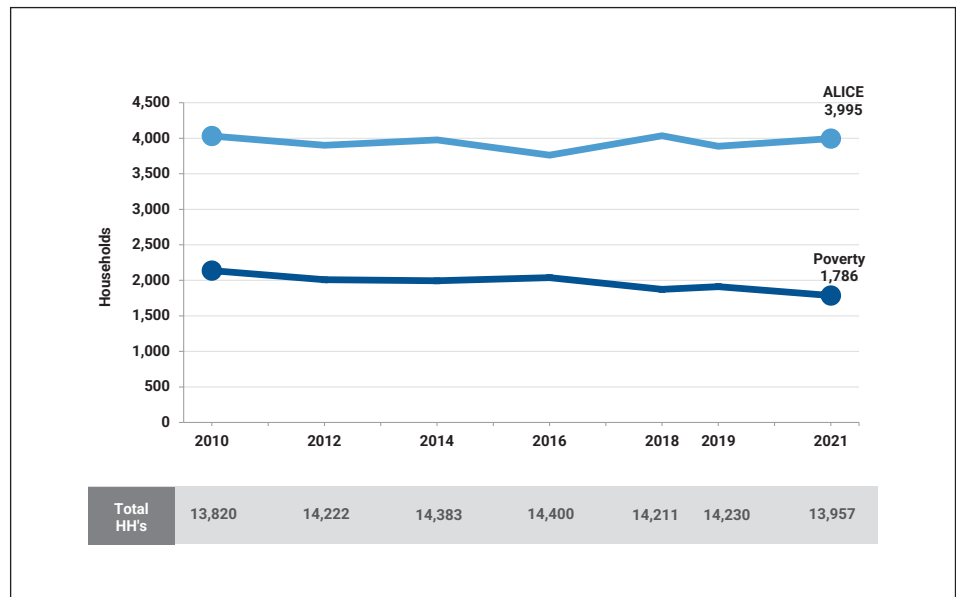

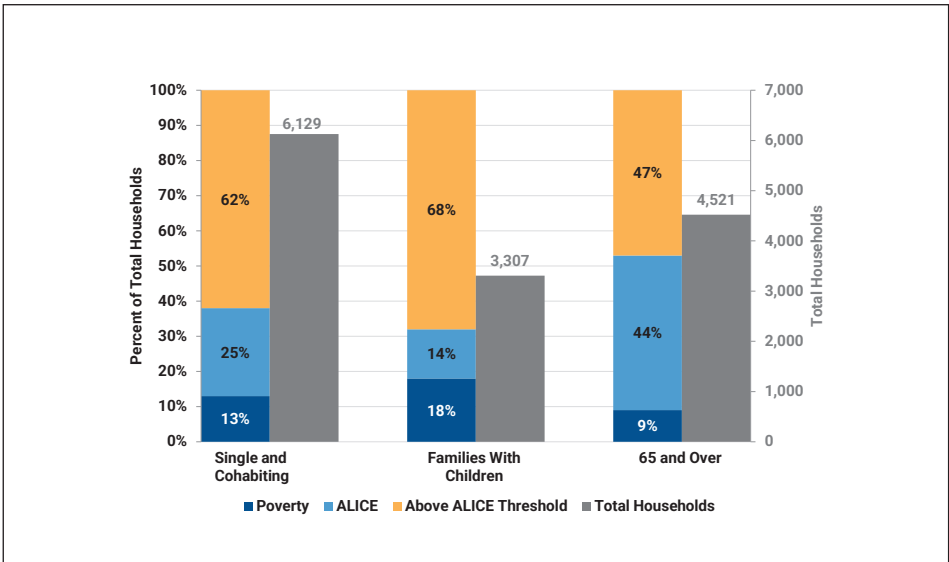

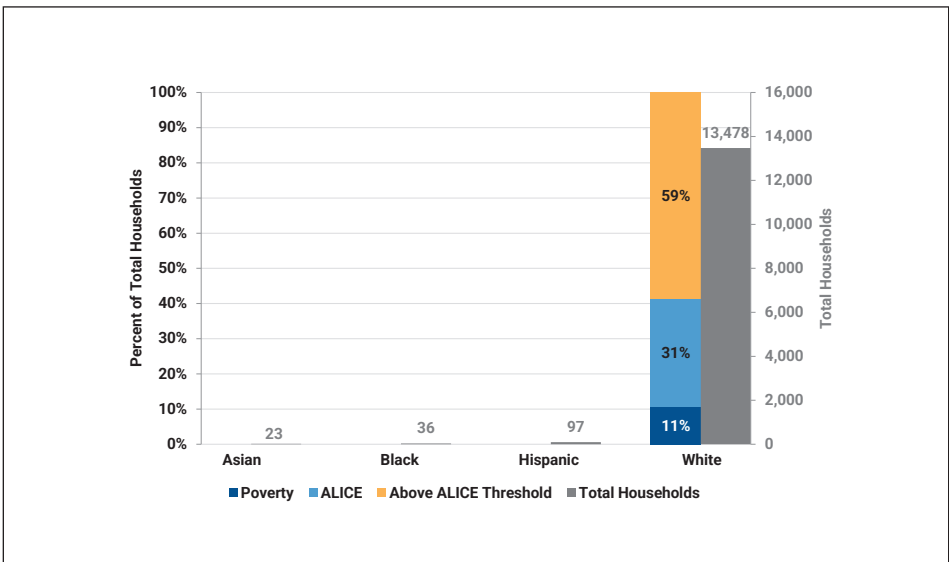

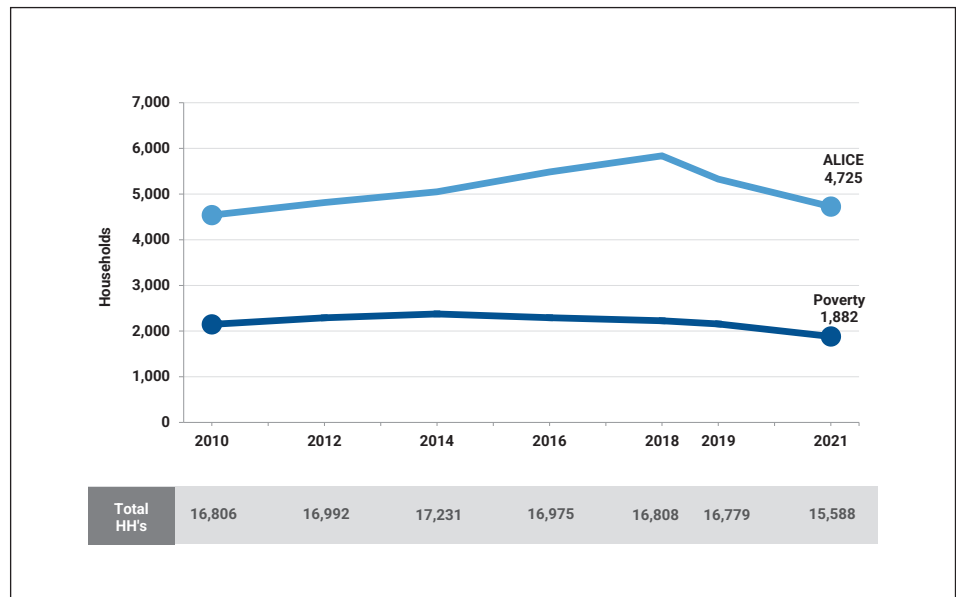

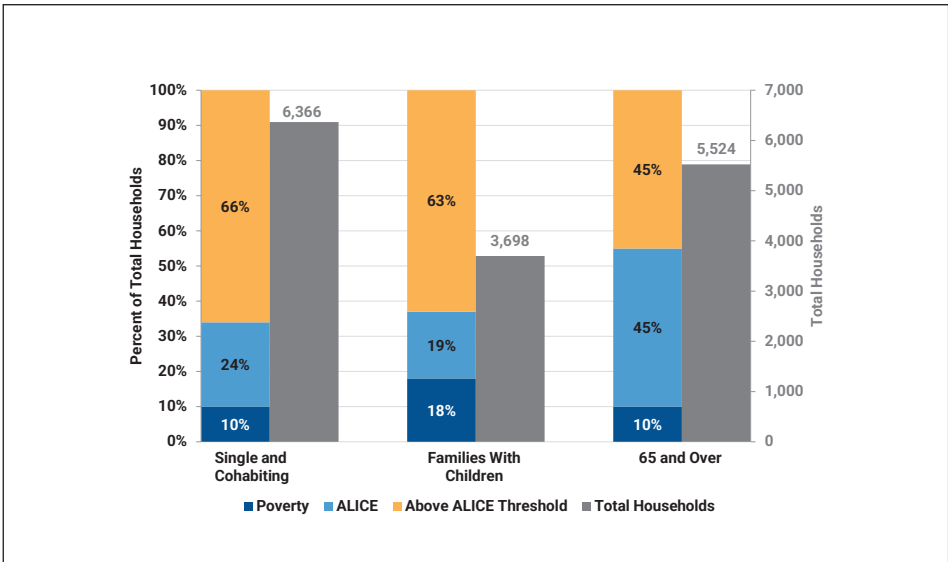

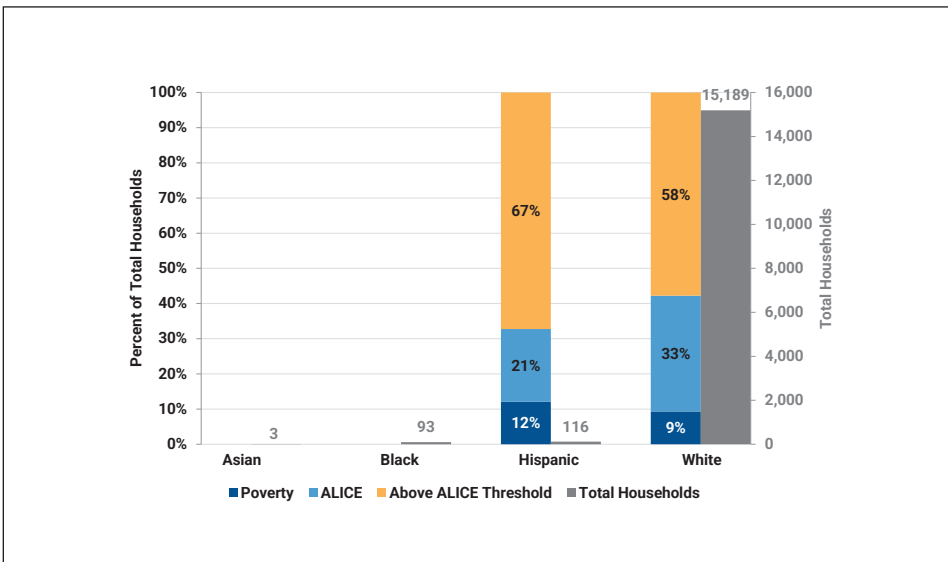

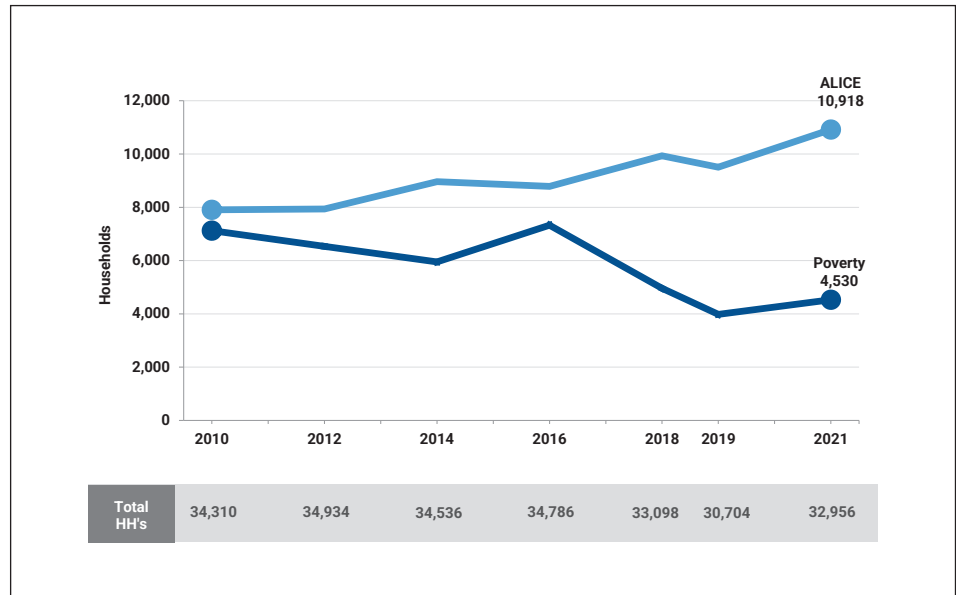

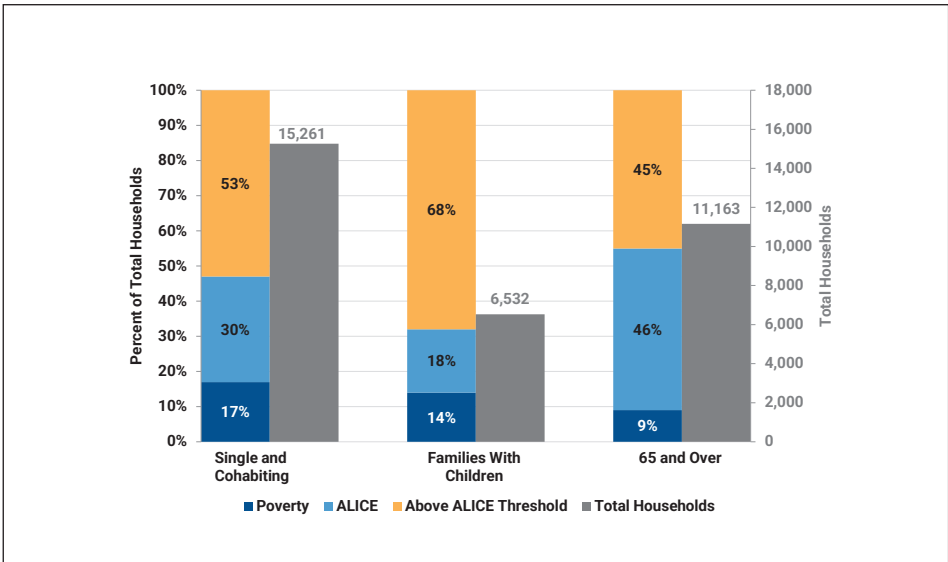

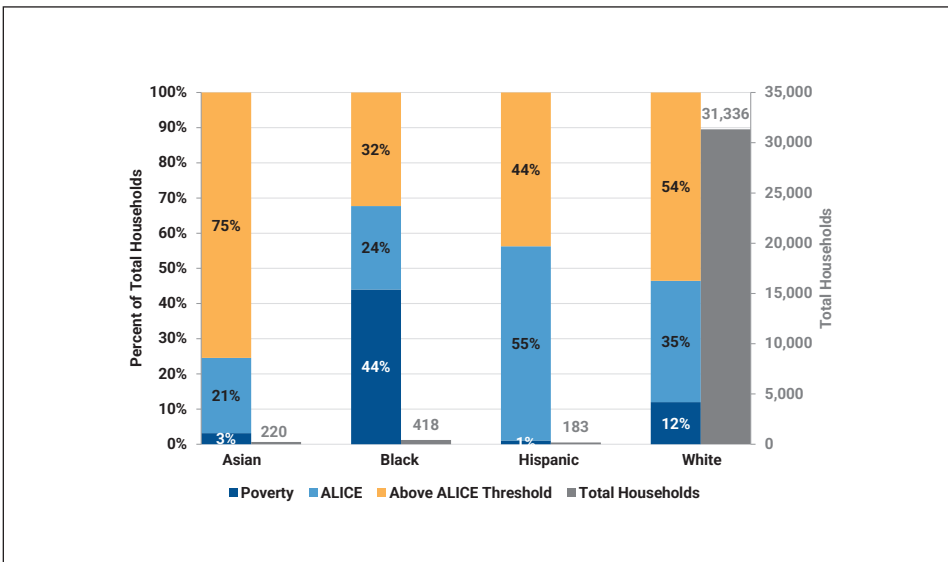

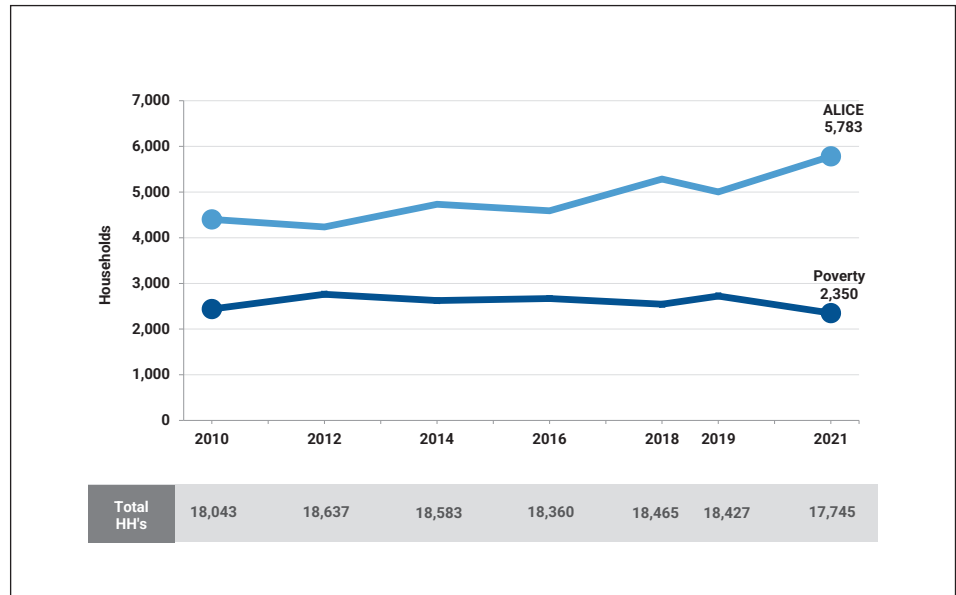

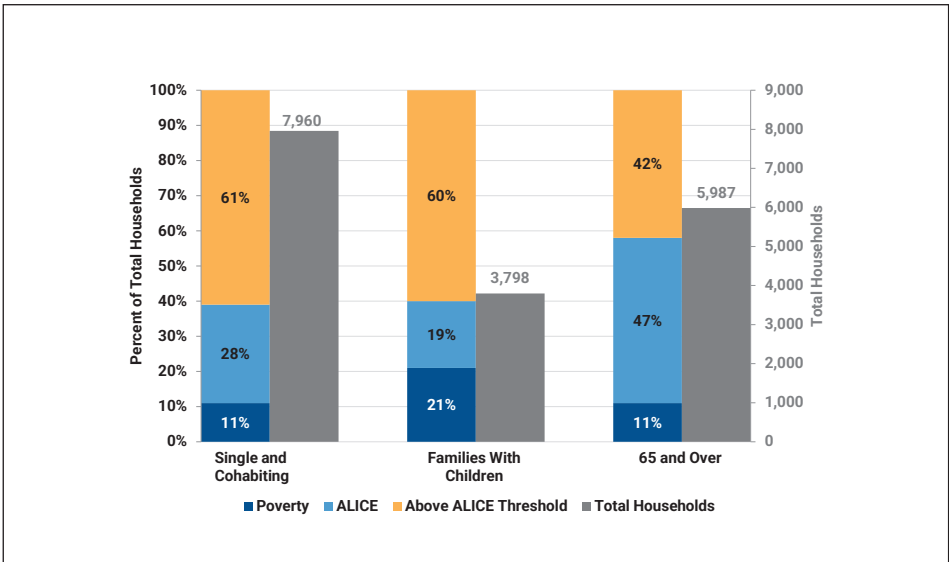

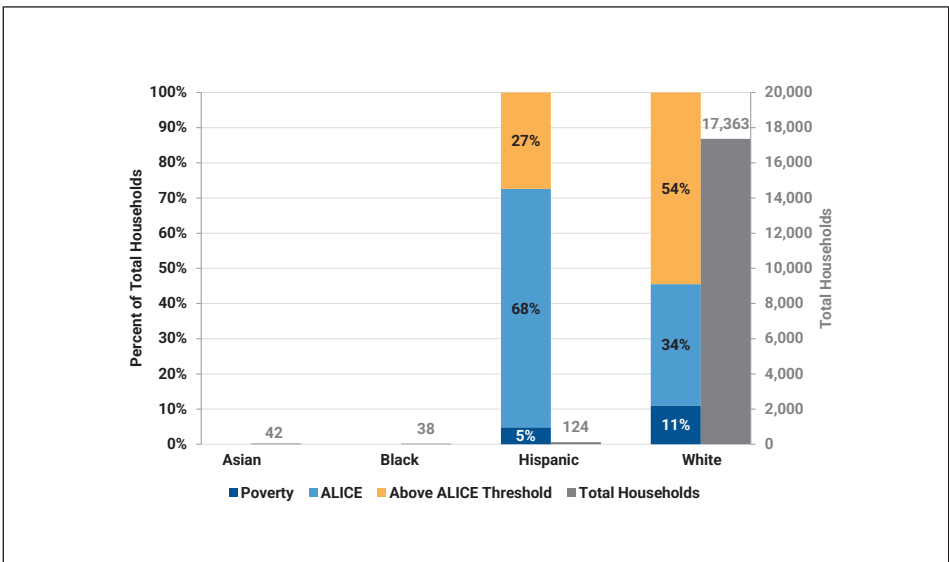

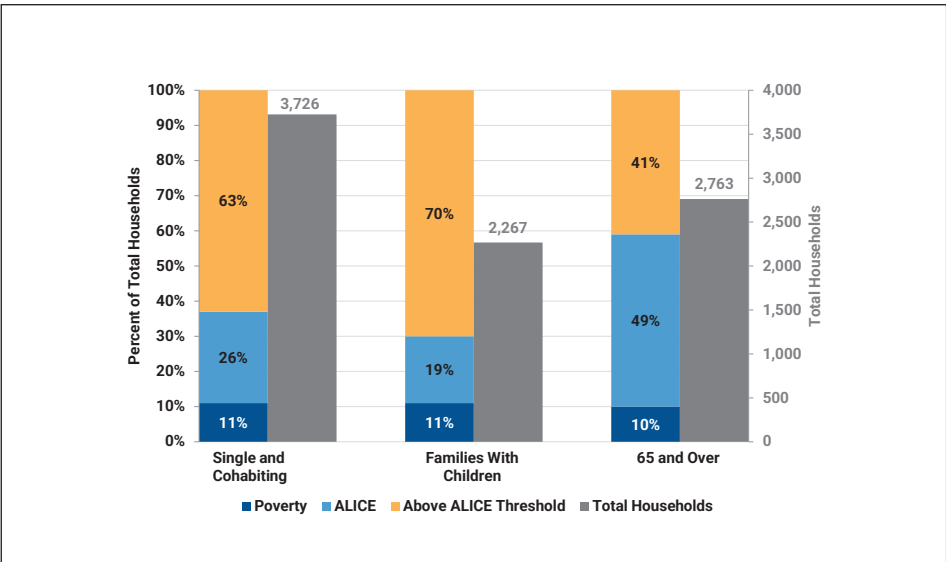

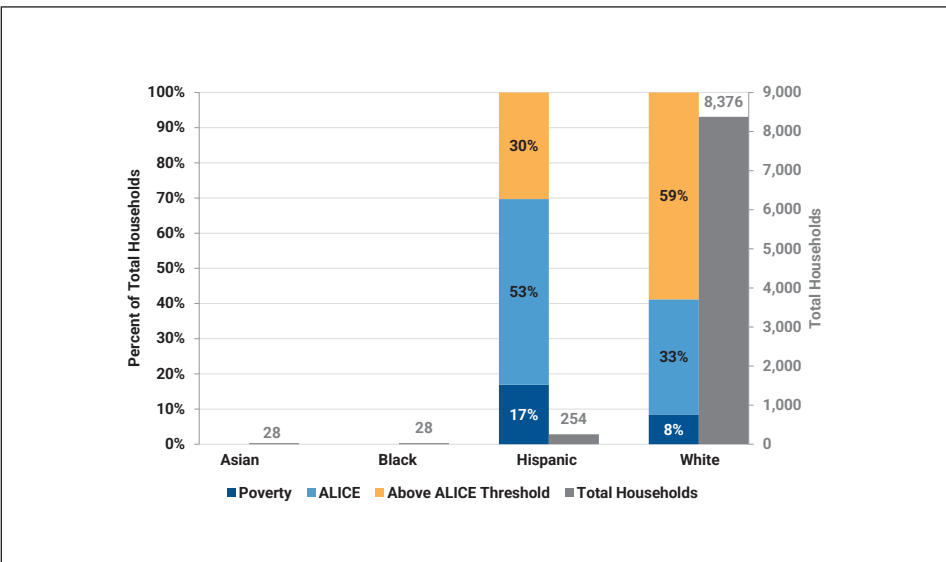

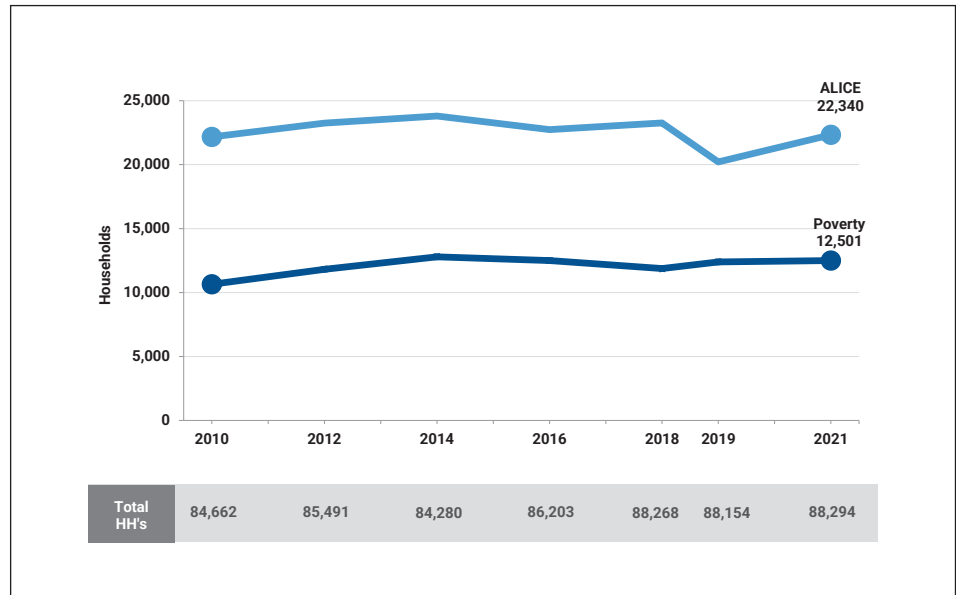

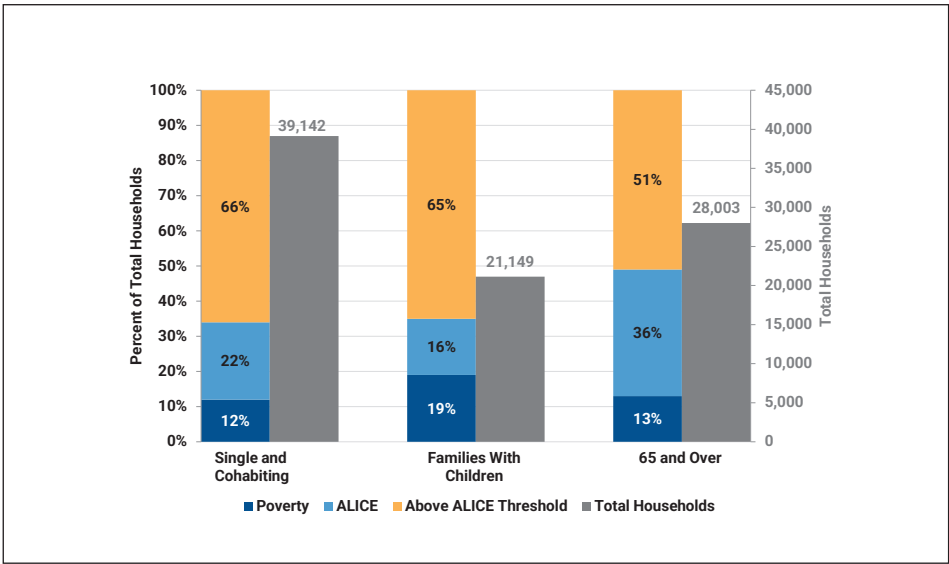

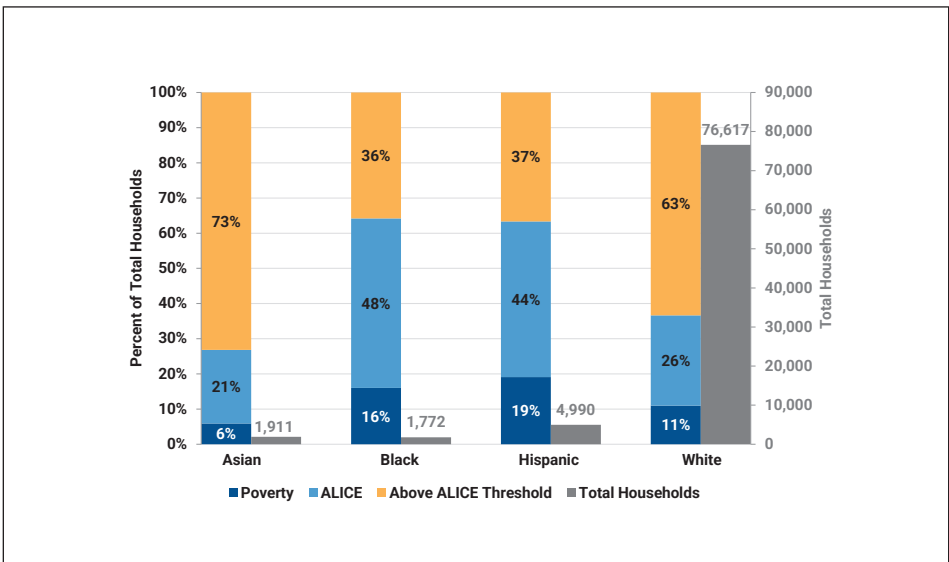

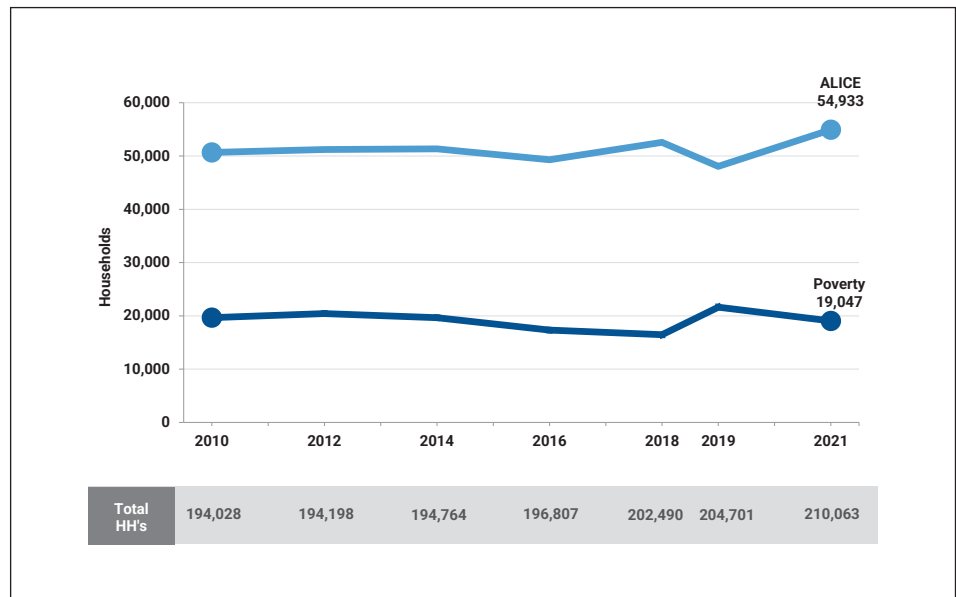

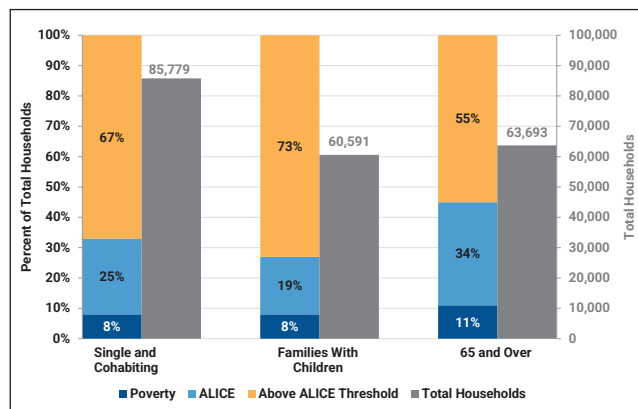

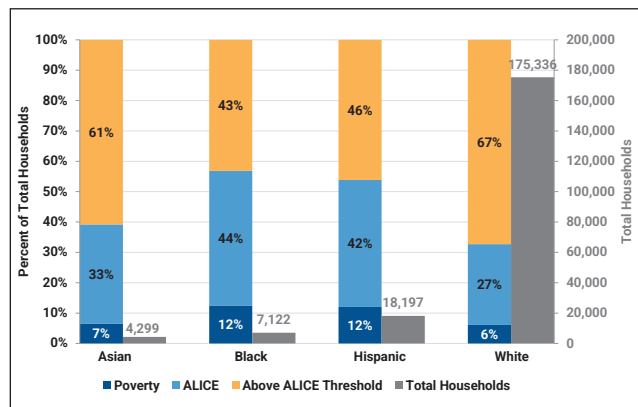

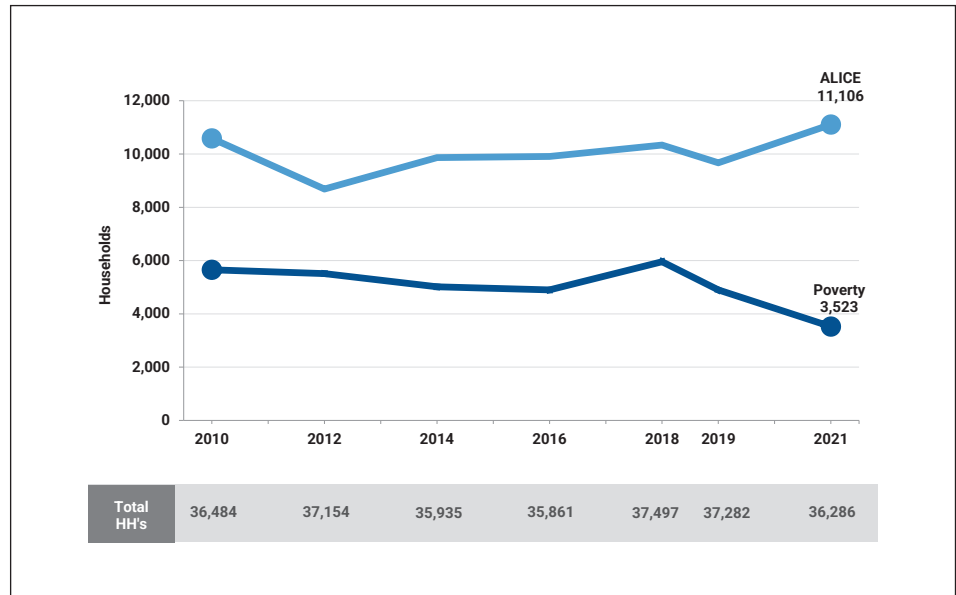

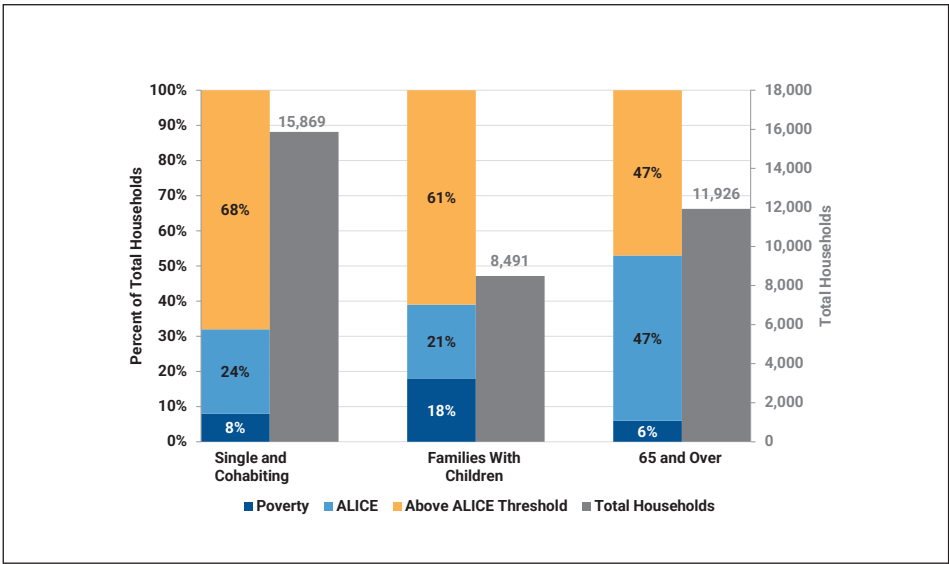

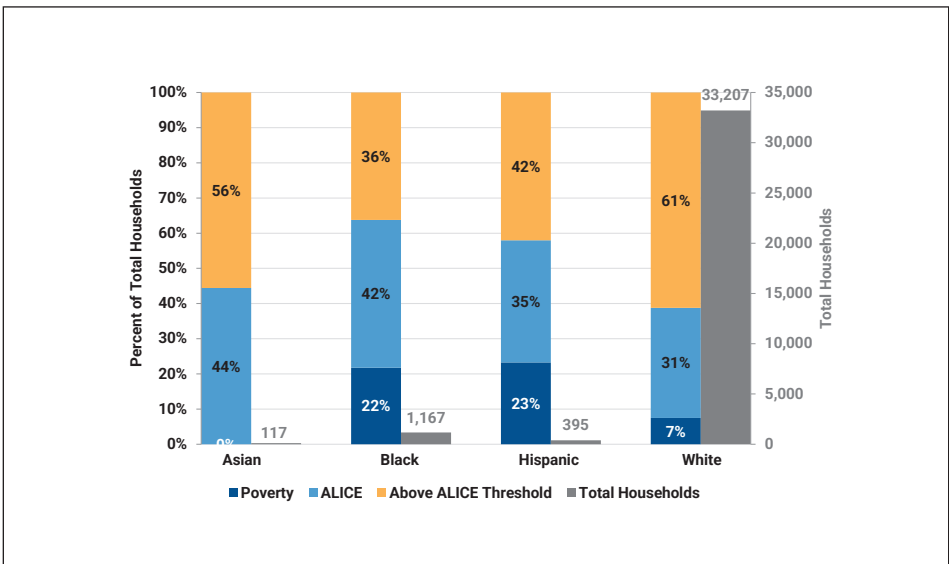

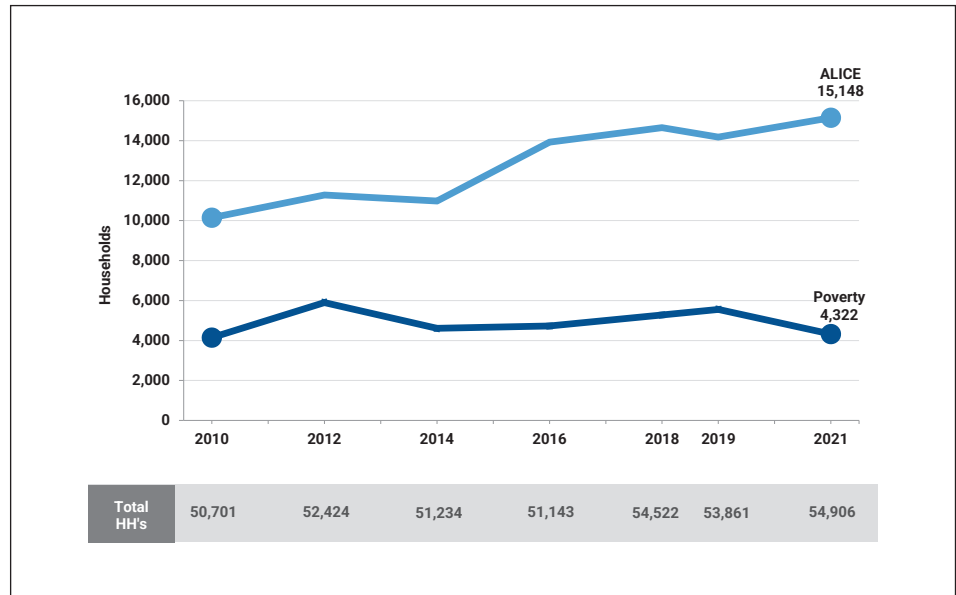

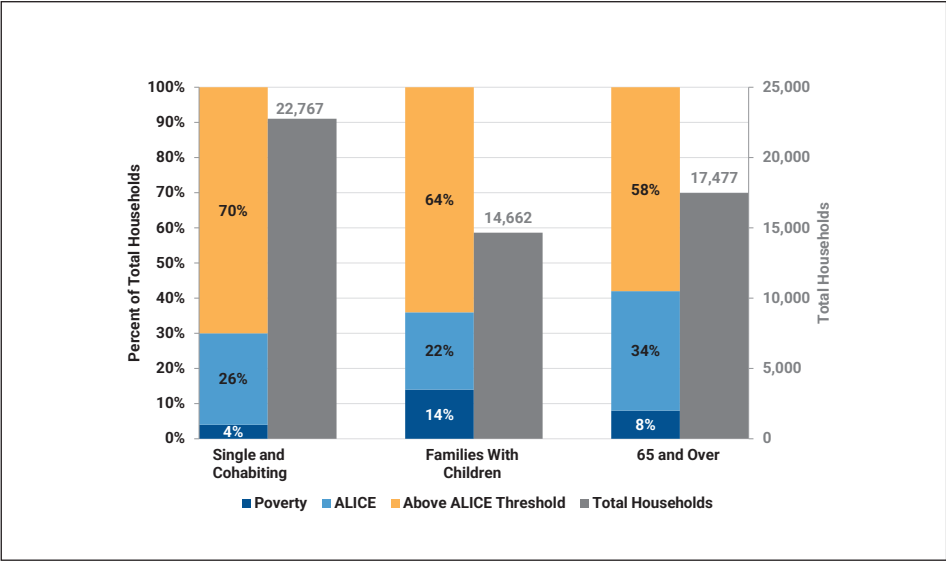

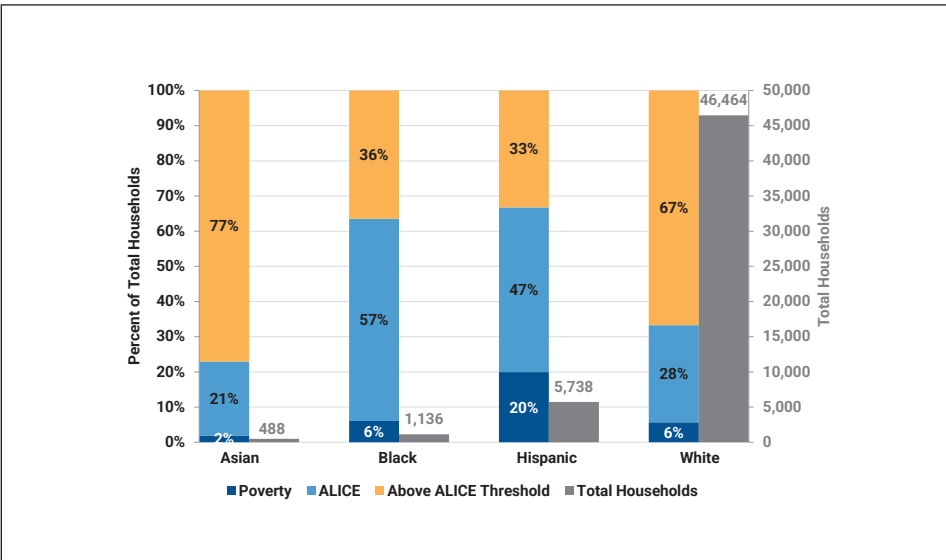

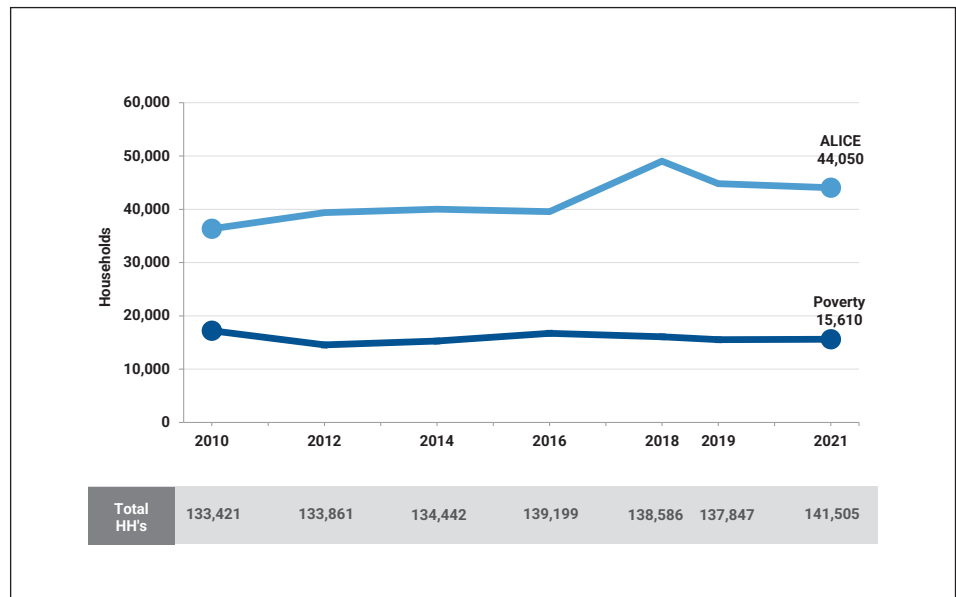

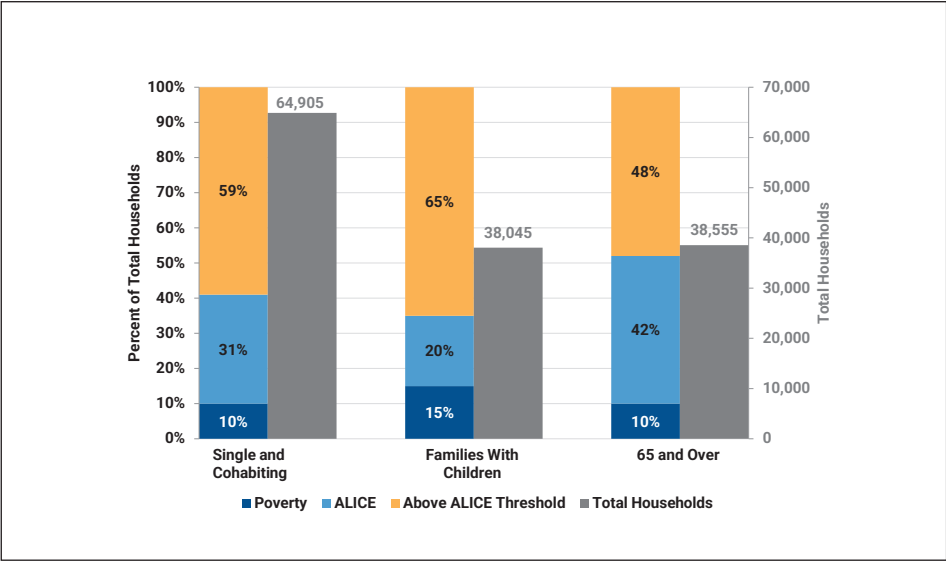

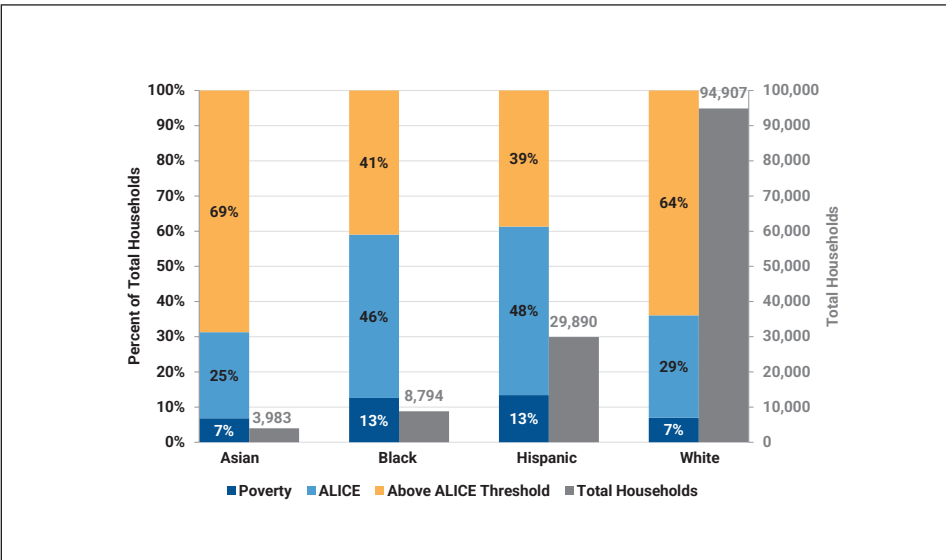

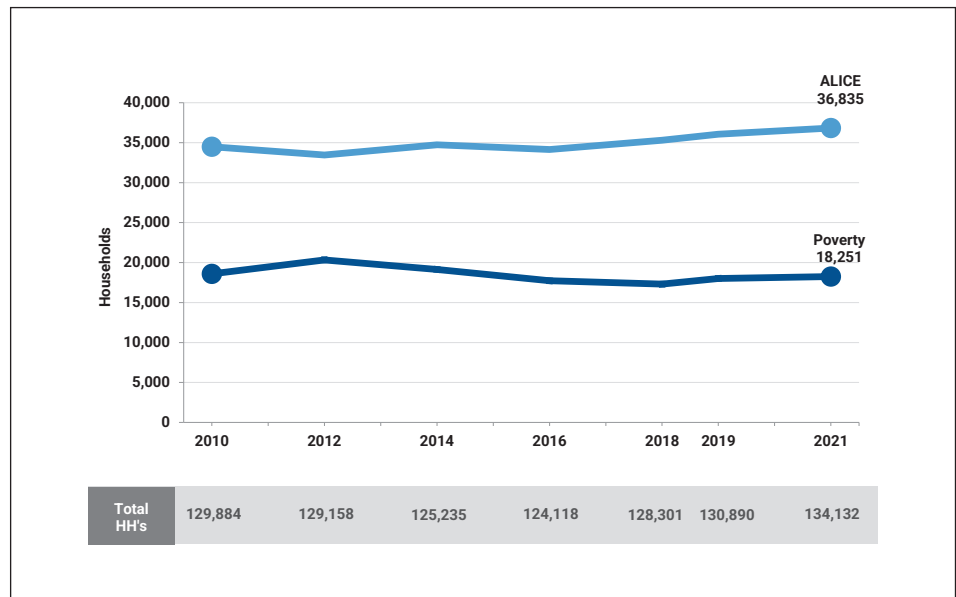

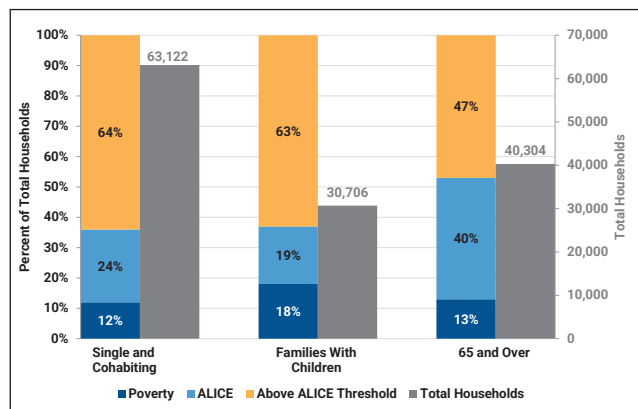

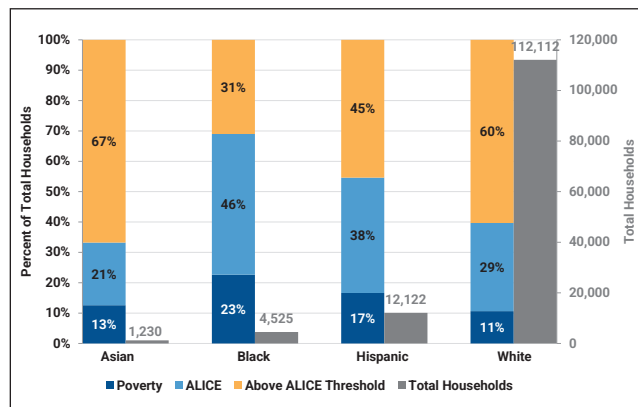

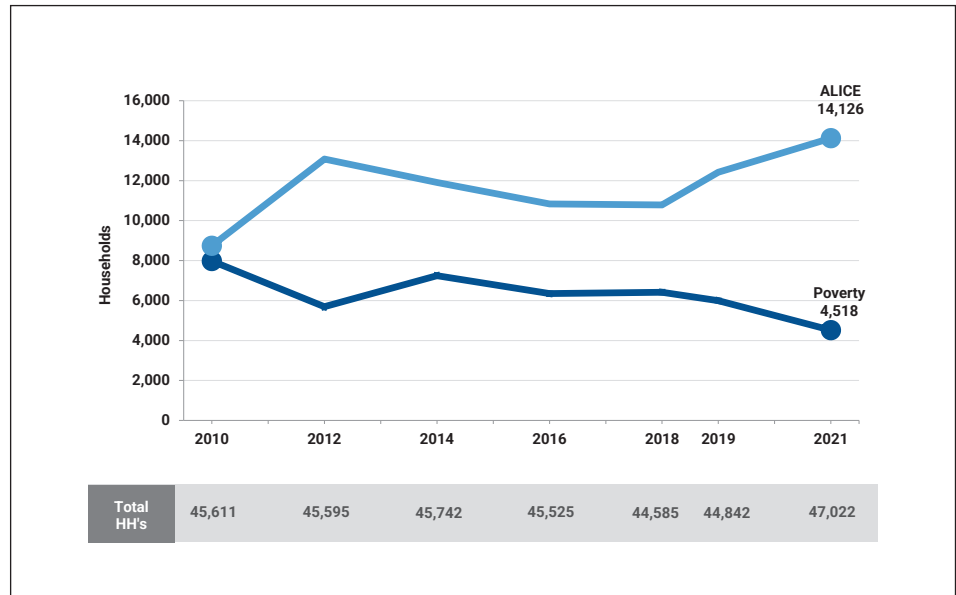

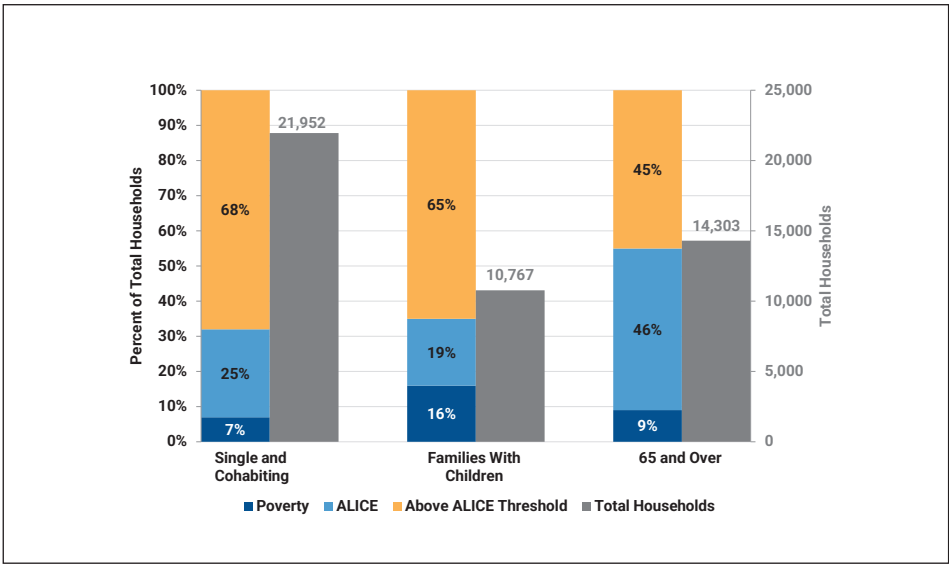

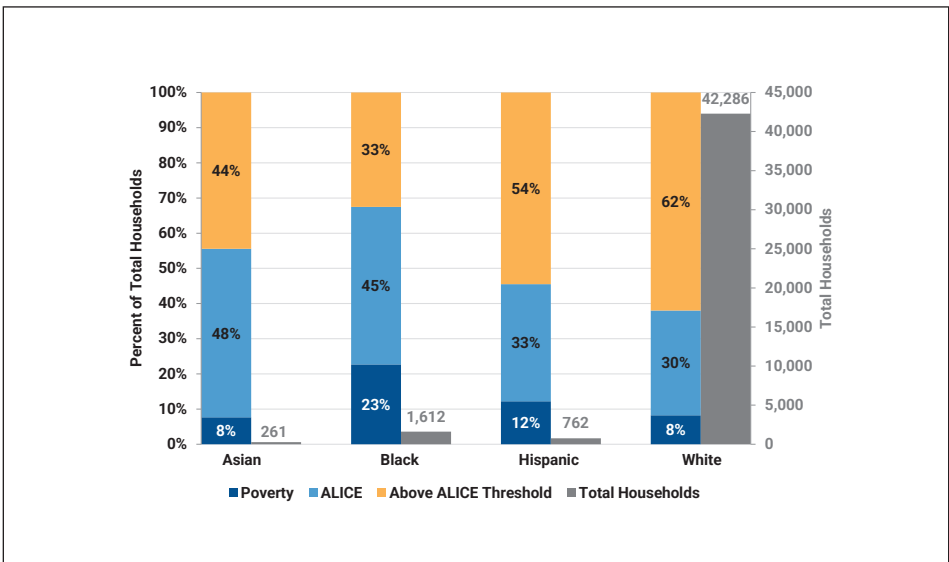

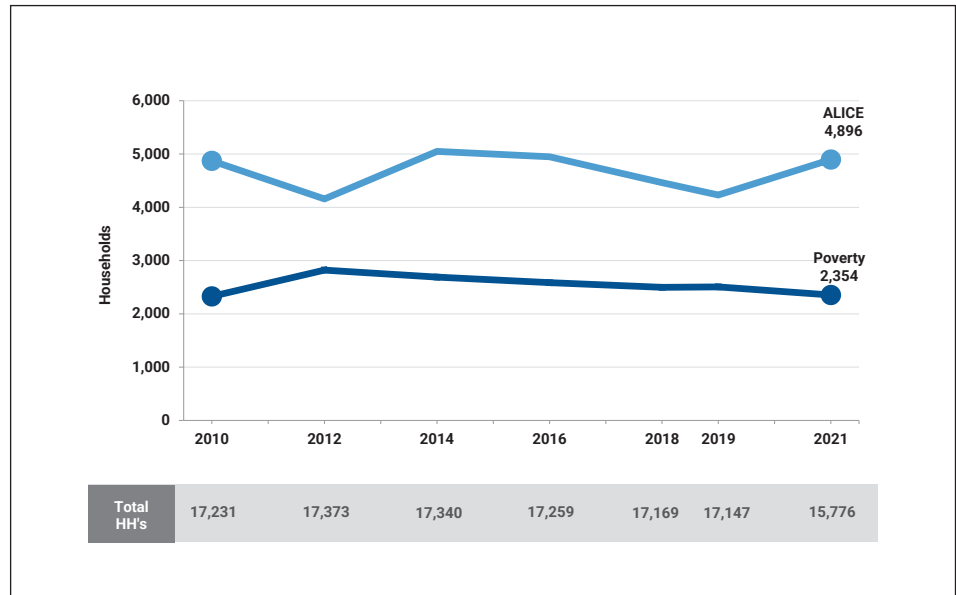

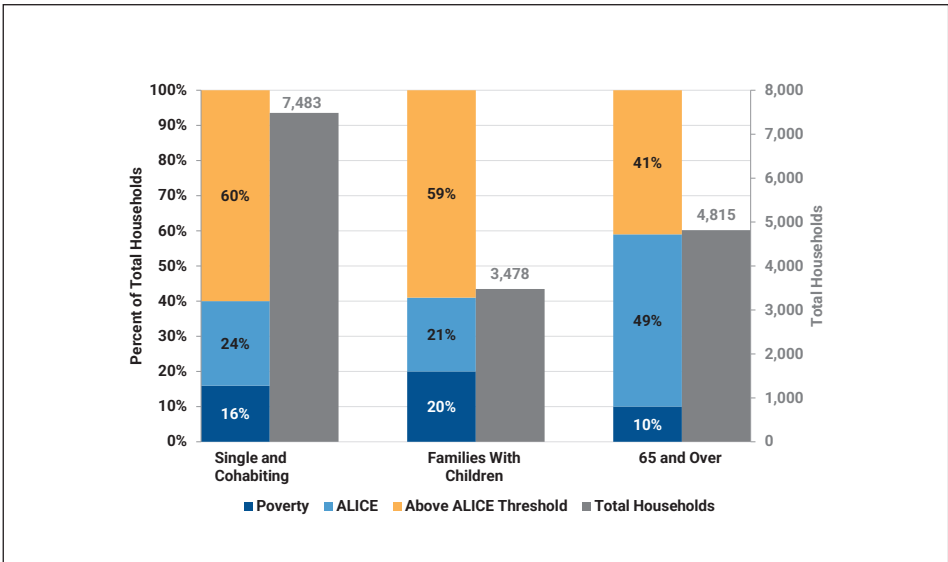

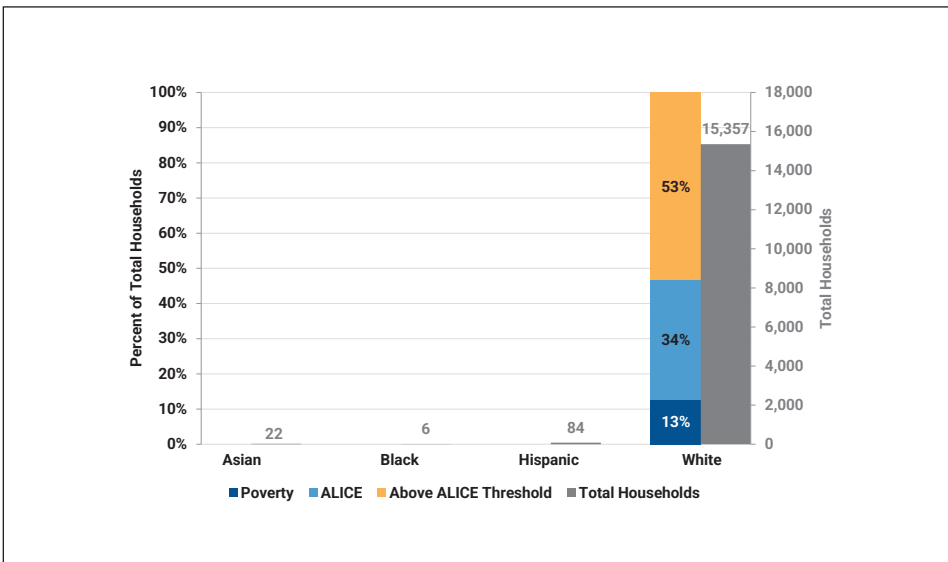

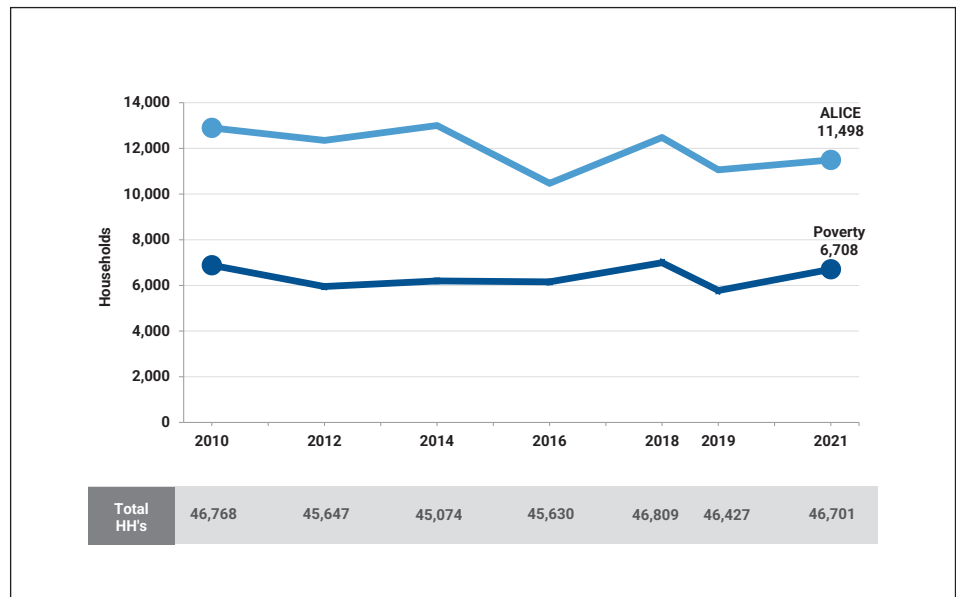

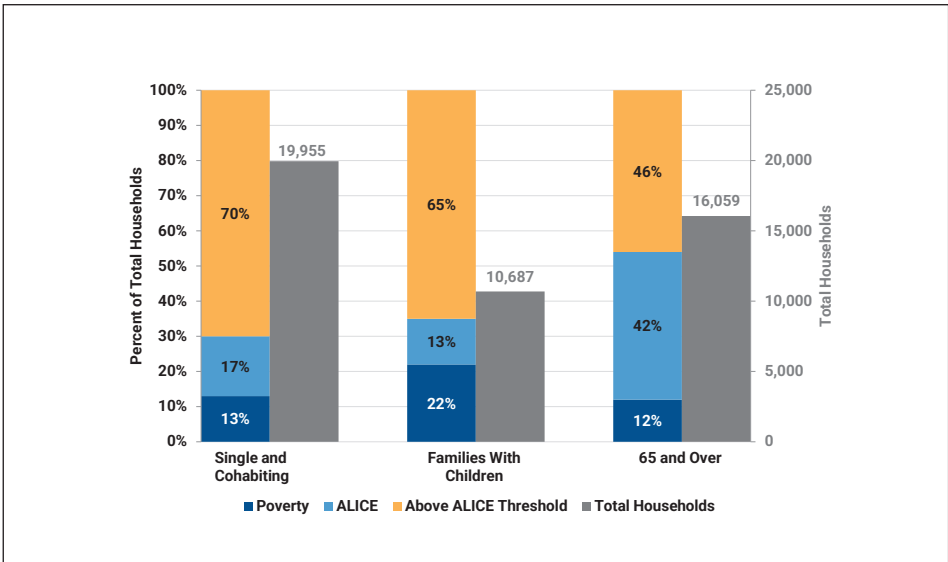

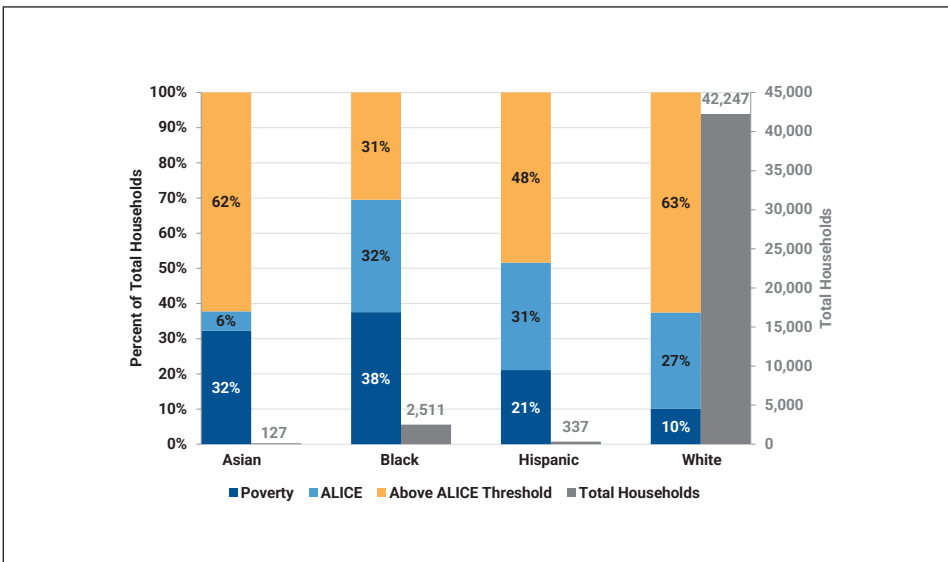

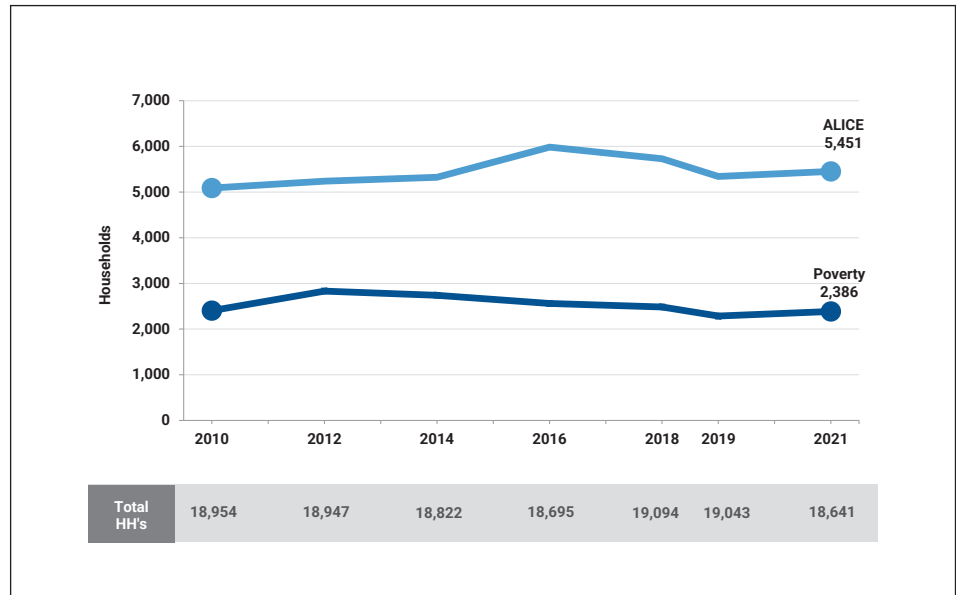

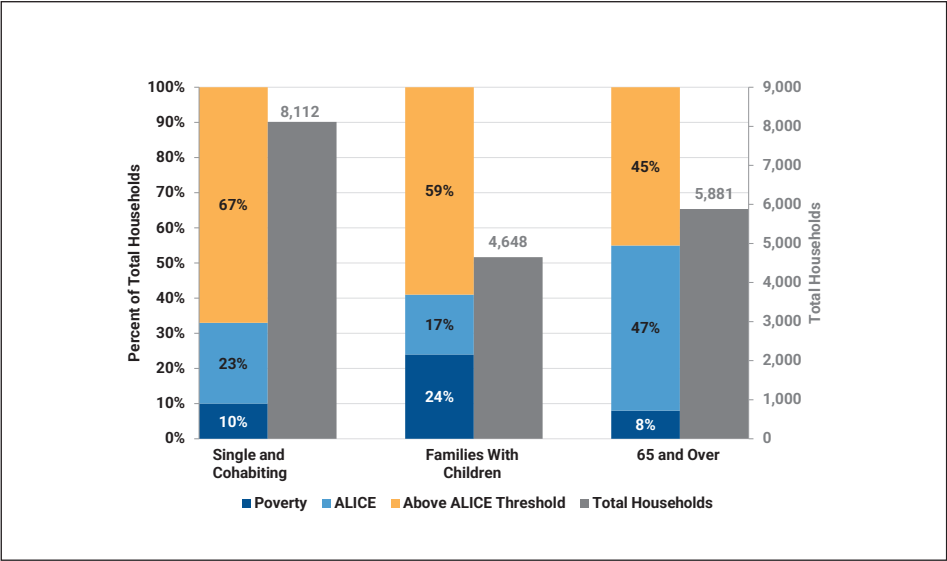

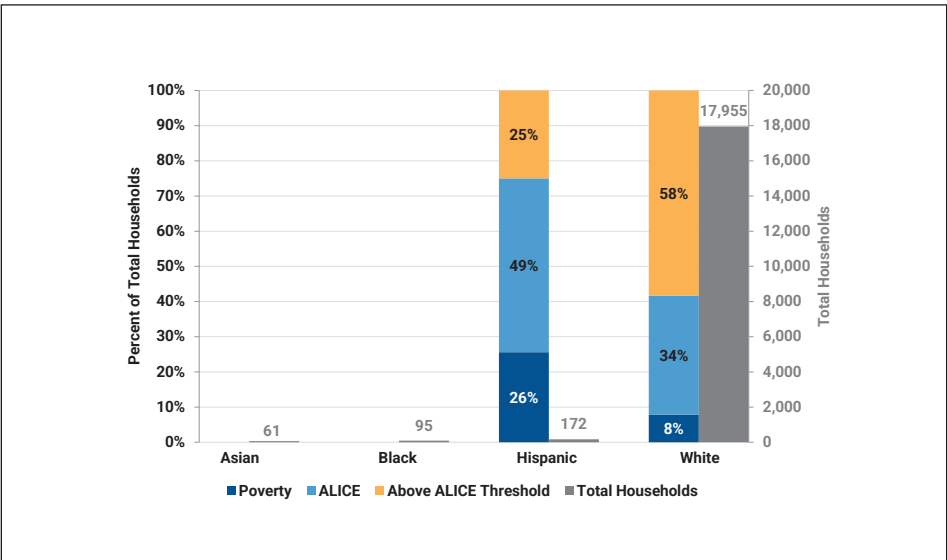

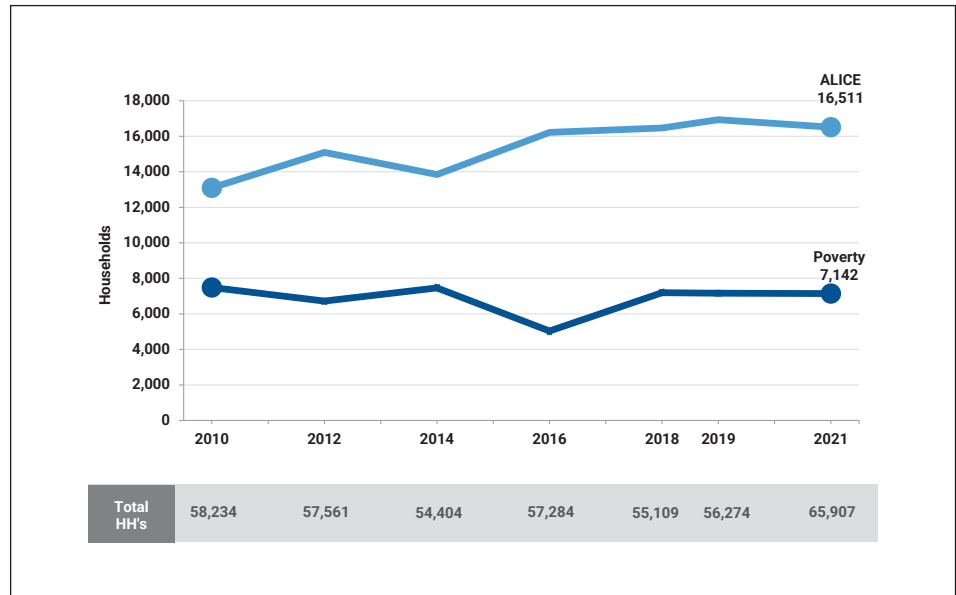

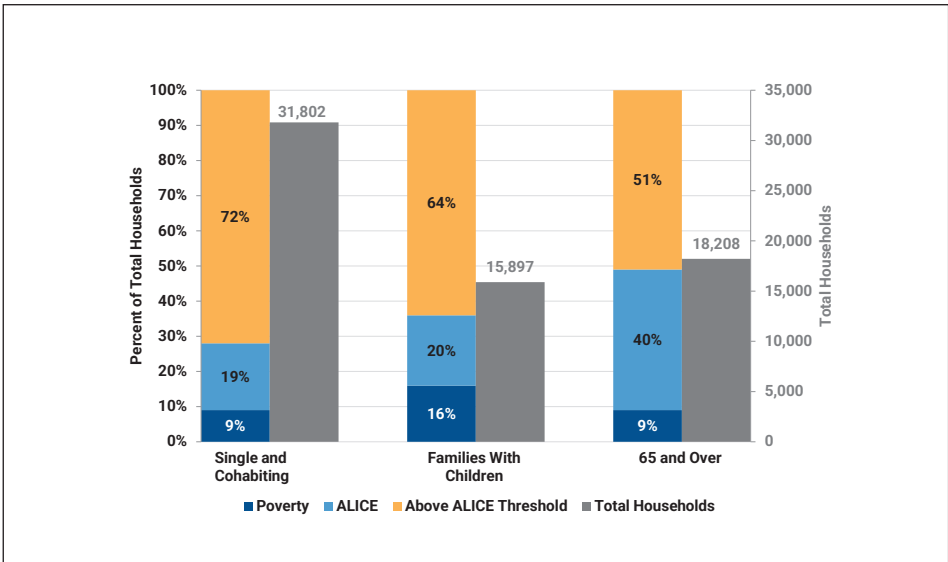

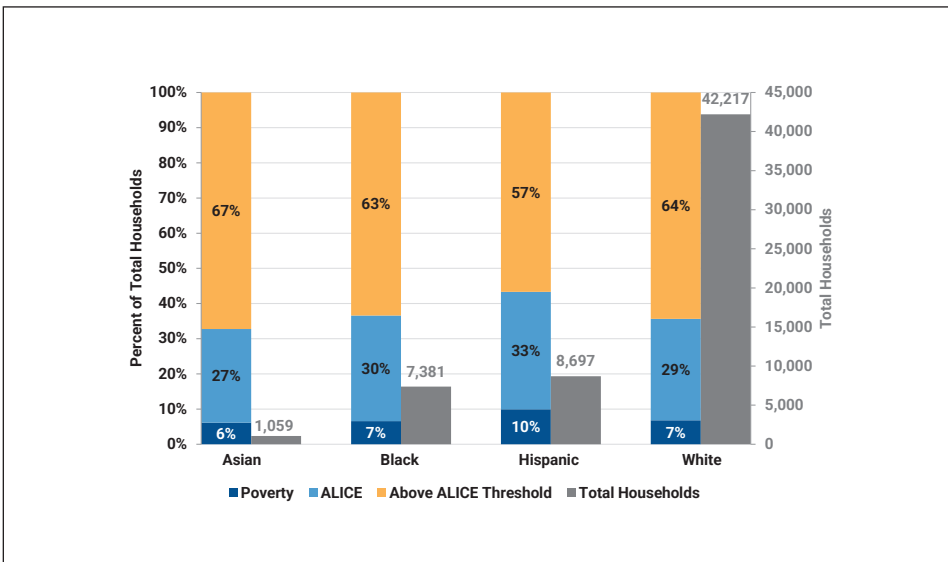

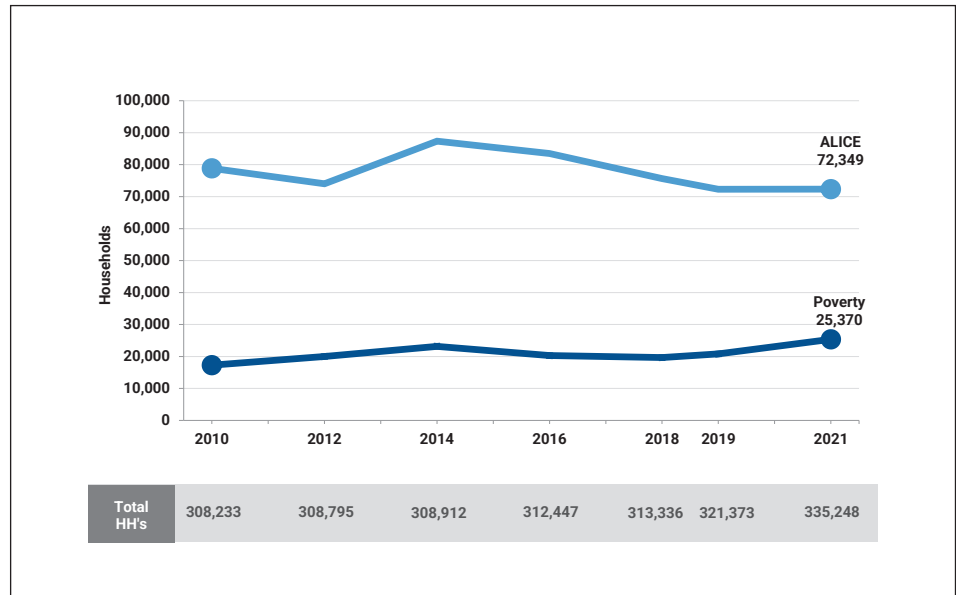

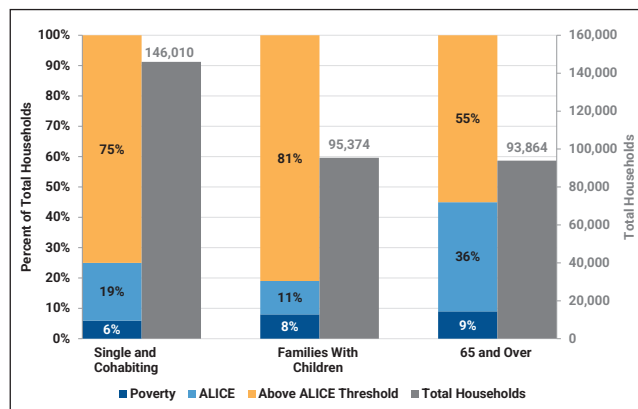

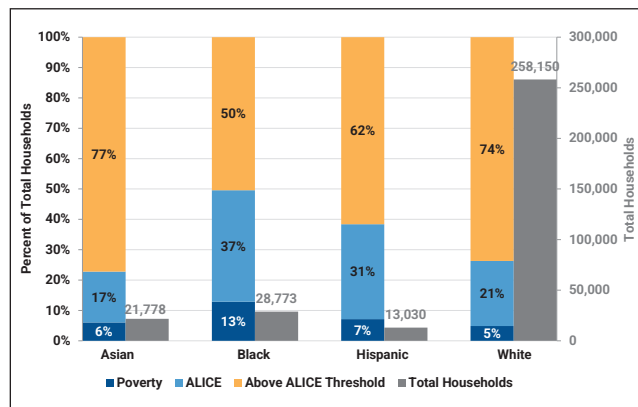

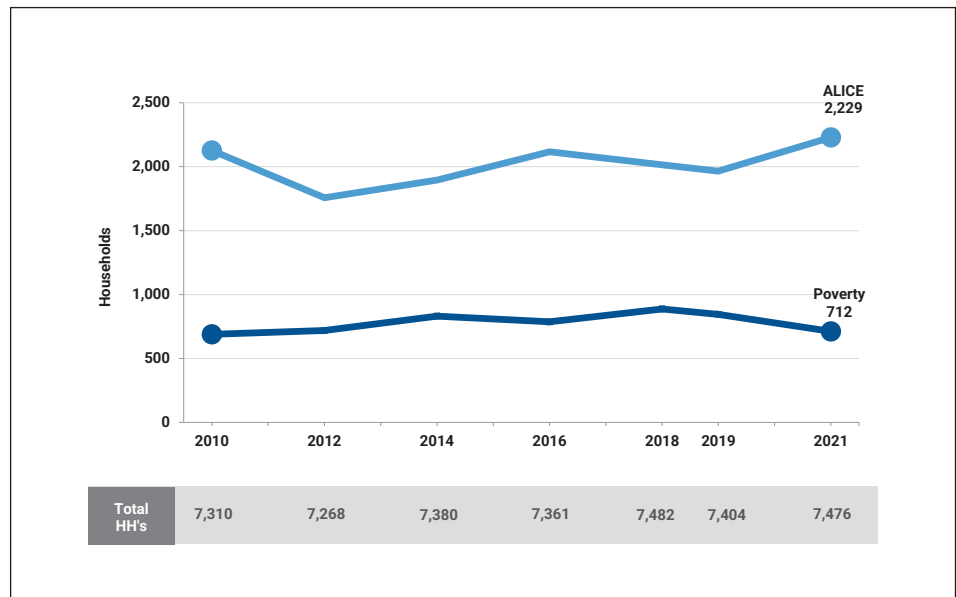

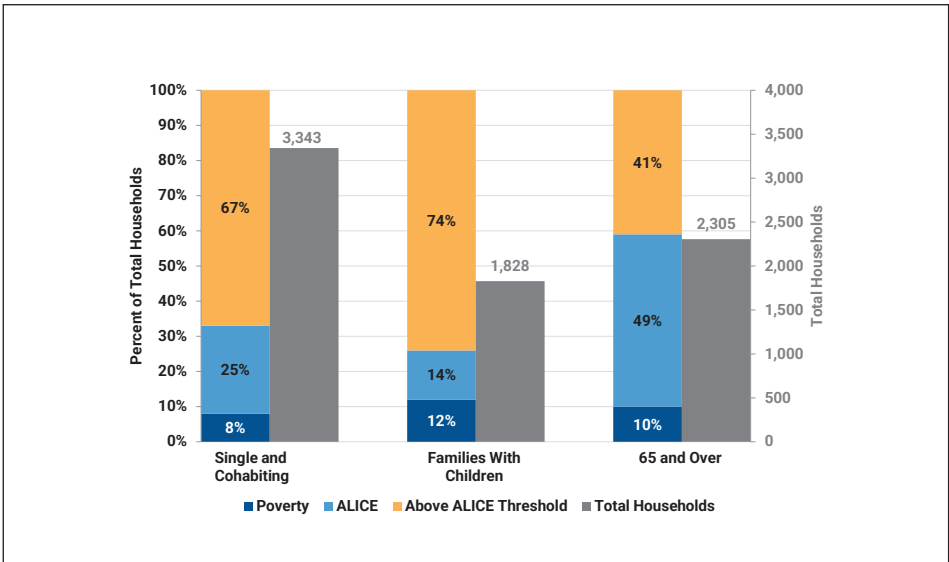

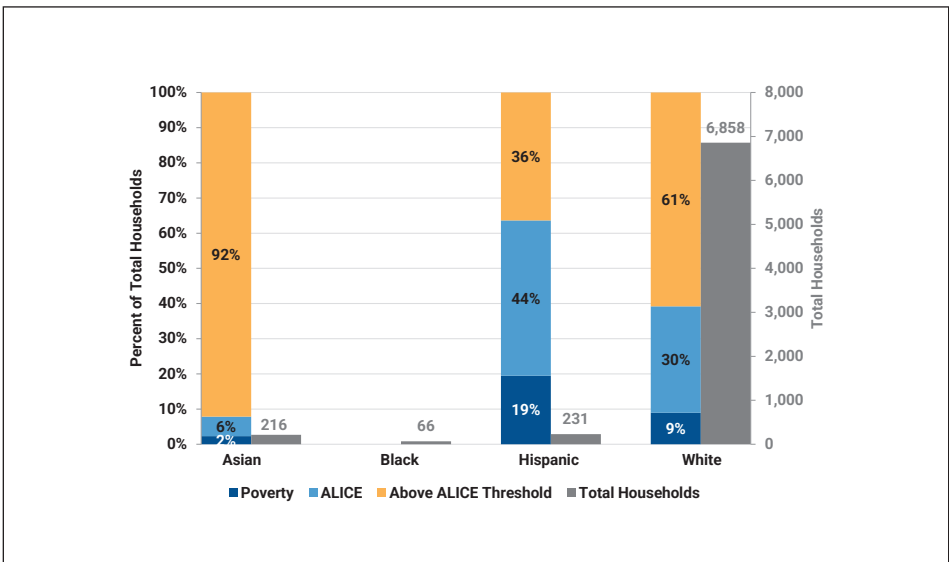

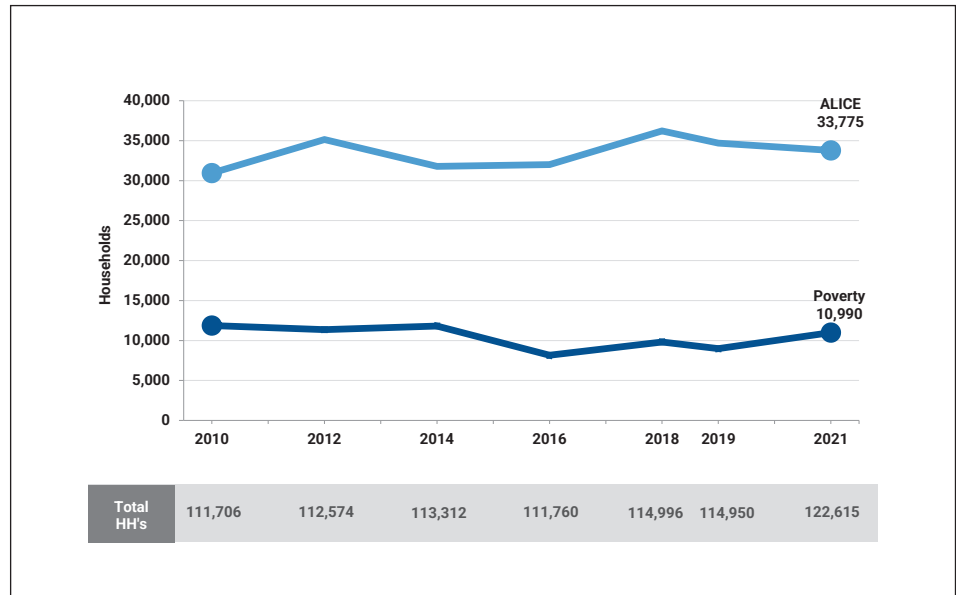

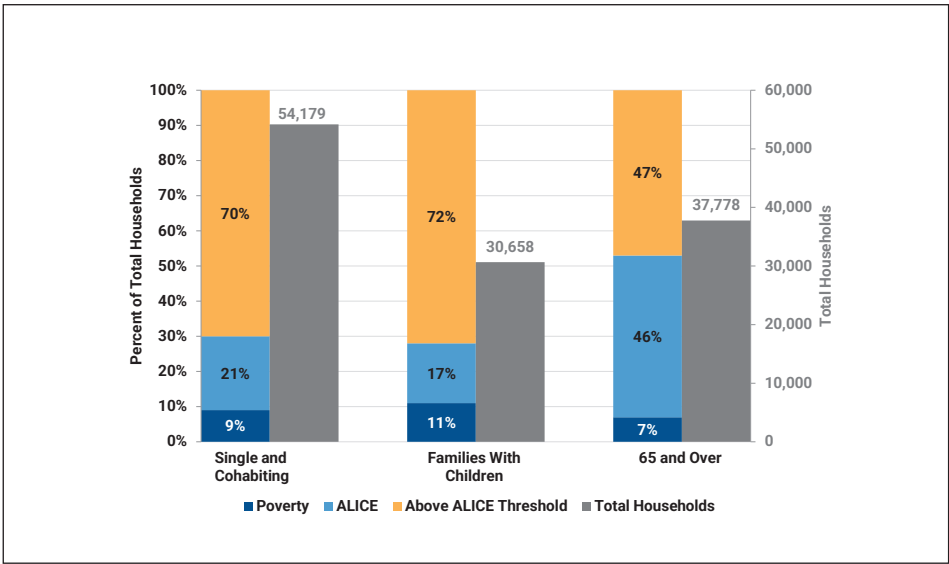

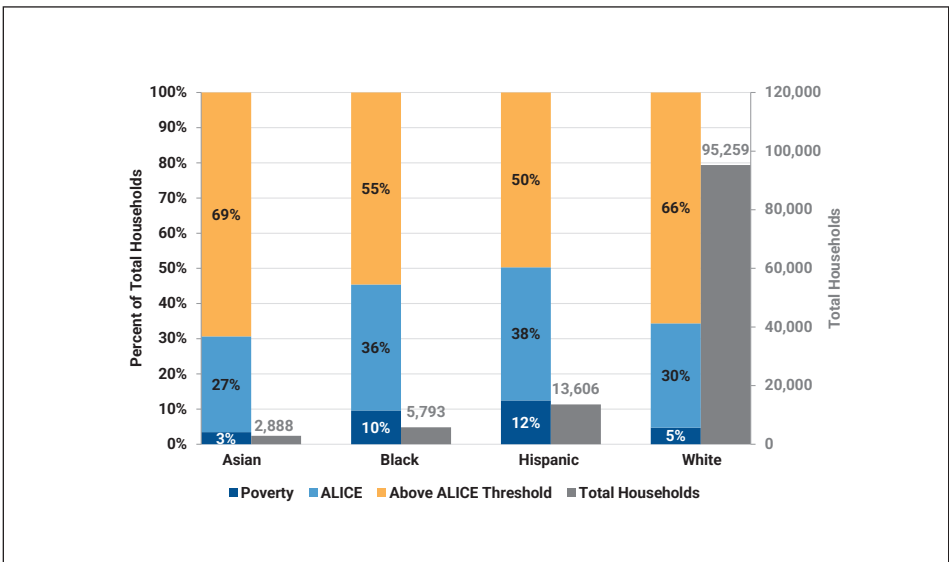

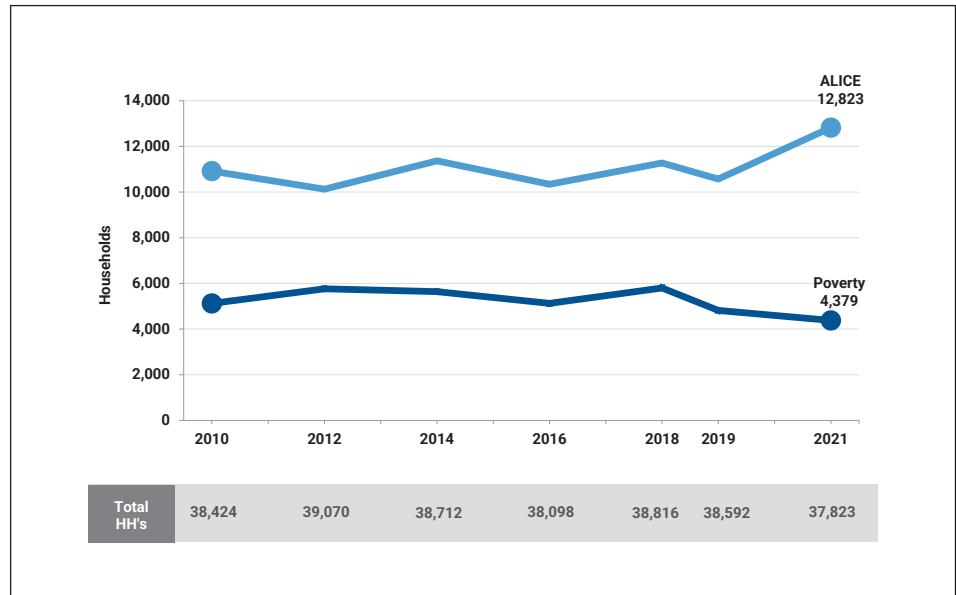

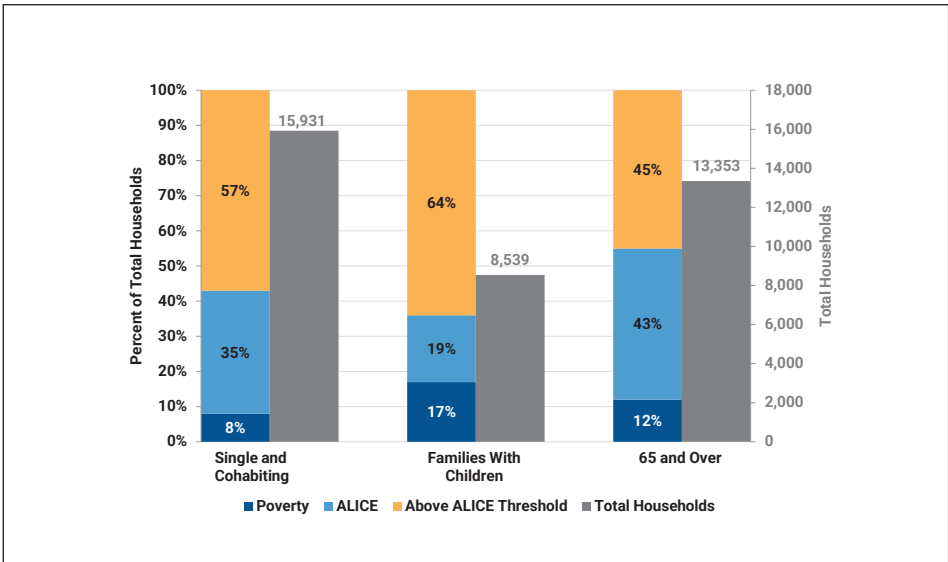

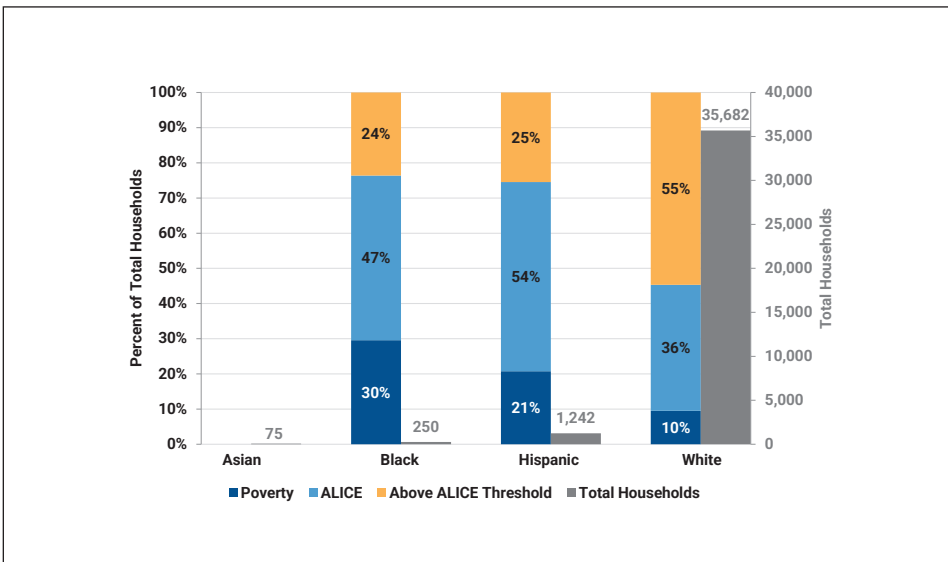

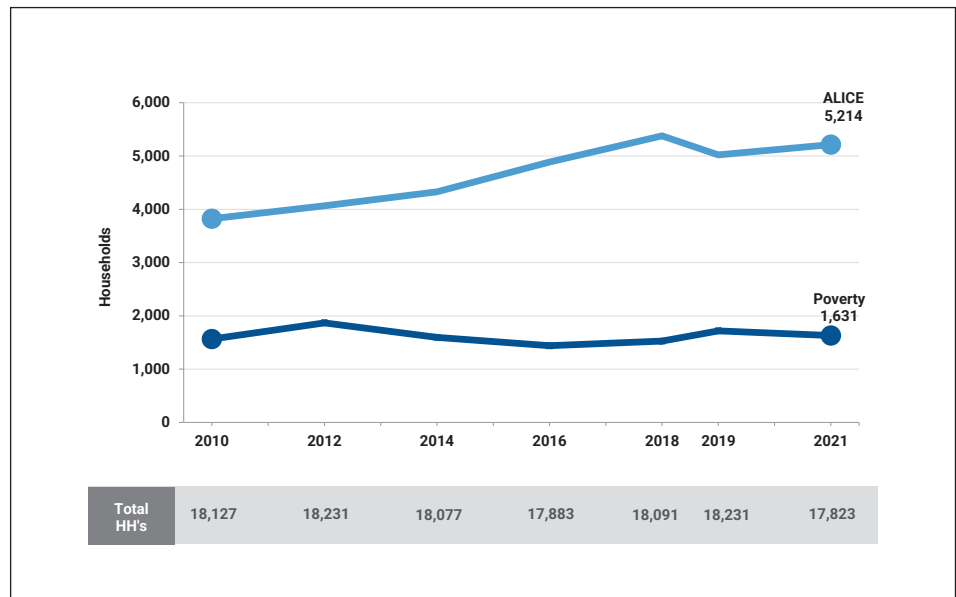

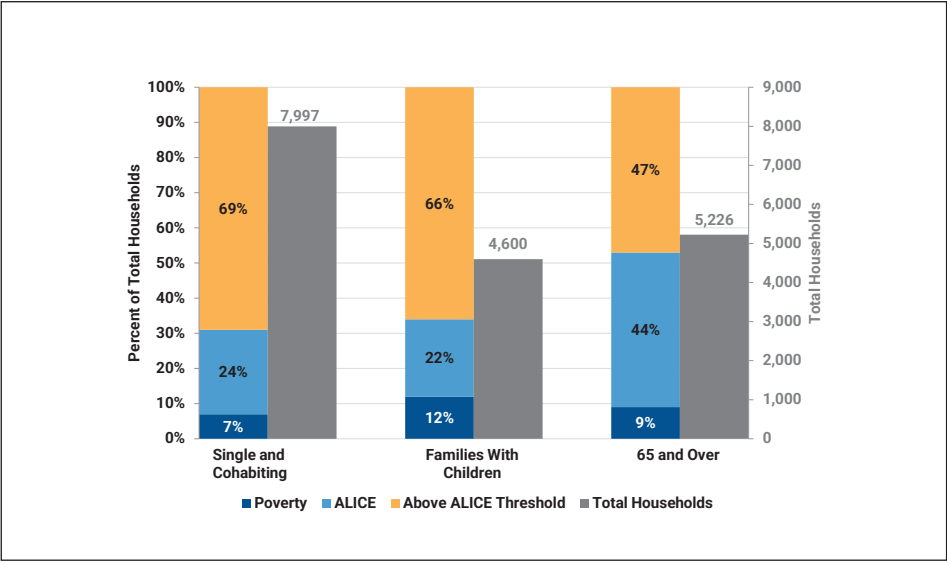

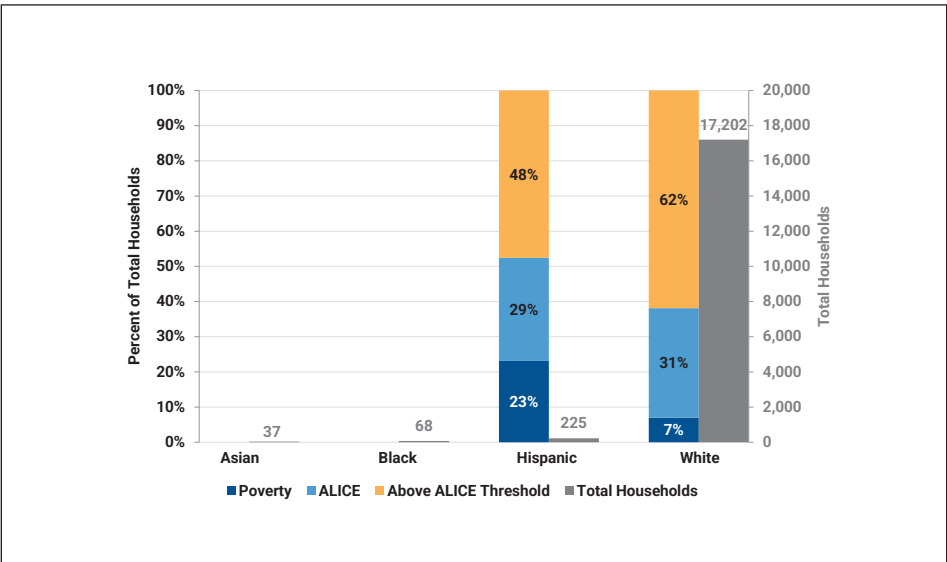

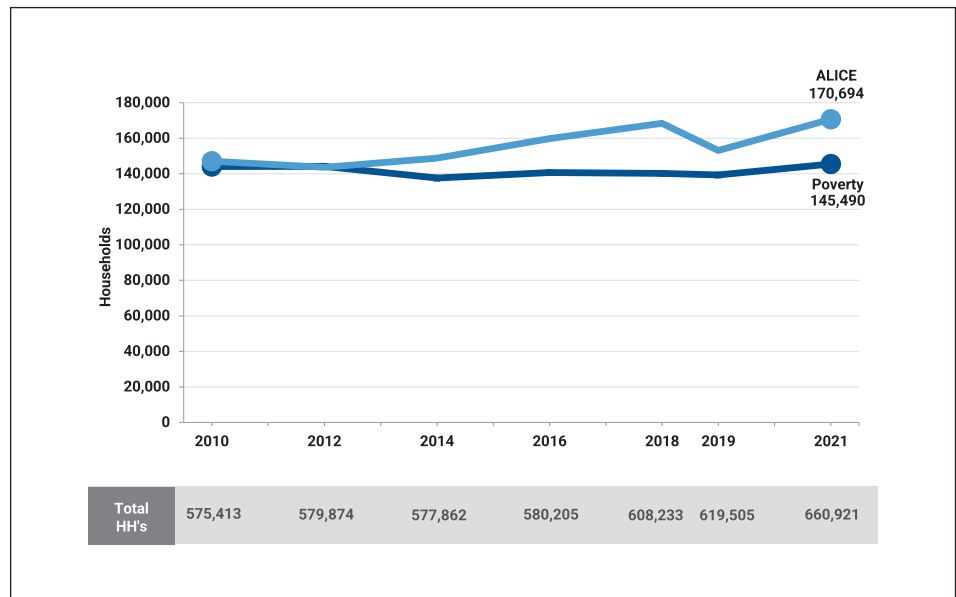

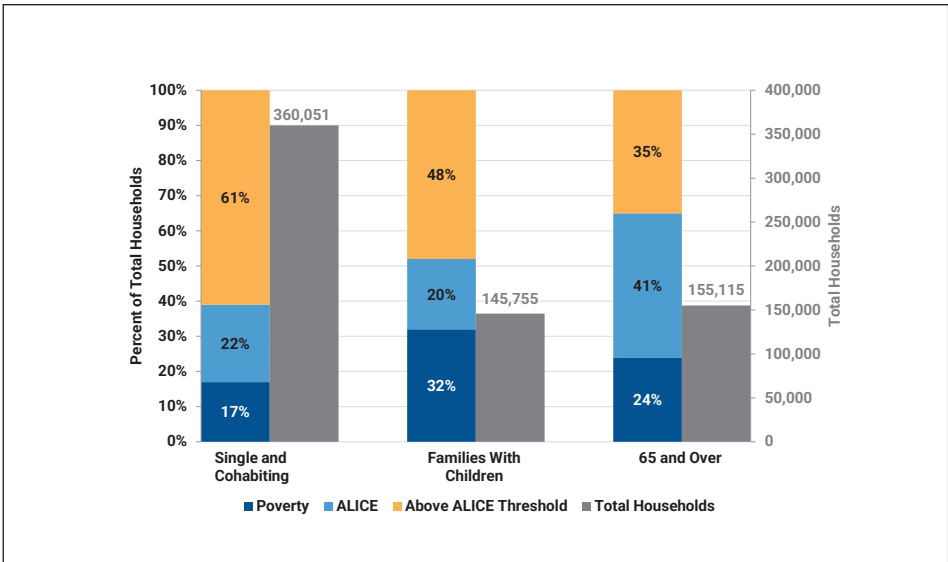

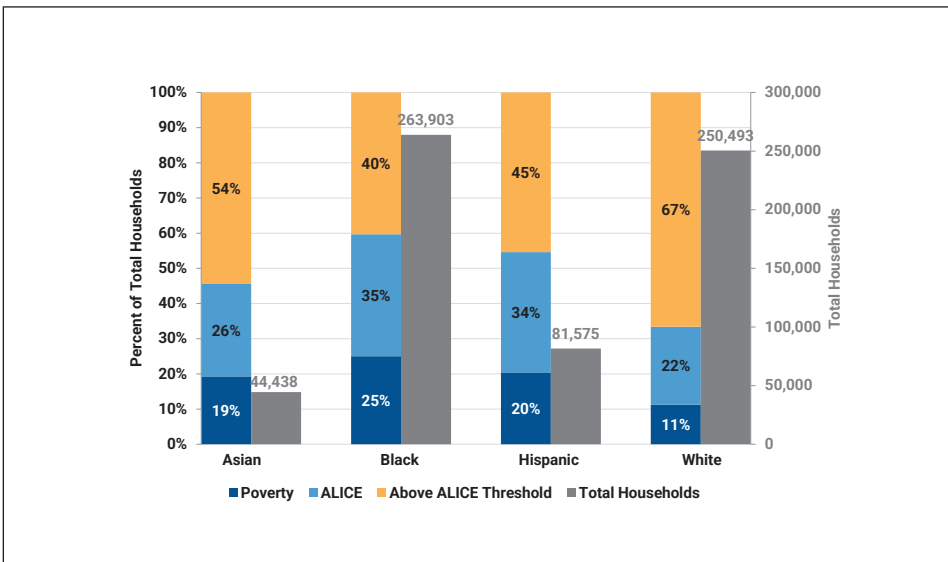

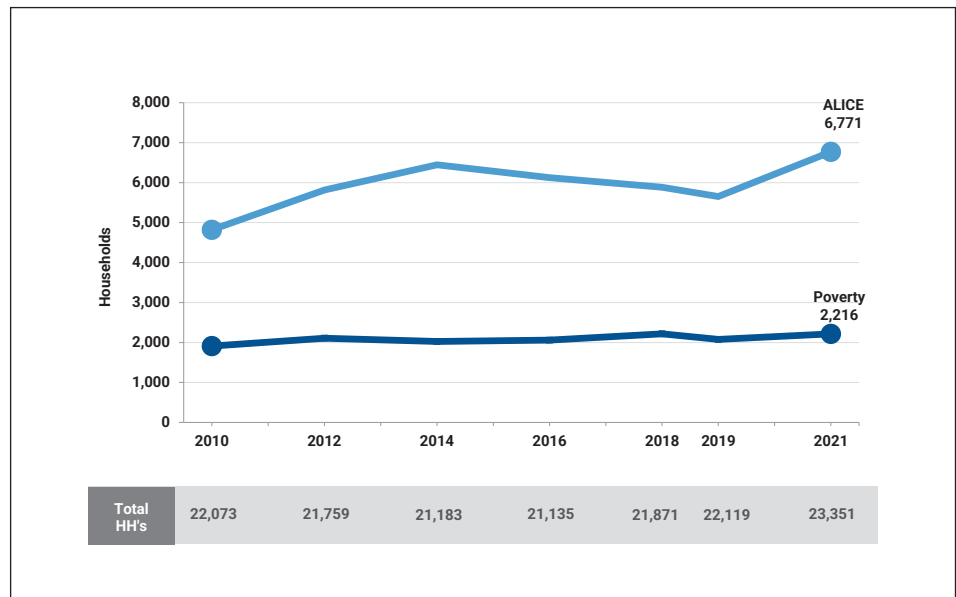

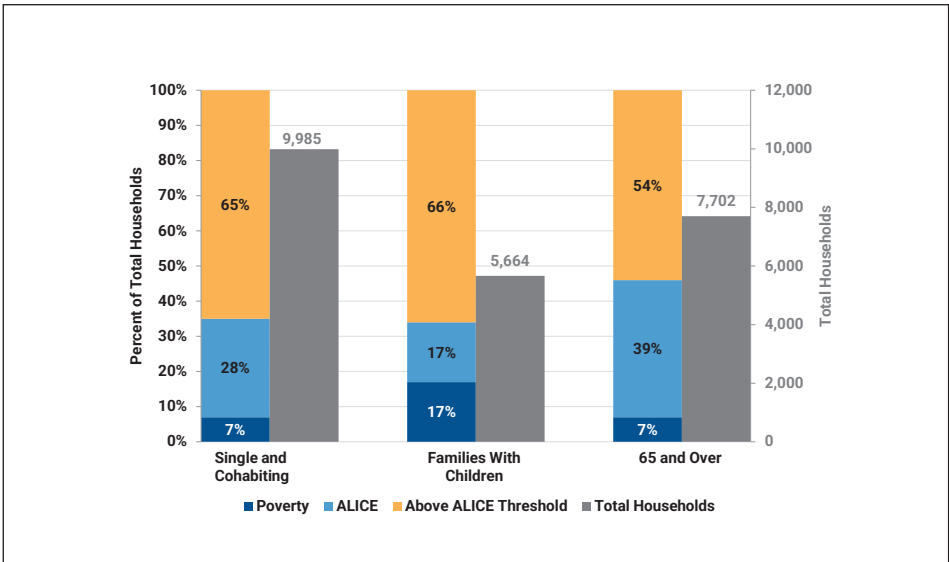

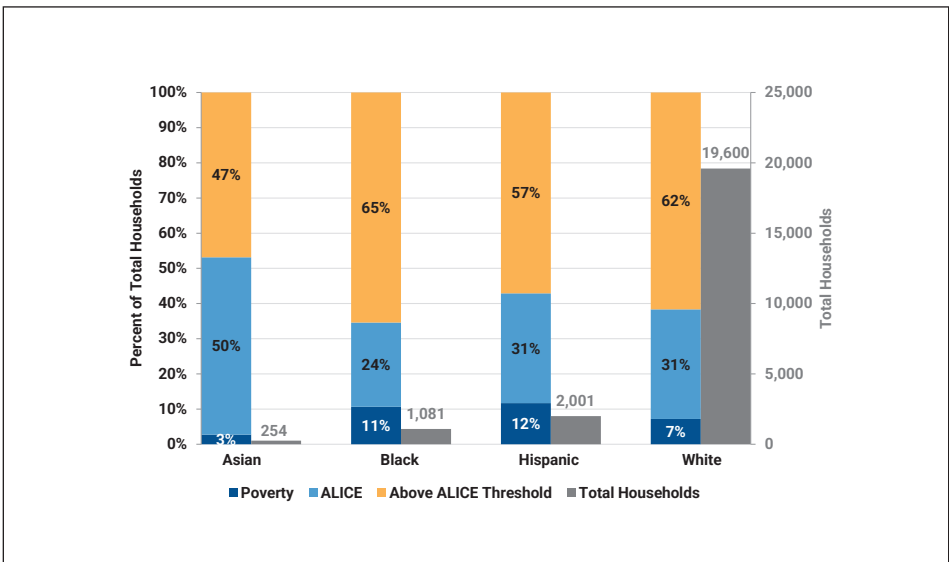

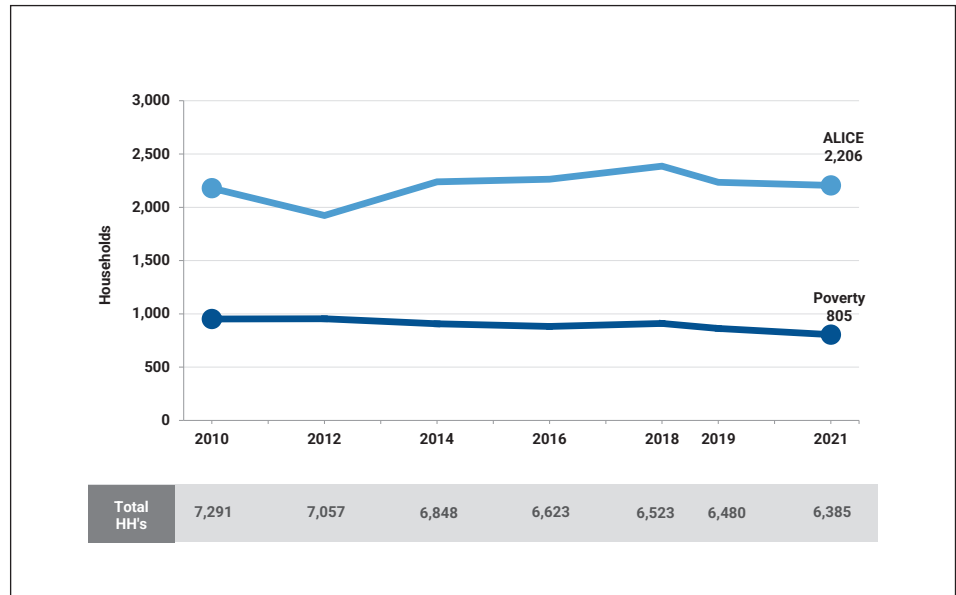

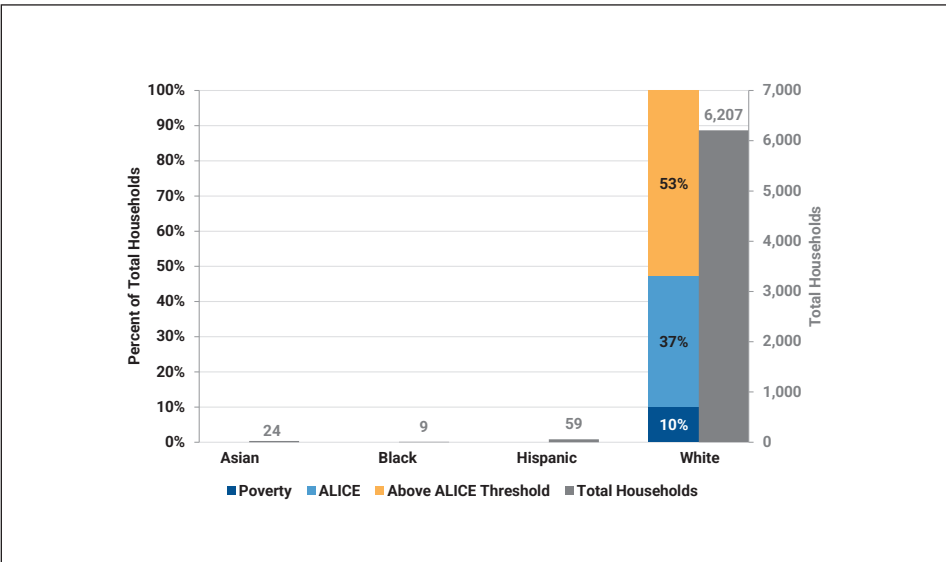

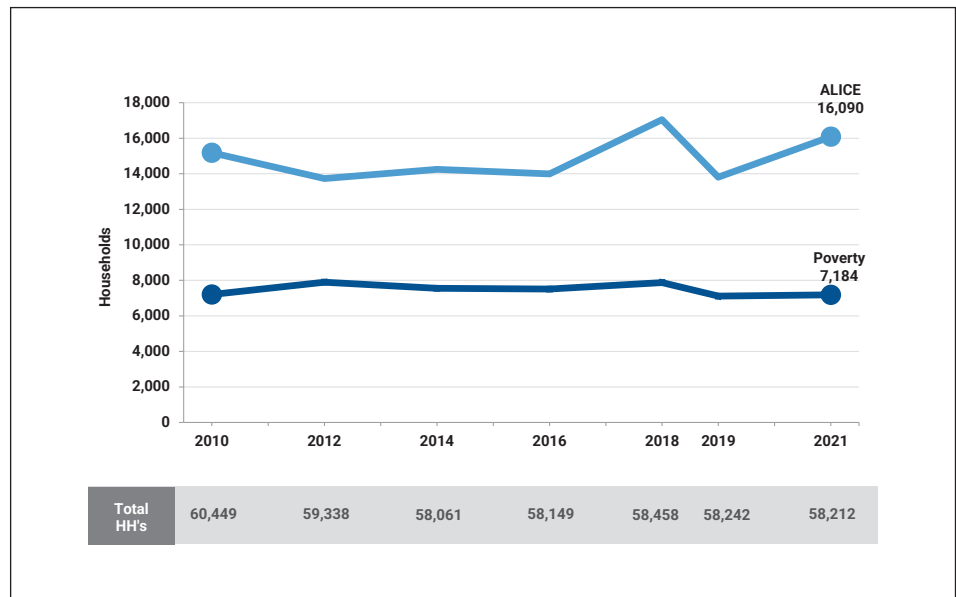

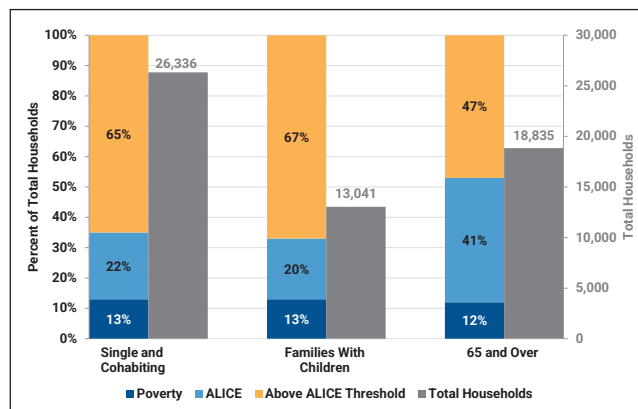

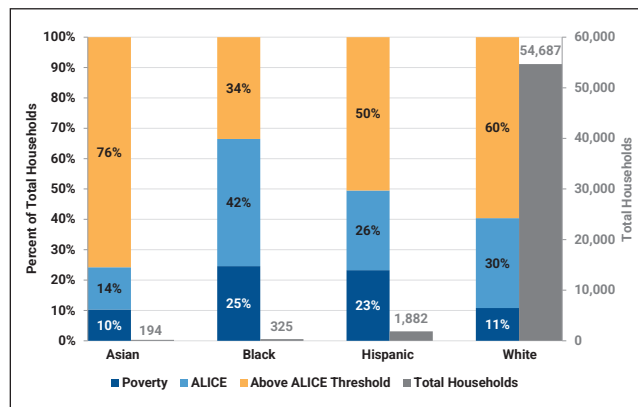

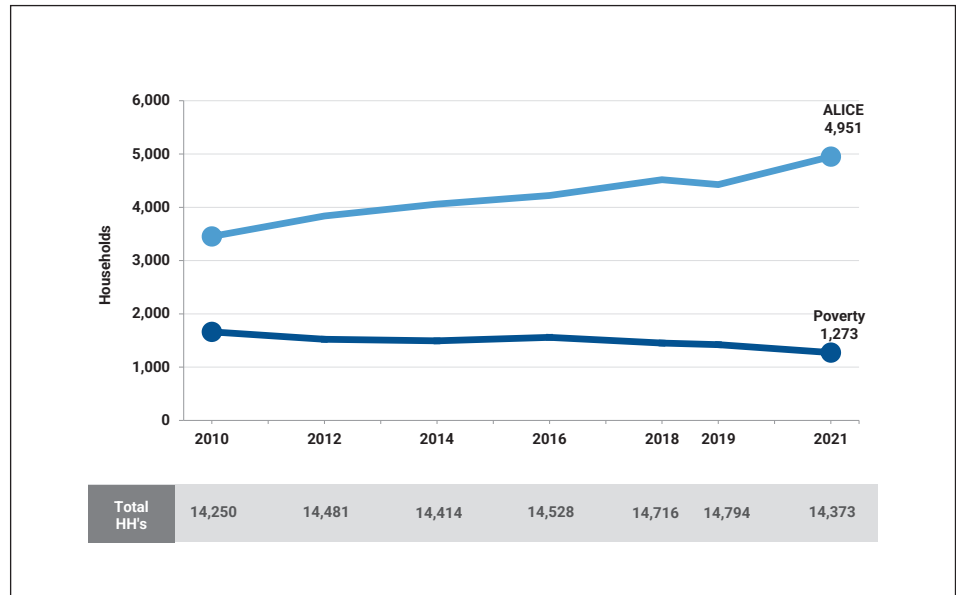

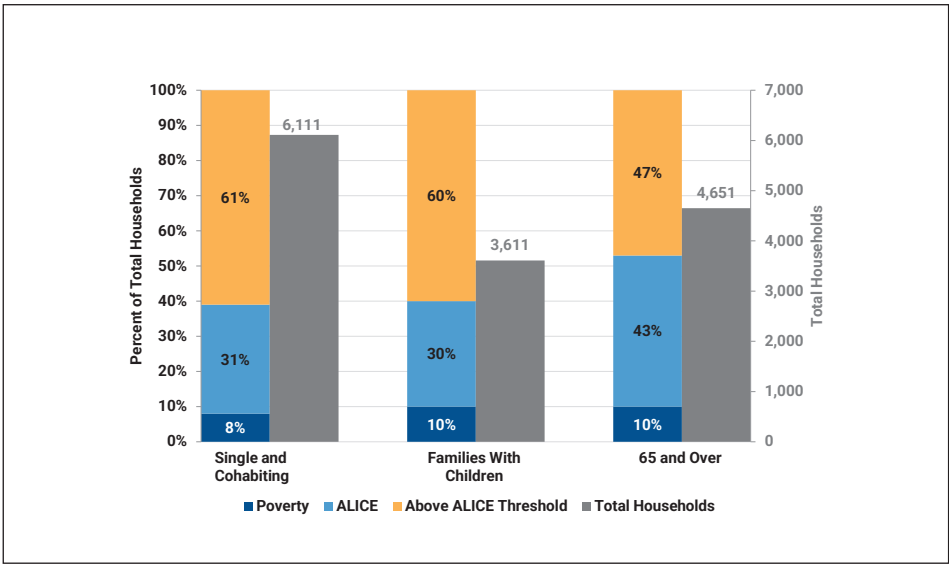

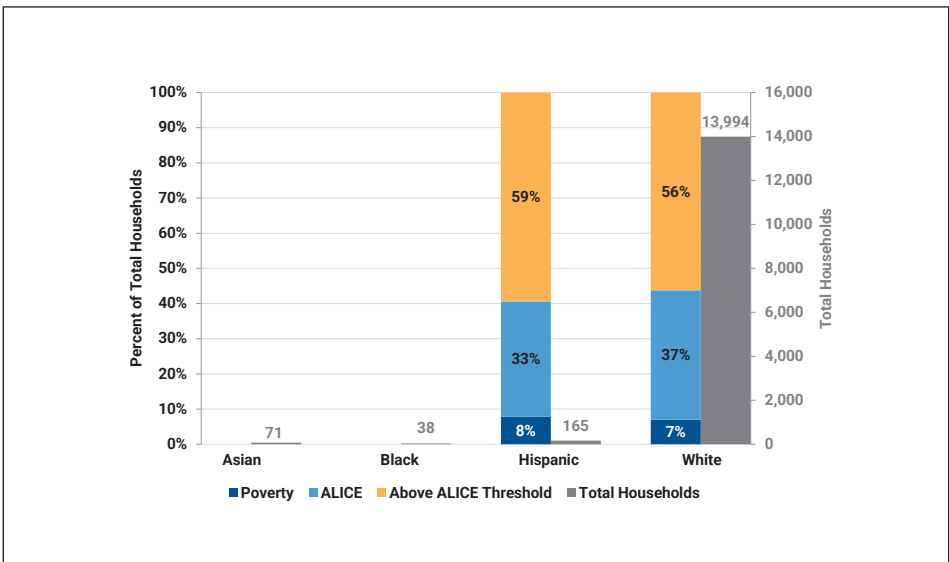

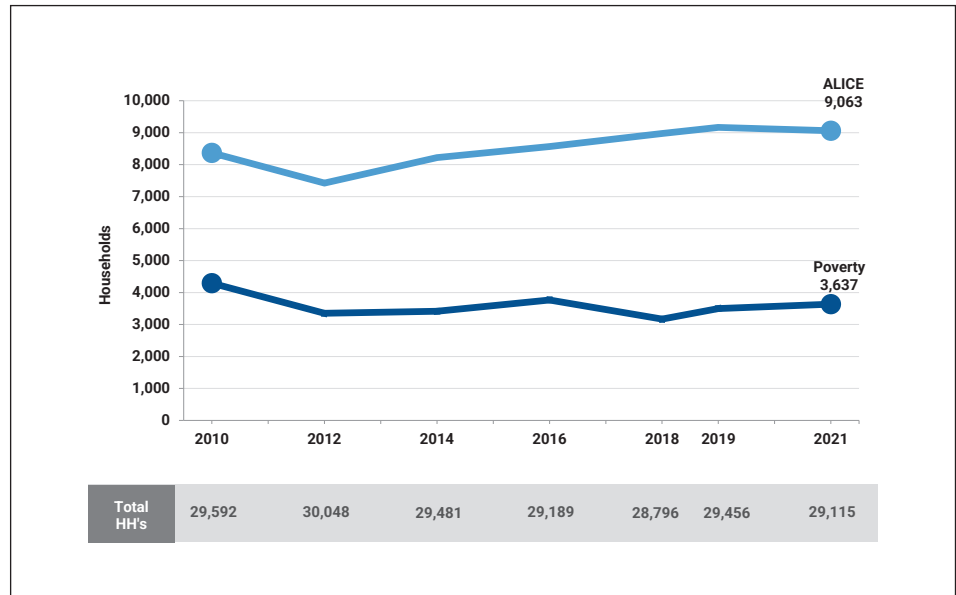

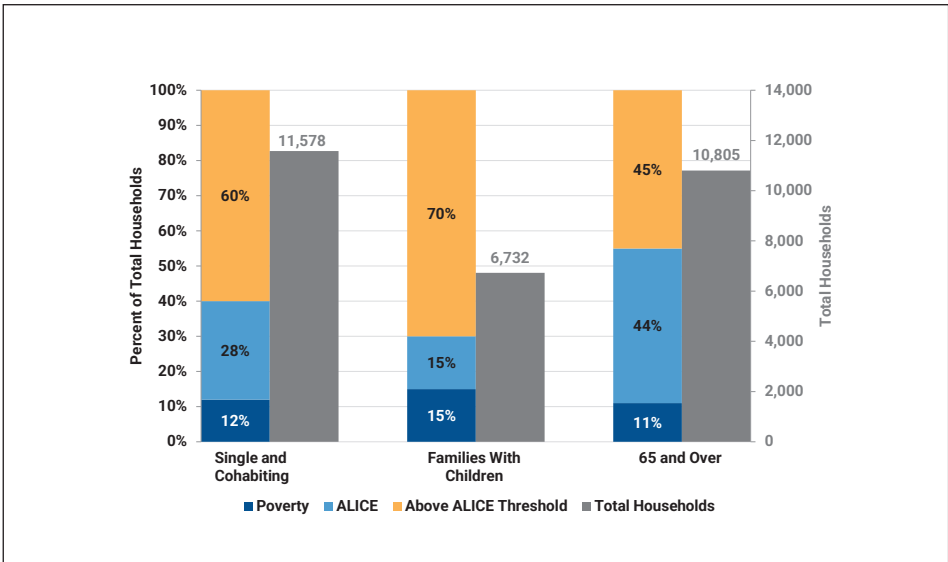

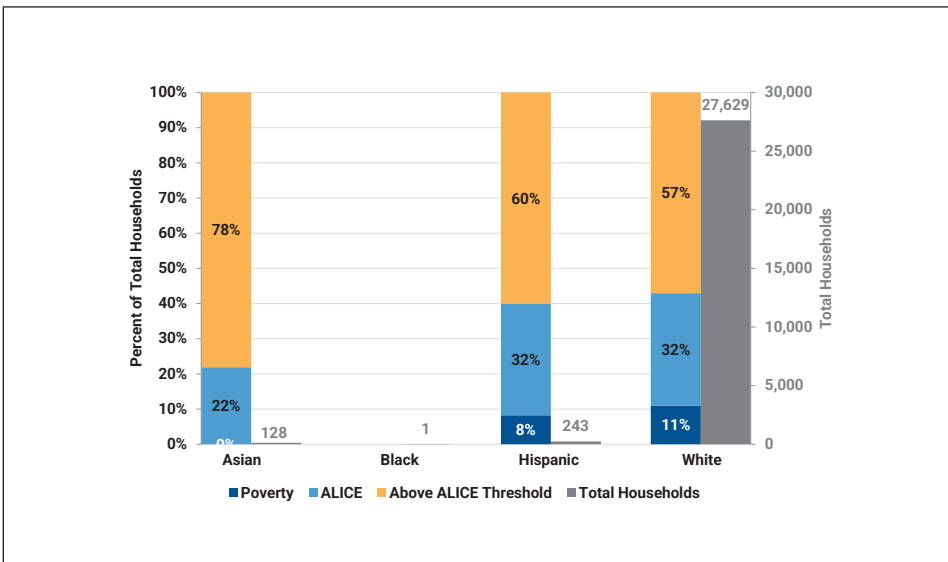

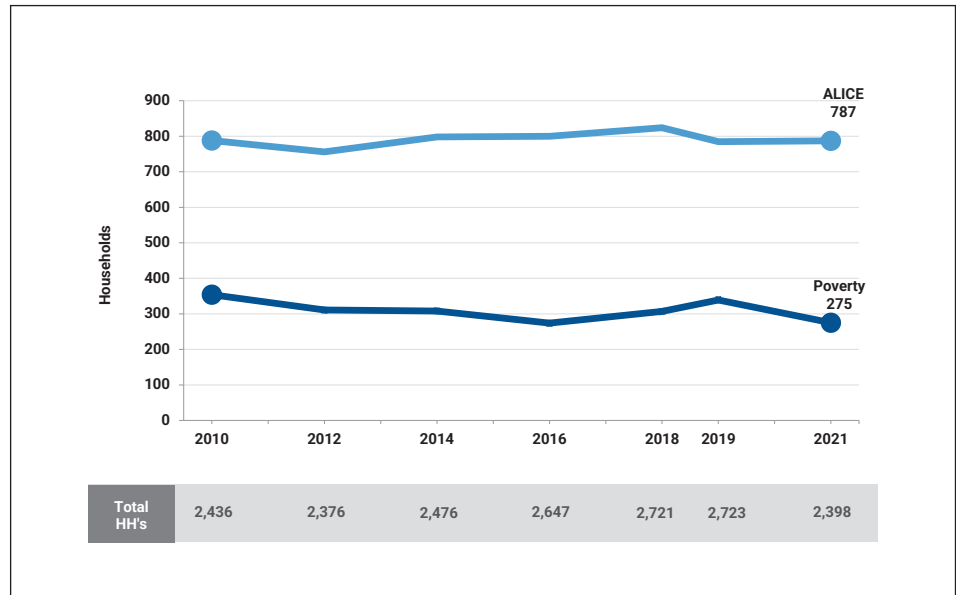

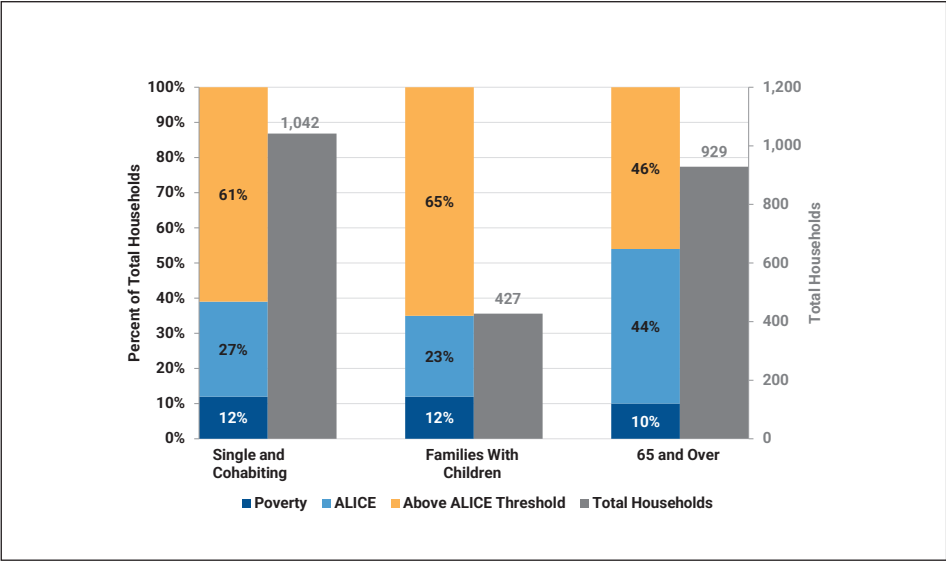

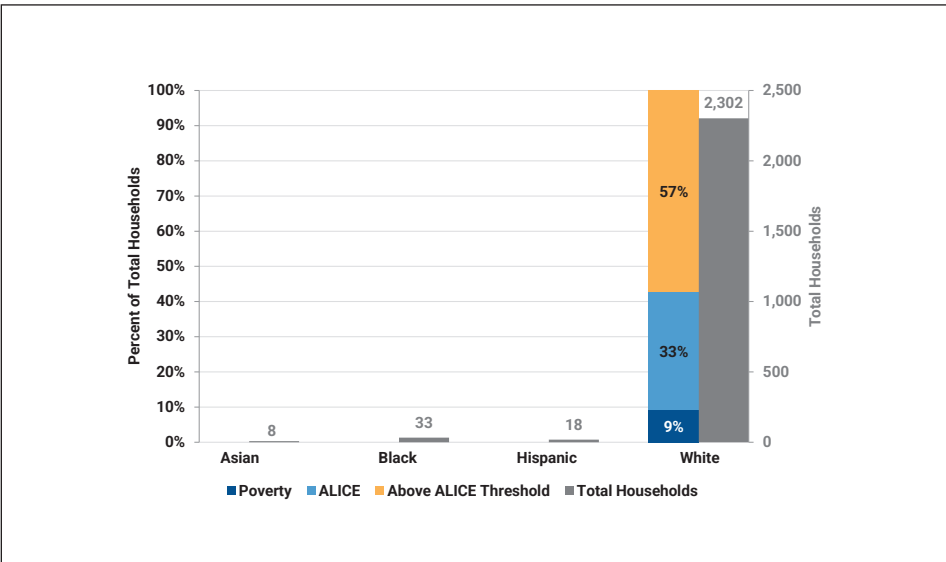

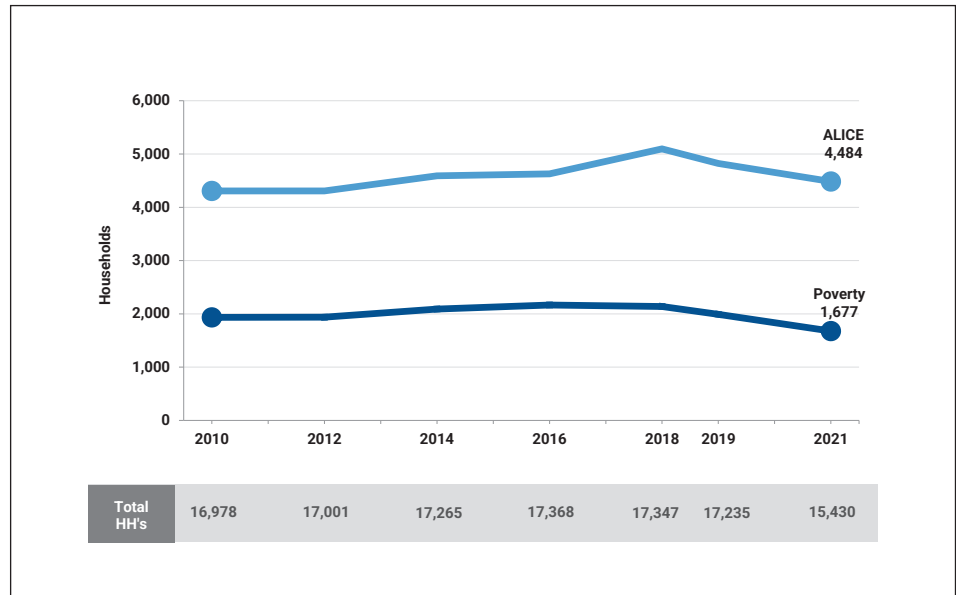

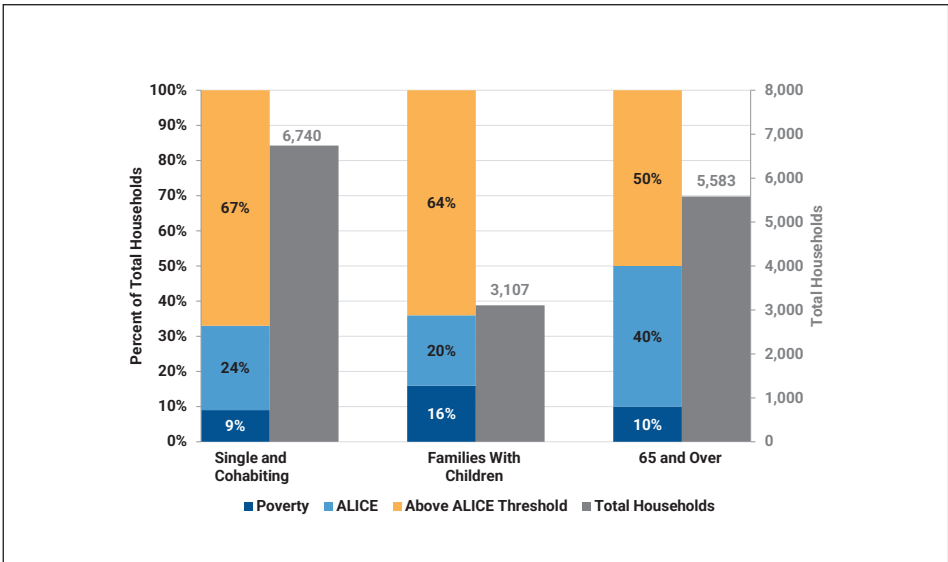

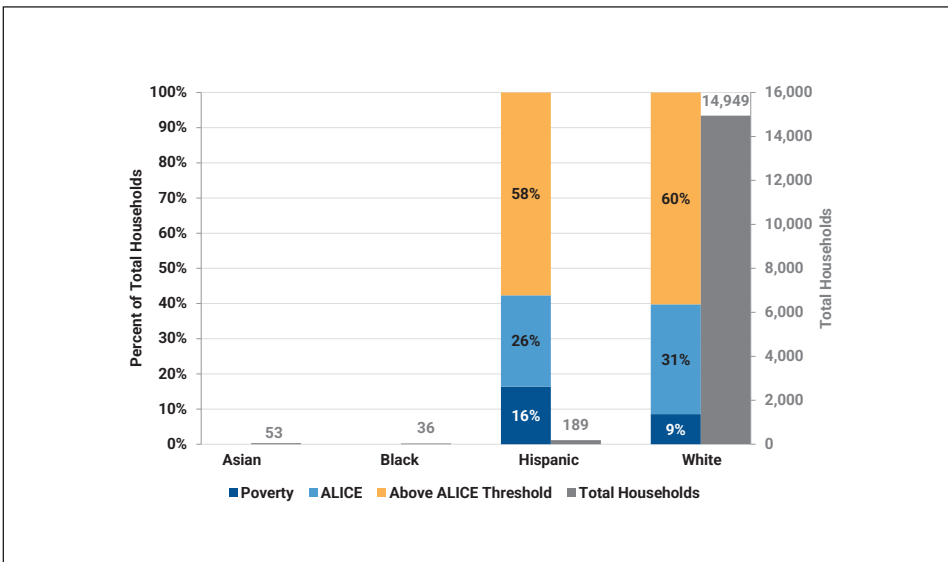

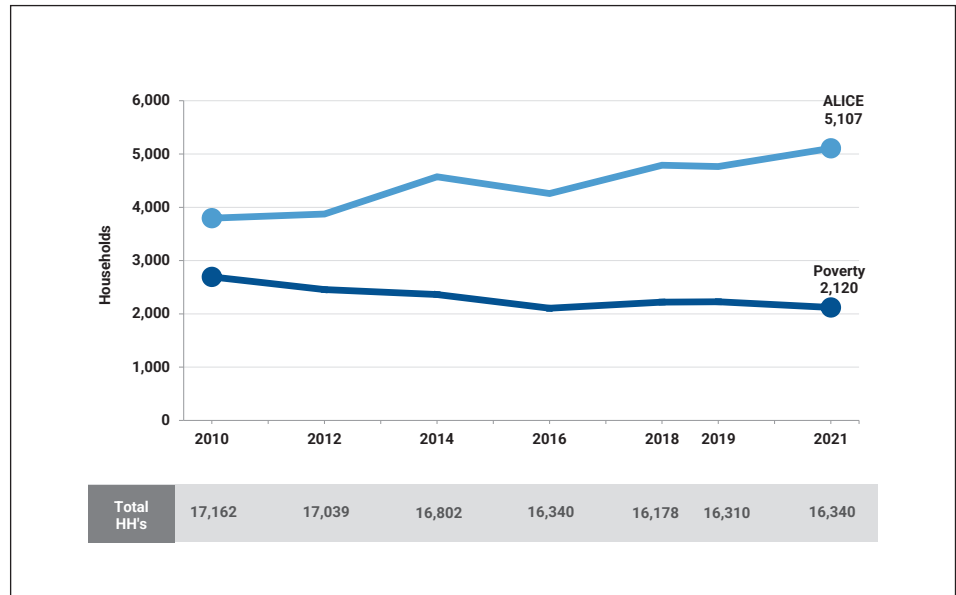

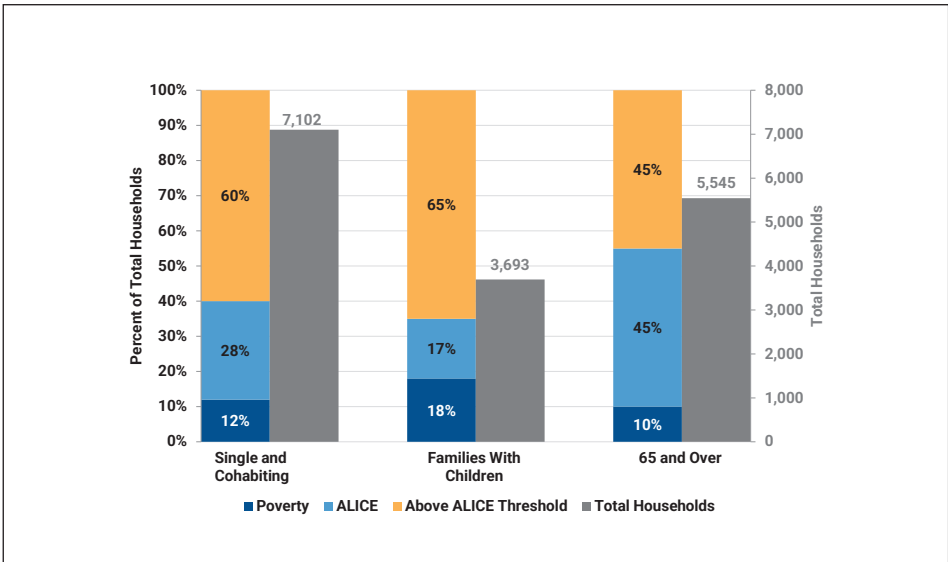

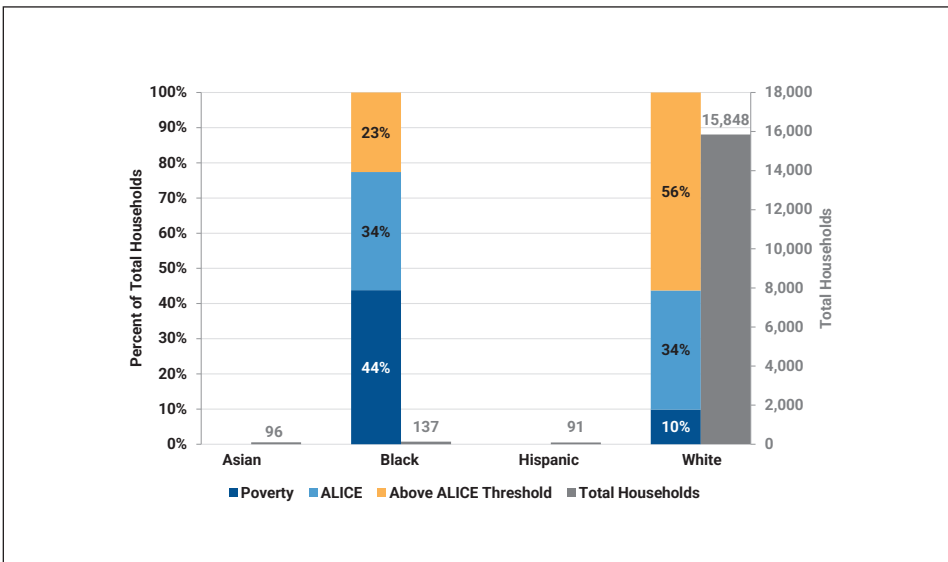

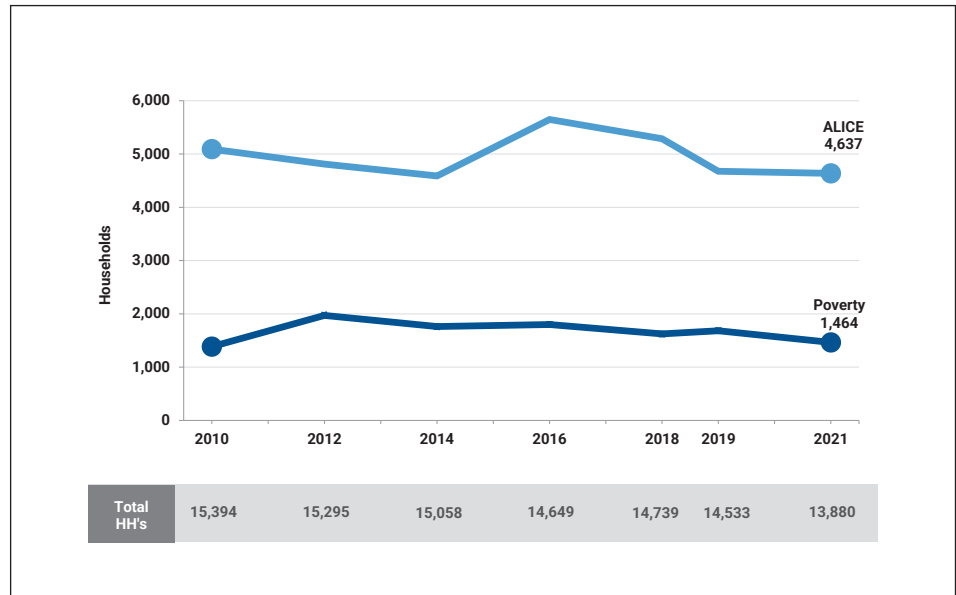

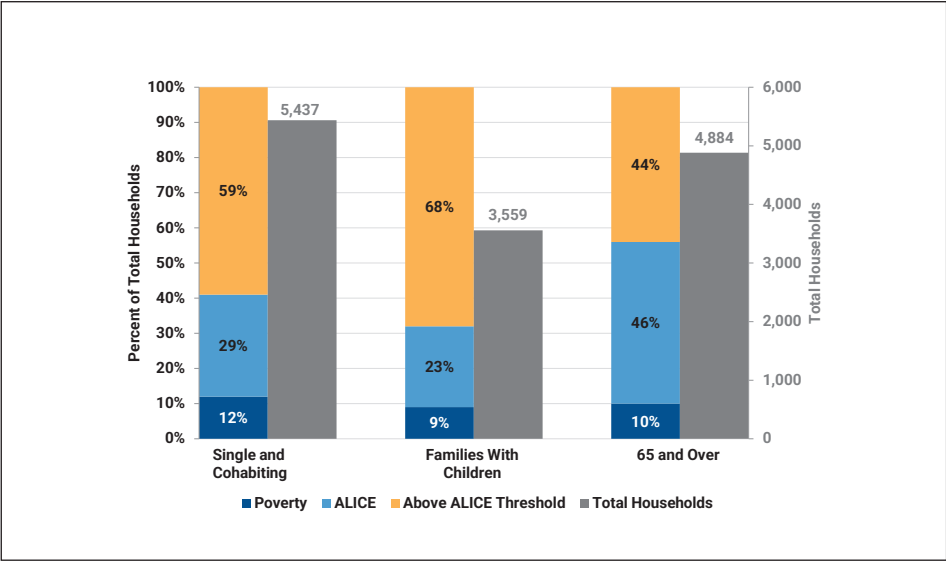

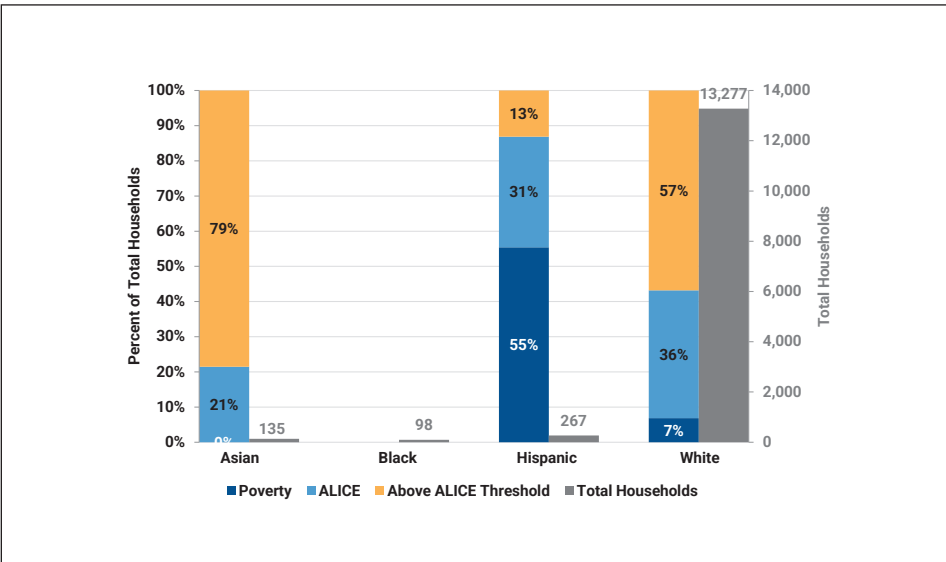

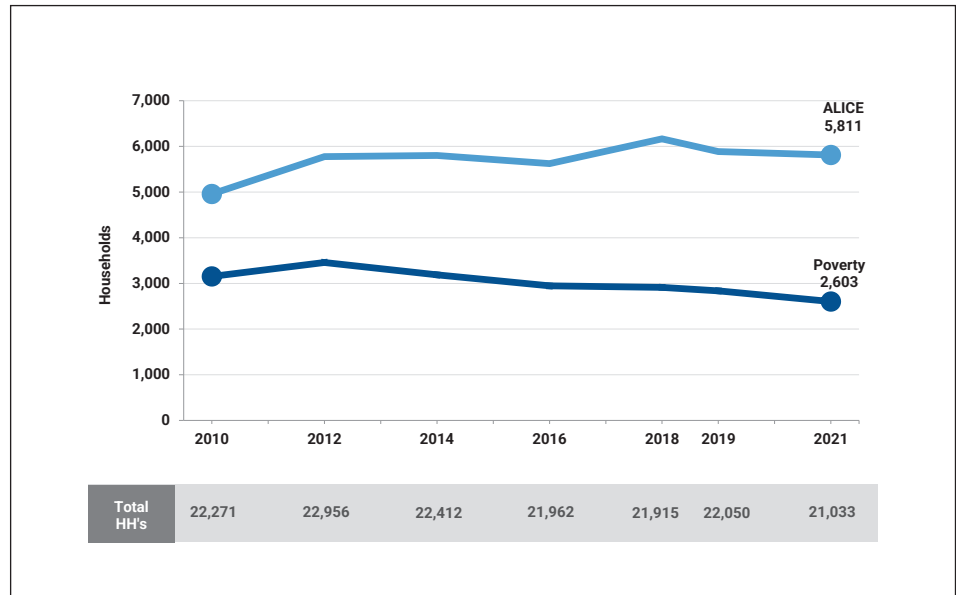

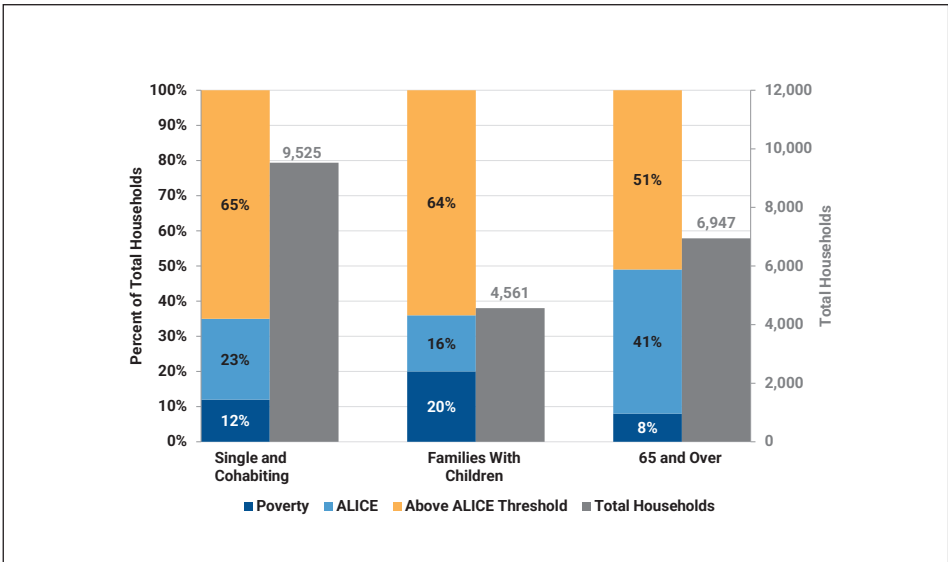

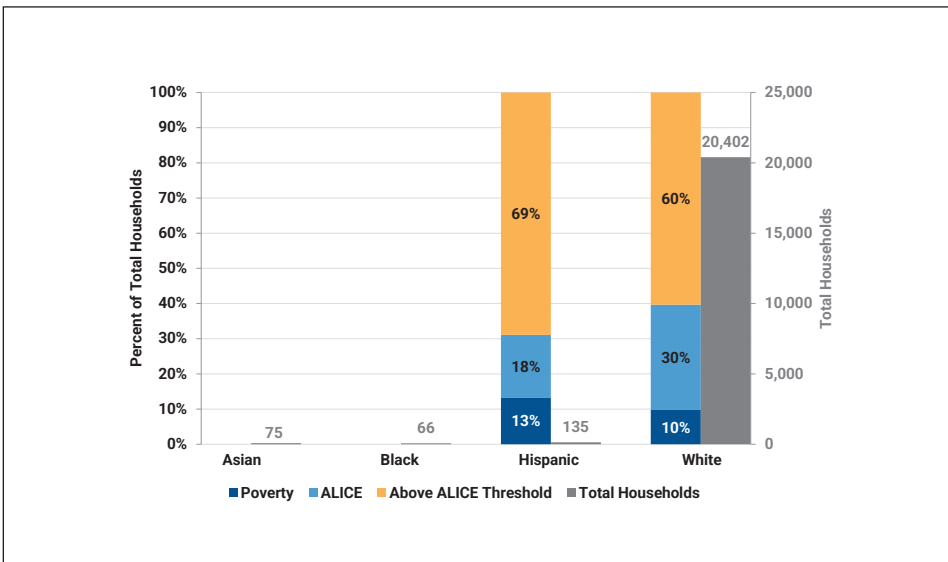

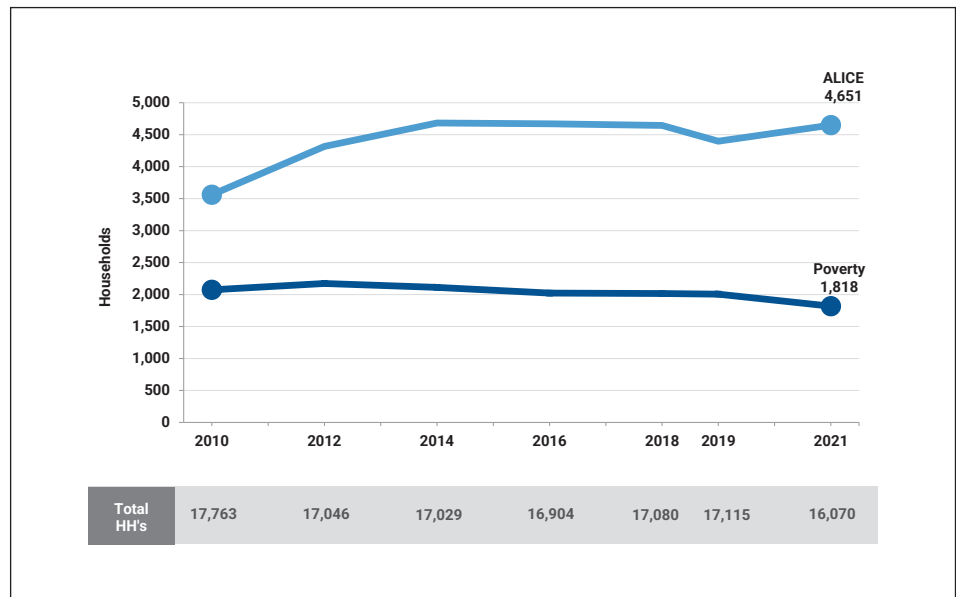

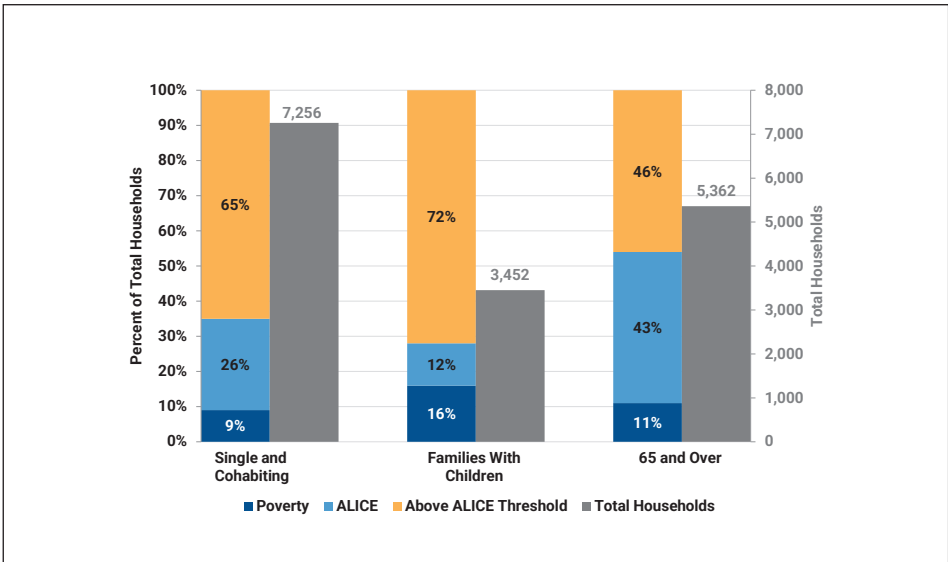

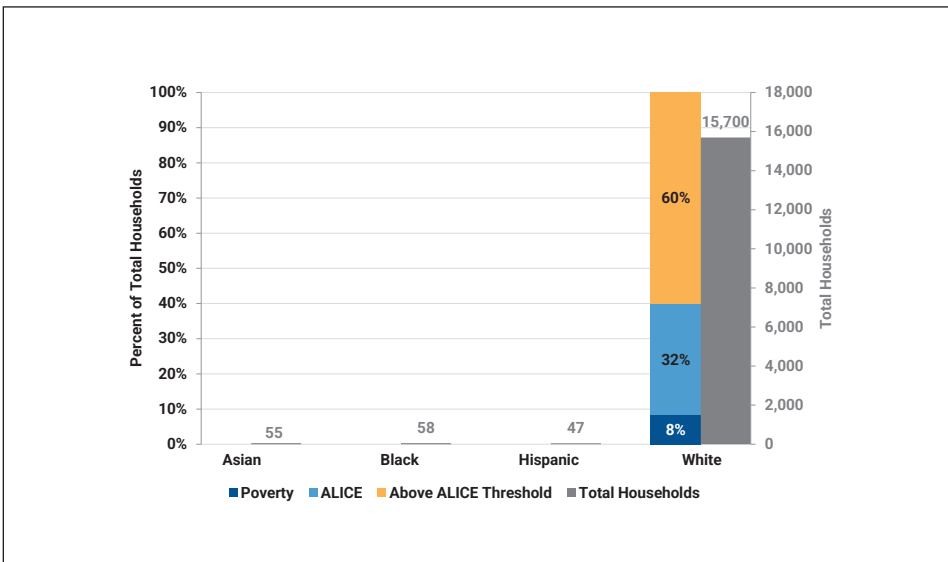

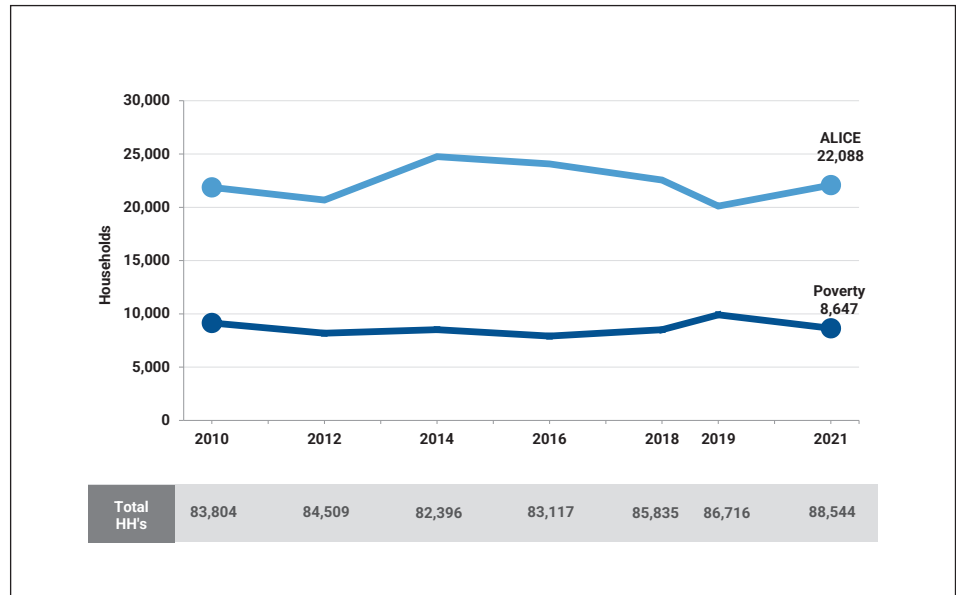

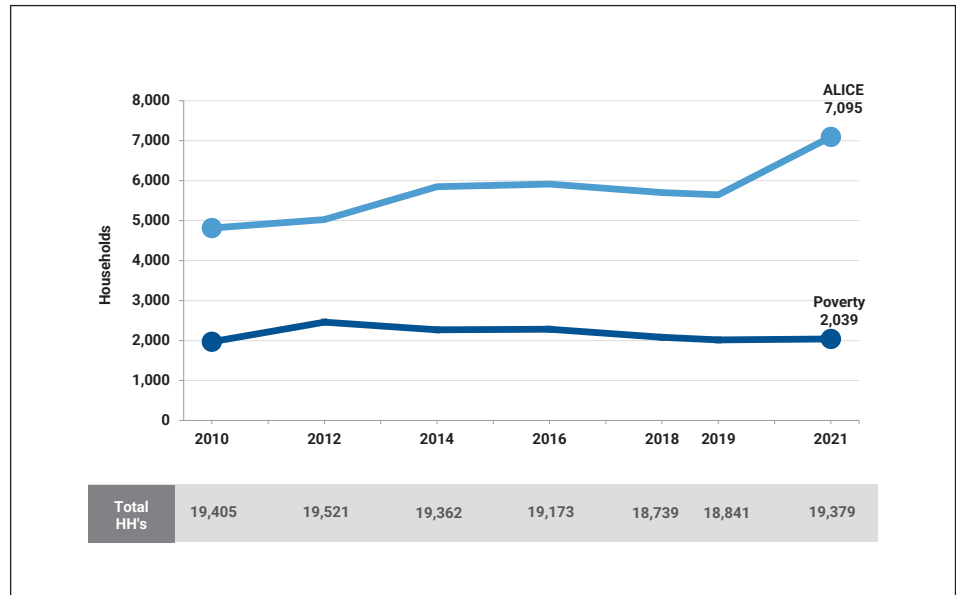

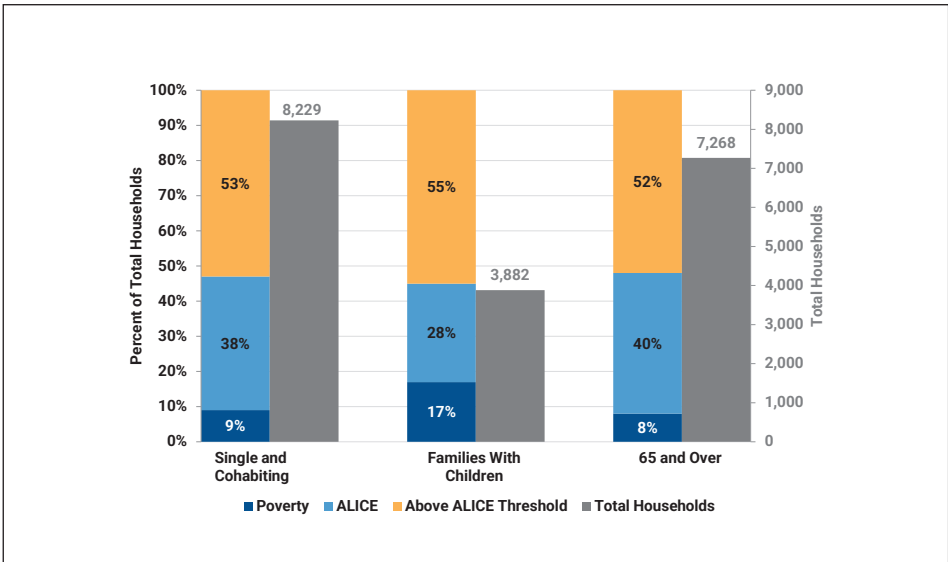

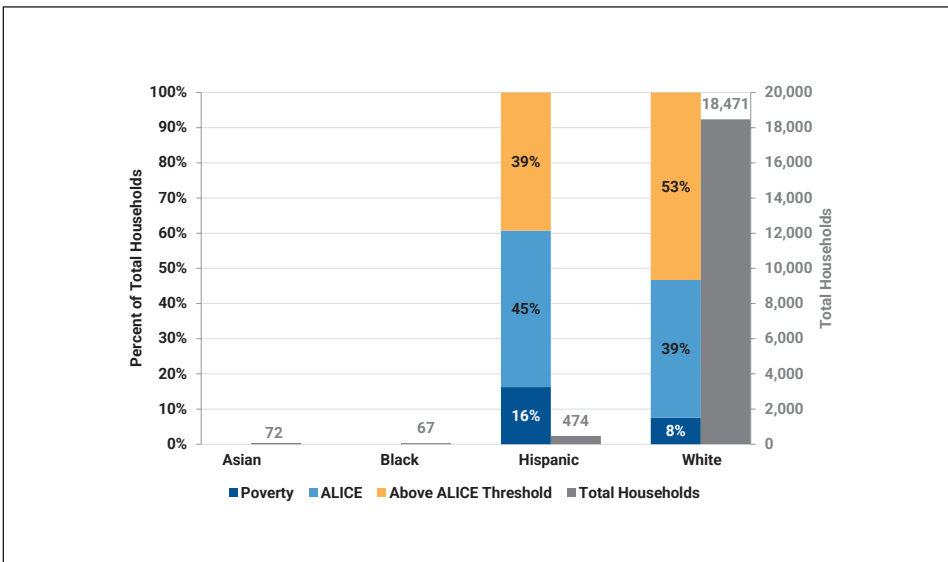

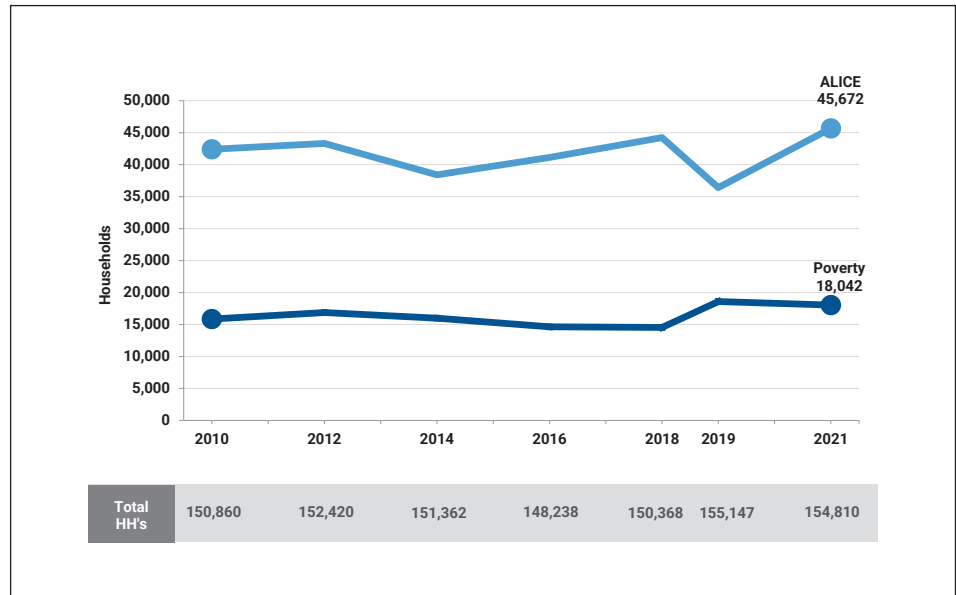

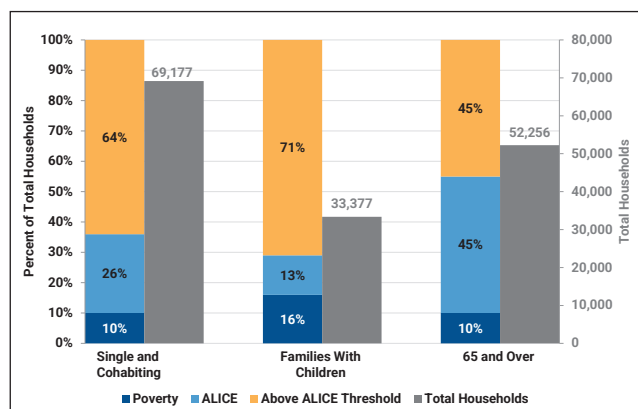

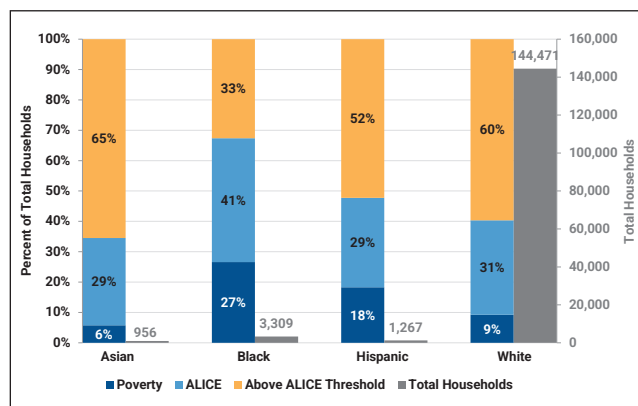

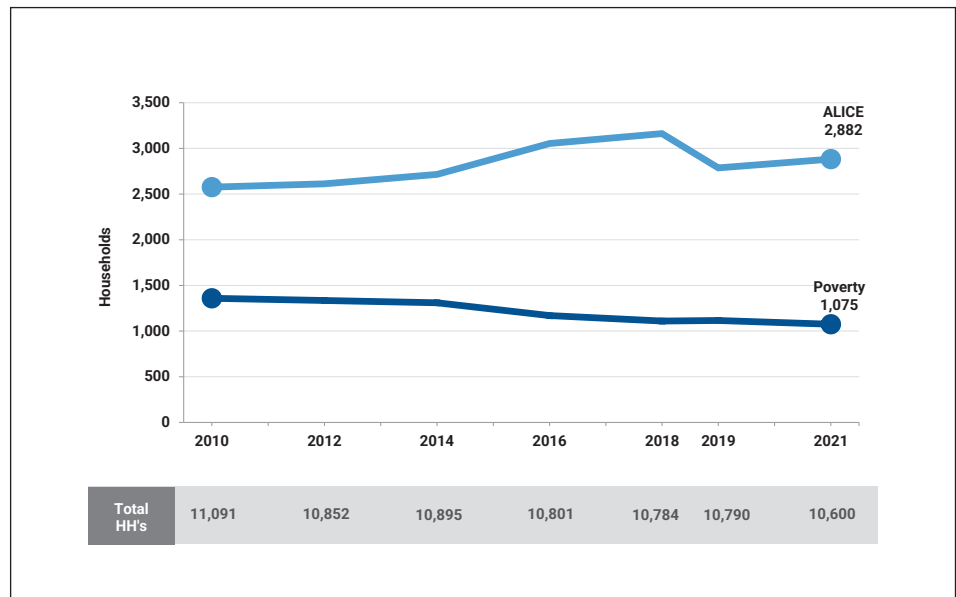

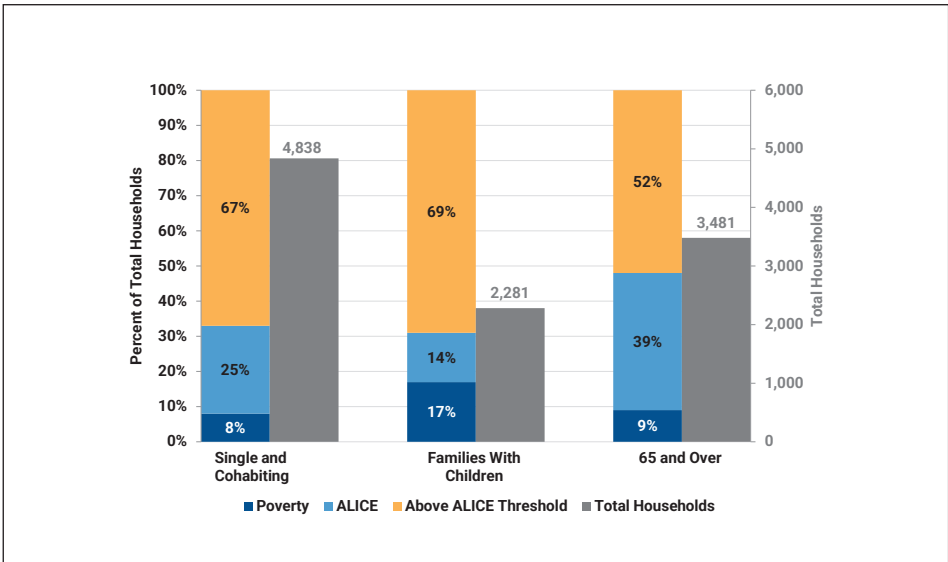

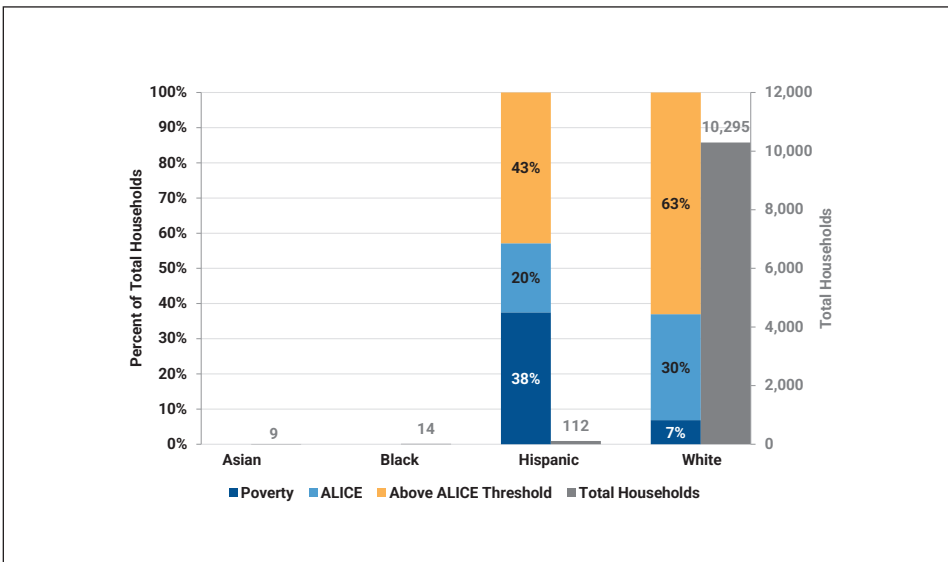

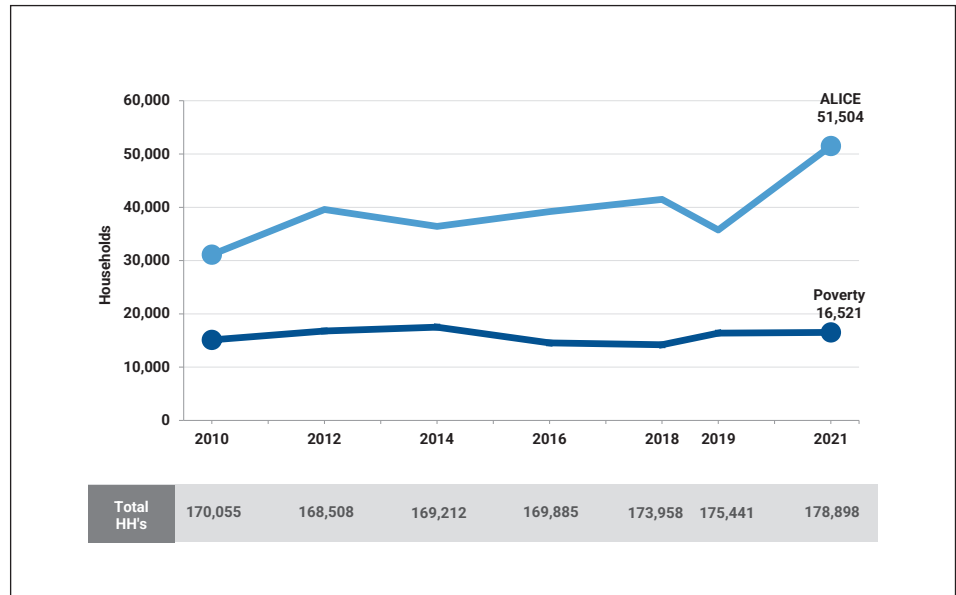

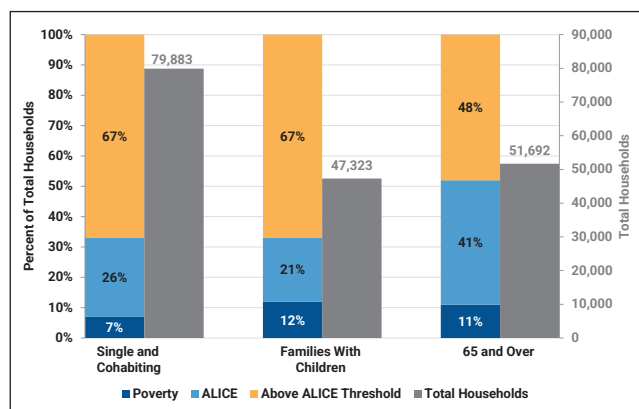

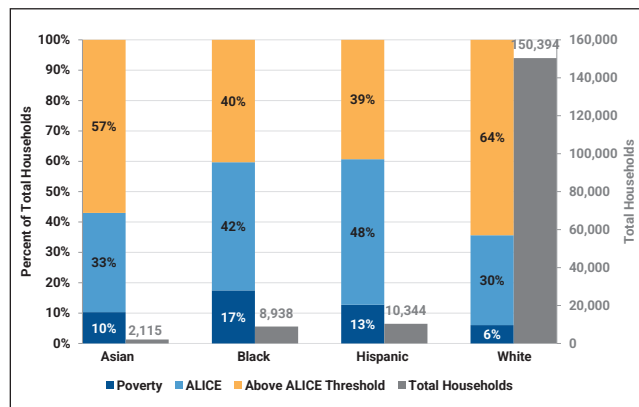
